Police averts dacoity with arrest of five including 3 ex-NDFB cadres

Subsequently on getting the input, under the supervision of SP Singhal, a team led by ASP Pankaj Lamba, including Pasighat PS OC Ige Lollen, SI Kuncha Tangha, and others was formed and human intelli-gence and technical surveillance was mounted. The SP said an overnight operation including multiple raids led to the apprehension of three surrendered cadres of NDFB from Pasighat. They are William Basumatary, Rashmi Basumatary (both residents of Sonitpur, Assam), and Basant Basumatary alias Ladum, a native of Baksa

Reduce stamp duty for rent agreements: CM directs officials

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Saturday directed to reduce the stamp registration fee for rent agreements of residential, non-residential, and commercial properties and suggested creating different brackets for this and simplifying the agreement process.

During a high-level meeting with the officials of the Stamp and Registration Department, the CM gave the necessary guidelines regarding the Online Registration Rules 2024.

He said that an online system for stamps and registration is crucial for ease of living and better record and data management. "Preparations should be made regarding this as soon as possible, and a draft



should be readied and presented,

Yogi emphasised that the entire system of codification, e-registration, and e-filing under the Online Registration Rules 2024 should be transparent. "E-registration should

be carried out through government agencies and RERA-approved builders. Additionally, the work of e-filing should be done through bank file 6 (1), rent agreements of up to 12 months, and any docu ments under sections 18 and 89 of the Registration Act 1908," he said.

He said that in Phase-1 of e-reg istration, government agencies, in cluding development and industri al development authorities, should be given approval for sale deeds agreements, and lease deeds.

"Presentations and approvals should be managed by the nodal officers of these government agen cies. Additionally, the photos and signatures of the parties involved should be captured digitally or electronically.
