

Rain & thunderstorms expected in numerous districts

► Monsoon to arrive in MP by June 15



Bhopal: Madhya Pradesh is expected to experience contrasting weather conditions on Saturday. Thunderstorms and rain are predicted for 37 districts, including Indore, while 9 districts, including Gwalior, are forecasted to endure scorching heat in the afternoon.

By evening, thunderstorms may affect these districts as well. According to IMD Bhopal scientist Arun Sharma, the weather patterns are influenced by a western disturbance, cyclonic circulation, and the passing of a trough line, resulting in storms and rain in

parts of the state. Concurrently, other districts are experiencing intense heat. "Similar weather conditions will persist in the coming days. Meanwhile, the monsoon is progressing steadily and is expected to reach Madhya Pradesh on time," Sharma added.

Dists expecting rain and thunderstorms

Bhopal, Betul, Harda, Khandwa, Khargone, Barwani, Indore, Shajapur, Ashoknagar, Shivpuri, Singrauli, Satna, Anuppur, Dindori, Chhindawada, Seoni, Mandla, Balaghat, Pachra, Chhatrapur, Tikamgarh, Maihar, and Pandhurna.

Progress of the Monsoon

As of June 7, the Southwestern Monsoon has advanced into additional parts of the Arabian Sea, most parts of Karnataka, more areas of Maharashtra and Telangana, and coastal Andhra Pradesh. It has also spread to most mid-western and north-western regions of the Bay of Bengal. This suggests that the monsoon will arrive in Madhya Pradesh by June 15 as expected.

On Friday, some districts experienced cloud cover while others faced intense heat. Damoh and Shivpuri recorded the highest temperatures at 44 degrees Celsius. Temperature increases were also observed in Bhopal and Gwalior, with Bhopal at 40.8 degrees, Indore at 39.2 degrees, Gwalior at 42.5 degrees.

Roads in posh Arera Colony in pitiful condition

Venkat Vijay Kumar, Bhopal The Municipal Corporation spends crores of rupees every year on the maintenance of roads. The roads remain fine for a few months. After this, by the time the rains come, entire roads are lost in potholes. The condition of the posh Arera Colony of the city is similar, where there are hundreds of potholes on the roads. The special thing is that the IAS, IPS and prominent businessmen of the city live in this colony. The Municipal Corporation officers pass through here throughout the day, but they are ignoring these potholes. If these potholes were repaired in time, then people would not have to face problems. The beauty of Arera Colony has been spoiled due to these bad roads. Passengers

coming out of platform number one of Rani Kamalapati station are also facing problems while travelling on these pothole filled roads. Passenger S Rajan who came in GT Express from Chennai on Thursday evening said that we were told that Bhopal city is beautiful and has good roads, but the condition here is even worse. On the other hand, if we believe the municipal corporation officials, the roads have been damaged due to the dumpers used in the flyover and metro work coming on this route. Now they are asking to try to repair it before the rains. The situation here is worse: In the Arera Colony area, from Ganesh temple to about a dozen roads within the colony have become completely dilapidated. These roads have not been re-

paired for the last one year. However, one reason for this is also the lack of awareness of the people. This colony has hotels and other commercial centers, big hospitals along with posh bungalows. About 5000 vehicles move in this area 24 hours a day. The city's top bureaucrats, public representatives, businessmen etc. i.e. the upper class live here. You have informed me that the roads of Arera Colony have turned into potholes. I will personally go and see the situation on the spot. Action will be taken against whoever is found guilty for the condition of the roads. I will try to get the roads repaired before the rains. Malti Rai Mayor, Municipal Corporation, Bhopal

When people are facing problems due to dilapidated roads, then you can imagine the condition of roads in other colonies of the city.

6 to 10 inches deep potholes

Residents said that 6 to 10 inches deep potholes have formed on all the roads from Ganesh Mandir to Arera Colony behind Narmada Hospital. Passing on these roads is no less than a risk. This is the condition of the roads even though the Municipal Corporation claims to spend crores of rupees every year on building and maintaining them. Despite this, the roads are getting lost in potholes.

Residents troubled by dust

After the road was diverted for the metro, the residents of the area are troubled by the flying dust of the deep potholes on the roads. The Municipal Corporation claims to fill the potholes with mulch. But the mulch turns into dust due to the wheels of heavy vehicles. The work of the metro and flyover is going on at a slow pace. The residents of the nearby area and the shopkeepers of the commercial centre are getting disturbed due to the dust flying from above.
