

Two police officers who came to PHQ from CBI will face punishment of suspension

● Nursing scam— four CBI officers including DSP, three inspectors accused of bribery

The deputation of two officers of Madhya Pradesh Police Department, Inspector Sushil Kumar Majokha and Hrishikant Asathe, who were on deputation to CBI, was terminated and they were sent back to PHQ.

Now, both of them will soon face suspension from the PHQ department. Both are accused in the nursing scam. On the other hand, former CM Kamal Nath and senior leader Arun Yadav on Friday targeted the government in this matter.

Meanwhile, PHQ sources said that an FIR has been registered against both the officers. Majokha has been arrested and is on remand



while Asathe is yet to be arrested. Now preparations are being made to suspend these two officers. At present, after the arrest of 13 out of 23 accused involved in the nursing scam, CBI has taken them on remand to Delhi for questioning. They will be presented in the CBI court on May 29. Meanwhile, senior CBI officers of Delhi are very angry over the wrong investigation report given by the CBI officers investigating the scam.

It is noteworthy that Inspector Rahul Raj, arrested with a bribe of Rs 10 lakh in the nursing scam, has already been dismissed. In this case, four CBI officers including a DSP, three Inspectors have been accused of corruption.

Regarding irregularities in wheat procurement in Jabalpur and Satna, the General Administration Department of the state government issued an order on Friday afternoon and removed Lokesh Jatav, an Indian Administrative Service officer and Secretary of the Civil Supplies Department.

2004 batch IAS Lokesh has been made Secretary, Finance Department and Commissioner, Treasury and Accounts. Another IAS 2013 batch officer, Frank Noble A. Deputy Secretary, Madhya Pradesh Government, Urban Development and Housing Department has been posted as Deputy Secretary, Madhya Pradesh Gov-

ernment, Finance Department. Apart from this, the Urban Development and Housing Department has taken the no-objection order from the Joint Chief Electoral Officer, Madhya Pradesh and made new postings of two municipal officers. The department has appointed Rajesh Srivastava, Chief Municipal Officer, Deputy Director, Directorate of Urban Administration and Development, Bhopal, as in-charge Joint Director Urban Administration and Development, Sagar Division, Sagar and Pawan Kumar Singh, Additional Commissioner, Municipal Corporation, Bhopal, as in-charge Joint Director Urban Administration and Development, Rewa Division.

Absconding Akshay Bam did not get anticipatory bail from Indore High Court

Absconding BJP leader Akshay Kanti Bam, who joined BJP from Congress during the Lok Sabha elections, could not get relief from the High Court again.

On Friday, an online hearing was held on the anticipatory bail petition, which has now been extended. The new date has been fixed for May 29. Meanwhile, the hearing on the review petition filed by Akshay

against the imposition of Section 307 is pending in another court. In fact, in a 17-year-old land dispute case, the trial court had ordered to increase Section 307 against him on April 24. An arrest warrant was issued for his absence from the hearing. In this matter, Akshay Bam has filed petitions in two different courts. Anticipatory bail was sought in this case from the High Court while a review petition has been filed in the trial court on the imposition of Section 307. The hearing in both cases was fixed for May 24. The date on anticipatory bail petition has been extended. While the review petition is yet to be heard. It is to inform that after the imposition of Section 307, Akshay had also applied for anticipatory bail in the Indore Sessions Court, which has been rejected. After that, he approached the High Court, where the hearing proceeded for the second time. Now the next hearing in the High Court will be on 29th May.

Availability of adequate fertilizer should be ensured for Kharif crop: CM

CM Dr. Mohan Yadav has said that an adequate quantity of fertilizer should be available at all places for Kharif crop. It should be ensured that the possibility of black marketing does not arise anywhere. Constant contact is being made with the Central Government to provide adequate fertilizer in the state. He said that farmers should be encouraged to use balanced fertilizer NPK.

Dr. Yadav sought information about the demand for urea, DAP, NPK, SSP and MOP fertilizers in the state, the quantity received so far and the distribution system. Information about the availability of seeds of paddy, Kodo, Kutki, maize, jowar, millet, urad, groundnut, soybean, cotton, etc. was also given in the meeting. Dr. Yadav said that the process of honouring and rewarding the farmers who produce good quality crops should also be started.

Use of natural fertilizers must be promoted

Dr. Yadav said that farmers should be motivated to increase the use of natural fertilizers in the state. A system should be developed to help the farmers use bio-fertilizers so that the farmers come forward to buy organic products. There is a need to motivate farmers to grow shree anna by coordinating animal husbandry and composting. This will help in maintaining a balanced crop cycle and ensure fertility of the land for a long time. Dr. Yadav said that for the safety of cows and their proper care, initiatives should be taken at the village level with gau seva sangathans and socio-religious institutions.

Skill upgradation and job-oriented courses should be started: CM

Bhopal: CM Dr. Mohan Yadav has said that it is necessary to start skill-based courses at high school and higher secondary level to retain students in schools and maintain a high level of gross enrollment ratio. According to the provisions of the National Education Policy, students of this level should be linked to readymade garments, horticulture, agriculture-based skills and vocational courses as per the need of the area. Dr. Yadav was addressing the review meeting of the proposed action plan to boost the gross enrollment ratio in educational institutions.

