He was subsequently bought by Rajasthan Royals for Rs 6.5 crore. Since joining RR in 2022, Chahal has been a consistent performer, contributing significantly to the team's success. In the 2022 season, Chahal played a pivotal role in RR's journey to the final, where he took 27 wickets at an economy rate of 7.75. His standout performance came against Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR), where he claimed his only five-wicket haul in the league. Chahal's achievement of 200 wickets in the IPL is a testament to his skill, dedication, and consistency as a bowler.

Milan had the chance to equalize but Yann Sommer got down well to deny Leao's strike, while at the other end Thuram's attempt was inches wide. Inter Milan doubled the lead straight after the break in a spectacular fashion when a long ball over the top found Thuram, who cut inside and feinted a curler to the far top corner, but instead the Frenchman smashed it with ferocity into the near corner, surprising goalkeeper Mike Maignan.

AC Milan then threw on Giroud and Noah Okafor to strengthen the attack, and their efforts paid off in the 80th minute when Matteo Gab bia's header was parried onto the post, before Fikayo Tomori headed

Even buyers in Tier-2 and Tier-3 cities exhibit similar aspirations and purchasing behaviours. This change shows a bigger trend happening across India, not just in metropolitan cities but also majorly in Teir 2 and Teir 3 cities.

Housing and Urban Affairs. Despite the existing provision of 2021 for FAR for hotels, a decade-long stagnation persists, impeding the growth and development of the hotel industry in the capital, the association said in a

**FHRAI** that the inability of hotels

FAR is contributing to a gap between the increasing demand fuelled by the escalating influx of airline passengers from 4 Crore to 7 Crore in 2024.

Airlines are adding capacities with more than 1000 airplanes on order by Indigo and Air India, but there are no active pipelines of hotel development in Delhi.

While airlines are rapidly expanding capac ities, with significant orders for new aircraft, the pace of hotel construchighlighted tion remains flat, failing to align with an increas in utilizing the increased ingly rapid demand.
