Bhopal Metro junction will be built at Pul Bogda

Work will start by June-July

Ongoing preparations for commercial run

Under the Bhopal Metro Project, a Bhopal Metro junction will be built at Pul Bogda. This work could be started in June-July. At present, a survey is being done by Bhopal Metro to build the junction. Tenders have been issued for building the junction.

After the survey, the work of constructing the junction will start. Besides, the work of making tracks for the metro from Pul Bogda to Karond is also going to start soon. There is another good news for the city residents that by the end of the year, metro trains can start from Subhash Nagar depot to AIIMS. The work of the Priority Line project is almost completed.

Now the work of making tracks under Bhopal Metro from Pul Bogda to Karond is also going to start



soon. During this period, two underground metro stations will be built. One metro station will be built near Nadra bus stand and the other near Bhopal railway station. This route is about 16.5 kilometers. After its construction, the residents of Karond will be able to easily reach AIIMS by traveling by metro.

Testing continues by operating Metro on the main line

Under the Bhopal Metro project, commercial runs can start by the end of the year. Due to this, preparations for the commercial run are going on in full swing. Metro runs daily at the depot. Apart from this, testing is going on by running the metro on the main line. After all the work on the Priority Line is completed, the commercial run will be started from Subhash Nagar Depot to AIIMS. Its route is eight kilometers. This run will start with five metro trains. However, 27 metro trains are to be run under the project. At present five trains have arrived. There are three coaches in a train. Sibi Chakraborty, Managing Director, MP Metro, says that tenders have been issued to build tracks and junctions from Pul Bogda to Karond. This work will start after the survey. The work of Priority Line is almost completed. Five-six metro stations have been built. Soon after the completion of the work, there will be commercial run on the priority line.

The troubles of expelled Mahamandaleshwar Mandakini Puri alias Mamta Joshi are increasing continuously. Now, another case has been registered against her.

Mahamandaleshwar Sant Narmadashankar Puri Maharaj, who lives in Jaipur, has filed a case against her in Mahakal police station, accusing her of fraud of Rs 8,90,000. The troubles of the expelled Mahamandaleshwar Mandakini Puri alias Mamta Joshi of Niranjani Akhara are not showing any signs of stopping. About a week ago, a case of fraud was registered against her in Chimanganj police station in the name of appointing Mahamandaleshwar, accusing her of defrauding Mahant Sureshwaranand of Mahamaya Ashram in Mangalnath of Rs 7.50 lakh. After this, many saints came forward against her and they have complained to Akhil Bharatiya Akhara Parishad President Ravindra Puri Maharaj that Mandakini Puri wanted to cheat them in some way or the other, but they did not trust Mandakini Puri, otherwise today they too would have lost lakhs. After a criminal case was registered, Mandakini Puri swallowed the poisonous substance.

On this occasion, the officers and employees working in the museum paid tribute to her. Bhuri Bai, born in Jher village of Jhabua, was working in Manav Sangrahalaya since the 1990s.

The walls of the Bhil residence and gallery in the Manav Sangrahalaya are filled with Bhuri Bai's paintings. In her childhood, she used to go to markets or local fairs, which are an integral part of Bhil life. The festive colors of the fairs inspired



her to paint. She depicted the laughter and fun of the Gad Bapsi festival. Bhuri Bai was very young when her mother taught her to make kothi (anna gar) and Bhil hut.

She used to shape figures from a mixture of clay, cow dung and bran and paste them on the walls. Bhuri liked cows, so she always made pictures of cows on her walls. Bhuri Bai also liked singing songs and drawing pictures. The Bhil Awas in Manav Sangrahalaya was created jointly by Bhuri Bai and other Bhil artists, who will now preserve her memories for eternity.

Toll in Salkanpur road accident rises to 6

The death toll in the road accident at Salkanpur in Sehore district has risen to six, with three more people succumbing to their injuries during treatment, as confirmed by the police on Saturday.

The tragic incident occurred when a sports utility vehicle (SUV) carrying twelve people hit a divider while descending from a temple in Salkanpur on Friday evening. Initially, three people lost their lives on the spot, and nine others sustained injuries, as reported by the police. Sub-Inspector Nandram Ahirwar from Rehti police station said, "Three more people passed away due to their injuries at a hospital in Narmadapuram on Friday night, bringing the total number of fatalities to six in this accident."

Among the deceased are two couples - Sharda Prasad Pandey (72) and his wife Aprna Pandey (60), Rajendra Pandey (70) and his wife Usha Pandey, along with Pushpalata Awasthi (85) and driver Laxminarayan Chowkse.

The tragic incident occurred on Friday evening as the group of twelve people was returning from a temple function located on a hill about 120 km from the district headquarters. The SUV was en route back to Bhopal when the accident took place.
