2 terror associates arrested in J&K's **Shopian: Police**

Srinagar: Security forces arrested two militant associates in Jammu and Kashmir's Shopian district, police said. The two were arrested by a joint team of Shopian Police, Army's 44 Rashtriya Rifles and CRPF's 14 battalion at Malik Chek crossing. "During joint Naka checking by Shopian Police, 44 RR & 14BN CRPF at Malik Chek crossing, two terrorist associates were apprehended along with incriminating material," police said. The spokesman identified the two as Suhaib Iqbal Malik and Tufail Yousuf Malik, both residents of Baba Mohalla, Shopian. "Incriminating materials have been recovered from their possession," police said, adding a case under relevant sections of law has been registered at Police Station, Heerpora.

Gujarat: Class 10th board results declared

Gandhinagar: The Gujarat Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Board (GSBE) declared the Class 10 exam results on Saturday and an overall pass percentage of 82.5 was recorded. The exams for Class 10 were held in March this year. An official statement issued by the GSBE said girl students fared better than boys. While 86.69 percent of girls who appeared for the exams passed, it was 79.12 of total boys who cleared the boards. A total of 6,00, 999 students appeared for the school boards and 5,77,556 candidates were successful. Gandhinagar district achieved the highest percentage, 87.22 percent, while Porbandar district had the lowest percentage, 74.57 percent of

4 charred to death as car catches fire after being hit by truck

Jhansi (UP): Four persons, including a groom and his brother, were charred to death and two others were injured when a car caught fire after being hit by a truck in Badagaon area of Jhansi district here in Uttar Pradesh, police sources said here on Saturday. Police sources said that the incident took place late on Kanpur highway late on Friday night when the truck hit the car moving in front of it. "The car carrying the marriage party along with the truck caught fire after the collision," they said. Police sources said that the fire tenders and the local police reached the spot immediately after getting the information. "But by the time fire was controlled four car passengers were charred to death. Two passengers were pulled out by breaking the window panes of the car, they said. Police sources said that the injured identified as Ravi and Ramesh have been admitted to the medical college.
"The deceased have been identified as groom Akash Ahirwara (25), his brother Ashish, nephew Mayank (4) and car driver Bha-

gat," they said. Agartala Women's College bans mobile

phones on campus Agartala: To restore the academic ambience on the campus, the Principal of Women's College in Agartala issued a ban on the use of mobile phones other than for emergency and study purposes. This is the only girl's college in the state, established in the heart of the city at least seven years before Tripura attained statehood. It came up to encourage females around the city to join undergraduate classes in a comfortable environment if someone does not prefer combined classes of as many as 23 departments of Arts and Science. Principal Sarbari Nath, after prohibiting the use of mobile phones on Saturday, said, "It has come to our notice that the girls are getting addicted to mobile phones and even if the teachers pass by them, they don't bother anything, which is affecting the teaching-learning activities and also become a threat to the security of the students." According to her, most of the students are becoming completely phone engrossed. Even though many things happen around them, they don't even look up – "it's very disappointing". Normally, she said "boys and girls come to college and talk big and loud to discuss various current issues". "But there is no noise on the college campus, everyone is busy on mobile. The tendency to study is decreasing."

Countdown to BJD govt's end in Odisha begins: PM

Minister NaveenPatnaik a grand farewell by bursting firecrackers and beating of drums.

The Prime Minister mocked Patnaik and asked people to quiz the Chief Minister, if by chance he campaigns in Kantabanji Assembly constituency, to name 10 villages of the constituency from which he is contesting besides his traditional Hinjili

"I am sure that the Chief Minister will not be able to name ten villages of Kantabanji Assembly constituency," Modi said

Though Odisha is rich in natural resources but the people of the rich state are fighting poverty and even to this day it is one of the poorest state of the country, he added.

Mufti raises Pulwama Sec-144, accuses administration of 'fixing' election

Srinagar (UNI)

People's Democratic Party president Meĥbooba Mufti on Saturday questioned the imposition of Section 144 in Pulwama district and accused the administration of trying to "fix" the Lok Sabha elections.

She said that the authorities have imposed restrictions for 48 hours from 6.30 pm on Saturday under Section 144 of CrPC in Pulwama in south Kashmir, which is part of the Srinagar Lok Sabha seat going to polls on Monday.

"It is unprecedented and has not happened before that restrictions are imposed where the elections are to take place and that too till the time of the conclusion of the elections," Mufti said during a press conference in Srinagar. "The imposition of these



done in Pulwama.'

Apparently reacting to Mufti's allegations of imposing restriction, Deputy Commissioner Pulwama said it has been mandated under Election Commission of India's specific SOPs related to last 72 and 48 hours for poll campaigning.

ECI Guidelines mandate specific SOPs for last 72 hours and last 48 hours. Under Section 126 and Section 130 of Representation of People's Act 1951 and SOPs edition 2 Para 4.1.1, 4.1.2, 4.1.3 mandate issuing of Order under Section 144 CrPC. Such orders have been issued by Other Districts also who went to polls/ are going to polls. The restrictions apply to specific activities related to campaign etc, being silent period.

"Restriction relate to only specified points in order and not General restrictions," the Deputy Commissioner Pulwama posted on X.

Mufti further said the PDP workers who have been actively engaged with the poll campaign of the party were being summoned by police and even detained before the polls.

UP man kills family, commits suicide

Sitapur (UP): A man in Sitapur district of Uttar Pradesh allegedly shot himself dead after killing five members of his family, including his three children, a police officer said here on

Superintendent of Police (SP) Chakresh Mishra said that Anurag Singh (45), a resident of Palhapur, apparently killed his family in Rampur Mathura area.

Besides being an alcoholic, Singh was also mentally disturbed, Mishra said, adding: "On Saturday morning, Anurag shot his mother Savitri (62), wife Priyanka (40), sons Arnav (12), Aditya (8) and daughter Arvi (8)

He said later Anurag shot himself and committed suicide. "The reason behind the incident is not clear yet. The case is being investigated from all angles," he said.
