EDITORIAL

Concern for human rights

The things said by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on the 28th Foundation Day of the National Human Rights Commission are extremely important. Modi said that some people viewed human rights through a political lens, adding that this selective behaviour is harmful for democracy. Speaking virtually at the 28th foundation day ceremony of the National Human Rights Commission, Modi said there is an aspect of human rights which I want to talk about today. In recent years, some people have started interpreting human rights in a way that benefits them. They see violation of human rights in one incident while they don't see any violation in other, similar incidents. Such a mentality also harms the very concept of human rights. He added that human rights are grossly violated when they are seen through a political lens. This selective behaviour is equally damaging for democracy, he said. Modi has criticized the selective concern for human rights. PM Modi said that some people see human rights violations in the same type of incident and the same people do not see human rights violations in any other incident. This statement of Prime Minister Shri Modi is being linked to the target killing of Hindus and Sikhs in Kashmir in the past. The Prime Minister's concern in this matter is right. He is also right to say that selective treatment of human rights is a threat to democracy. Human rights are severely violated when they are viewed with a political color, viewed through a political lens, weighed with the scales of political profit and loss, he said. In fact, such selective behavior is equally harmful to democracy. In fact, in recent years, some people have started interpreting human rights in their own

way, looking at their own interests. There is no doubt that the Prime Minister has said absolutely right and correct. In our country, the so-called human rights organizations behave in a partisan manner in the name of human rights. These alleged human rights organizations do not take cognizance of the Sikh massacre in Delhi or the atrocities on Pandits in Kashmir, but they always stand on the side of terrorists. Similarly, the same people oppose the action of the army. Recently, an activist of a human rights organization had even said that she gets pleasure from killing the people of the Sangh. Sangh workers are killed every day in Kerala, but these organizations remain silent. It should not happen. Due to the partisan attitude of human rights organizations, their importance is being lost. People have started considering him even as anti-national. The Prime Minister has made the right point at the right time on selective action regarding human rights. This should be considered. There is no doubt that India has a very good record regarding human rights. At a time when the whole world is burning in violence, India has suggested the right and the path of non-violence to the whole world. Not only the country, but the whole world is looking at him as a symbol of human rights and human values. In the last decades, many such opportunities have come before the world, when the world is confused, lost but India is always committed towards human rights. Has been, has been sensitive. Despite this, some organizations continue to defame our country. This is not right. It should be stopped. Human rights organizations will be able to earn trust only when they look at incidents objectively and react to them.

Xi Jinping declares unification of Taiwan is one the anvil

Taiwan's fate is almost sealed and the people of Taiwan can no longer relish the democratic values once China annexes Taiwan in the immediate future. A clear message by Xi Jinping in this regard was announced on Saturday and the world has been convinced of dragon's intention. He said unification with Taiwan 'will and must be achieved.' He further said, "Those who forget their heritage, betray their motherland and seek to split the country will come to no good end. They will be disdained by the people and condemned by history." It is pertinent to note that Xi's earlier efforts to appeal to Taiwan, where government surveys showed fewer than 10% of its 23.5 million residents favour unification, have backfired. It may be recalled that Xi's January 2019 call for a 'one country, two systems' union similar to Hong Kong's was even rejected by Taiwan's China-friendly opposition.

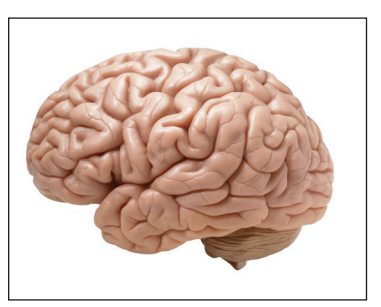
Inflation before Diwali

Friend said to me: This Diwali and Dhanteras people from middle- and low-income groups will be spending up to 40 per cent less, courtesy high inflation which is eating into their monthly budgets, says a study by industry body Assocham. I said: In its study 'Soaring prices dampen Diwali festivities', Assocham found that during the last year, middle and lower middle income families on an average spent a sum of Rs 3,000-4,000 for shopping and, buying sweets and Diwali gifts. Friend said: This Diwali, it has taken a severe hit as 85 per cent respondents said that the actual consumption expenditure has come down to less than Rs 1,800-2,400. Food inflation climbed to a six-month high of 10.60 per cent for the week ended October 8, as prices of fruits and vegetables went through the roof. I said: Food inflation, as measured by Wholesale Price Index (WPI), was at 9.32 per cent in the previous week. According to the study, nearly 69 per cent of the 2,000 respondents said that they avoid shopping altogether or shop only for those things that are absolutely needed. Moreover, 65 per cent said that they have bought restricted gift items and sweets this Diwali. Friend said: Further, over 87 per cent said that monthly grocery bills have jumped to about Rs 4,500, compared to Rs 2,000 in the last several months. Over 89 per cent of respondents also mentioned, it's not just clothes that are costlier; sweets and savouries are also priced higher by 25-30 per cent this year...dry fruit & sweets are the most expensive item of Diwali. So, everybody is feeling the pinch of rising cost of every commodity. I said: Also, respondents said that the price of gold being a big deterrent, alternatives to the yellow metal need to be found. The survey further said that Delhi ranked first in curbing expenses followed by Mumbai, Ahmedabad, Chandigarh, Kolkata and Chennai.

Science Fact

Neuroscientists charter hidden territory of human brain

During a recent study, Technische Universitat Dresden neuroscientists discovered a novel, non-invasive imaging-based method to investigate the visual sensory thalamus, an important structure of the human brain and point of origin of visual difficulties in diseases such as dyslexia and glaucoma. The new method could provide an in-depth understanding of visual sensory processing in both health and disease in the near future. The study was published in the journal 'NeuroImage'. The visual sensory thalamus is a key region that connects the eyes with the cerebral cortex. It contains two major compartments. Symptoms of many diseases are associated with alterations in this region. So far, it has been very difficult to assess these two compartments in living humans, because they are tiny and located very deep inside the brain. This difficulty of investigating the visual sensory thalamus in detail has hampered the understanding of the function of visual sensory processing tremendously in the past. By coincidence, Christa Muller-Axt, PhD student in the lab of neuroscientist Prof. Katharina von Kriegstein at TU Dresden, discovered structures that she thought might resemble the two visual sensory thalamus compartments in neuroimaging data.

We can access the ability to let go and also to carry forward qualities and thoughts we are going to need tomorrow through our own spiritual power. If we lack this spiritual power, we will not be able to decide what is going to be of value—what will help those little seeds to grow—and what is not so useful; what is simply going to be a burden or even poison the soil that those seeds are rooted in.

Twitter testing easier method to switch to your reversechronological feed

Social media giant Twitter on Tuesday announced that it is testing a new way to switch to your reverse-chronological feed a bit more easily. On its official Twitter handle, the company wrote, "Top Tweets first or latest Tweets first? We're making it easier to switch between the two timelines and know which one you're scrolling. Now testing with some of you on iOS: swipe between "Home" and "Latest" on the Home tab to choose which Tweets you see first." Currently, when users tap the three-star icon at the top of their feed to switch between the Home feed or the Latest feed, a small menu pops up that prompts the users to switch to whichever feed they are not on. Now as reported by The Verge, for some users on iOS, when they tap the three-star icon, Twitter is testing new Home or Latest tabs at the top of their screen instead. This change might prove to be an improvement since it will mean fewer taps to switch between feeds and make it easier to know at a glance which feed a Twitter user is looking at. Reportedly, it is still unclear if the micro-blogging site is planning to roll this test out more broadly.