Scholarship disbursal must be prompt

Dr. Yadav emphasized the need to enhance the gross enrollment ratio by collaborating with district-level officials and teachers to devise an action plan. He suggested engaging hostel wardens in tribal districts in teaching roles and developing an administrative cadre to manage hostel operations. Dr. Yadav also mentioned considering arrangements for students from all categories to reside together in



hostels in the future. He instructed that scholarship disbursements to students must be prompt without any delays under any circumstances.

Dr. Yadav said that to increase students' interest in studies, it is necessary to conduct activities like dialogue programmes, science fairs, science trips and come-learn-know at the school level. Conduct these activities in collaboration with the School Education Department, MPCOST, Culture, Archaeology, Tourism departments.

Courses like forensic science-pilot training should be started

CM Dr. Yadav said that subjects like agriculture and forensic science should be started at the college level in more and more institutions of the state. Regional farmers and their farms should also be linked to the study of agricultural science at the graduate level for

practical experience. In the districts where there are airstrips, pilot training can also be started in coordination with universities and pilot training institutes. Employment oriented courses related to paramedical should also be conducted by universities and physical education and sports activities should be included in the courses.

Assess and upgrade polytechnic and engg colleges

Chief Minister Dr. Yadav directed to evaluate the state's polytechnic institutions through grading and undertaking meaningful efforts for their enhancement. He advocated for the introduction of courses aligned with current demands alongside traditional ones. Dr. Yadav stressed the importance of ensuring provisions for study, research, and training in state engineering colleges to address future demands and challenges. Additionally, coordinated efforts should be made to transition engineering colleges into deemed universities, fostering their self-reliance through their autonomous nature.

Village people forced to drink dirty pit water

● Panchayat sent proposal for bore mining thrice
● Dozens of children and elderly people from three villages falling ill

Even in the scorching heat of 44 degrees, if clean drinking water is not available, then it is natural to raise questions on 75 years of development. We are talking about Gram Panchayat Kalamkhedi-Motipura, just 30 kilometers away from the district headquarters. Even during this scorching heat, people here are forced to drink dirty water from the pit. Even for this dirty water, the women of the village have to travel two kilometers.



There are two villages under Kalamkheda Gram Panchayat, more than a dozen hand pumps are installed in both these villages, which were quenching the thirst of the villagers till two months ago. But one by one all these hand pumps either got damaged or became useless due to falling

water level. The Gram Panchayat made a proposal three times to install new hand pumps in the village or approve the tap water scheme and sent it to the Public Health Engineering Department, but the hearing has not taken place yet. There was also a demand to

increase the depth of the hand pumps that were damaged and were closed due to the lowering of the water level, but the authorities have not taken care yet, due to the depletion of the drinking water source in the village, the villagers have started using the river flowing two kilometers away from the village. Arrangements for water were made by digging a pit in the middle of the river, but this water is also dirty, muddy and smelly, which even animals do not like to drink, but the villagers here are forced to drink this water.

Children are complaining of vomiting and diarrhea

Due to the consumption of this water, children and other people here are facing complaints like vomiting and diarrhea. Similar is the condition of Aanvikheda tribal village of Ashta, where people are forced

to quench their thirst by extracting water from hilly pits. Here too there is neither a hand pump nor any other water source, due to which the people here have to drink dirty water from deep pits. Due to which their health is being adversely affected, but the PHE department is not taking care here either.

Complaint has been received, we will get bore digging soon

Approval has been given for digging a bore for Gram Panchayat Kalamkhedi. Soon, the bore will be dug after marking the area in the village. The team is investigating the rest of the villages from where complaints are being received.

Triple negative breast cancer occurs at a young age

Medical Science - Dr. Akanksha Chaudhary of AIIMS read her research virtually in international conference

In India and globally, women suffer from breast cancer more than other cancers; women at a young age are more at risk of getting triple breast cancer. Dr. Akanksha Chaudhary of the Department of Medical Oncology and Hematology of AIIMS said this while presenting her research through virtual medium in the recently organized International Conference on Cancer and Breast Cancer in Bangkok, Thailand.

Doctors from more than 18 countries of the world participated in this conference. Dr. Akanksha presented her research on PDL-1 in triple negative breast cancer. She told from her research that breast cancer is more common in women than other cancers in India and globally. Triple negative breast cancer is



more common in younger women. Which rapidly spreads to the lungs and liver. Many young women are at risk of life due to this cancer.

It is noteworthy that the Executive Director of AIIMS, Professor (Dr.) Ajay Singh always inspires the faculty members and students to accept new challenges.

Chemotherapy is effective in dealing with cancer

She said that targeted medicines based on PDL-1 are now available in AIIMS Bhopal which proves to be effective for the patient in dealing with cancer along with chemotherapy. Dr. Akanksha said that she had included about 1000 patients in her research.
