Four girls drown in pond in Agra

Agra: Four children drowned while taking bath in a pond in Khandauli area of Agra district here in Uttar Pradesh on Sunday, police sources said here. Police sources said that seven families of labourers from Kanpur and Auraiya live in tents on Yamuna Expressway interchange. "On Sunday morning three girls Heena, Khushi and Chandani went to take bath in a nearby pond and started drowning, they said. Police sources said hat after hearing their cries Nagina, Anuradha, Ragini, Prachi, Sunny and Riya also jumped in the pond to save them. "The police, which reached the spot after being in-formed by the villagers, some-how pulled them out of the pond with the help of rope," they said.

and disbursed soon." The Congress leader also urged the state government to provide adequate compensation and proper treatment to the injured.

Apna Dal (S) leader shot dead over land dispute

Prayagraj: A 29-year-old Apna Dal (Sonelal) leader was shot dead allegedly over a land dispute in Soraon area of Prayagraj district here in Uttar Pradesh on Sunday, a police officer said here. Deputy Commissioner of Police (Ganganagar) Ahishek Bharati said that Indrajeet Patel alias Monu, a resident of Achkawapur Khas village, was having a land dispute with his neighbour Sarvesh Patel for a long time. He said that on Sunday morning

when Indrajeet went to irrigate his farm, Sarvesh also reached the spot. "During the discussion Sarvesh shot Indrajeet in his head. The family members took Indrajeet to Swarup Rani hospital where doctors declared him dead," he said. The DCP said that the accused has been arrested and two illicit firearms have been recovered from his possession.

Bengaluru: Union Heavy Industries and Steel Minister HD Kumaraswamy, on Sunday raised questions about Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah's 2013 election affidavit, alleging that there was no mention of a land parcel gifted to Siddaramaiah's wife, Parvathi.

The 3.16-acre land in question was allegedly gifted to Parvathi by her brother Mallikarjuna in 2005, and is presently in the eye of a storm in connection with the alleged Mysore Development Authority (Muda) site scam. Siddaramaiah has already rub-

bished any allegations of his involvement in any scam. According to Kumaraswamy, the parcel of land was conspicuously missing from the as-set's column in Siddaramaiah's 2013 election affidavit.

Land-for-job scam case: Delhi court directs ED to file concluding chargesheet

Agencies, New Delhi

Delhi's Rouse Avenue court has granted the Directorate of Enforcement (ED) additional time to file an additional or concluding charge sheet in a money laundering case linked to the alleged land-for-job scam in the Indian Railways by the next hearing date.

The court was apprised of the in-vestigation status and steps taken by the ED by its Joint Director, who appeared on court's direction.

Accused individuals Rabri Devi, Misa Bharti, and Hema requested and were granted exemption from

appearance in the case. Special Judge Vishal Gogne recorded the submissions of the ED that the investigation is at an advanced stage and directed that a concluding complaint be filed within the time-frame indicated by the Joint



Director of the ED. The matter was listed for August 6.

The court also listed the CBI's conclusive charge sheet for consid-eration on July 15 and the ED's appli-cation for a copy of the CBI's charge sheet on July 10.

CBI Special Public Prosecutor D.P. Singh argued that the charge sheet could not be supplied before the court's cognizance. ED's SPP Manish Jain stated that the ED's investigation is independent of the CBI's documents and would conclude within 5-6 weeks regardless

Whether we get the charge sheet or not, we will file the charge sheet in 5-6 weeks. There is some miscommunication and we will take instructions to clear this. We will inform the court, the ED's SPP said.

The court, satisfied with the ED's progress, directed them to expedite the investigation and file the charge sheet by the next date.

The ED was previously directed on June 7 to provide a status update and had been asked in April to conclude the pending investigation in the land-for-job money laundering case. In this case, former Bihar Chief Minister Rabri Devi and her daugh-ters, Misa Bharti and Hema Yadav, have been charge-sheeted along with Amit Katyal and Hridyanand Chaudhary.

Slain BSP leader Armstrong's body to be buried in Tiruvallur dist: HC

The Madras High Court on Sunday ordered that the body of slain BSP Tamil Nadu Unit President K Armstrong should be buried at Pothur village coming under Villivakkam Panchayat Union near Red Hills in Tiruvallur district of the State.

Passing orders after two hearings on an urgent plea filed by his wife Ms Porkodi seeking permission to bury the body at the BSP party office in Perambur in Chennai city, Ms Justice V Bhavani Subbaroyan said there was no problem in erecting a memorial for him at the party office after getting permission from the state government. The Judge accepted Additional



Advocate General (AAG) J. Ravindran's submission that officials were ready to per the burial of his body in an one acre private land in Tiruvallur district. He also informed the Court that the Panchayat has passed a resolution.

Accepting the submissions, the Judge said Mr Armstrong's body could be buried permanently in Tiruvallur and a memorial could be built in Channai city

built in Chennai city. While stating that Armstrong, who was hacked to death on Friday night, should be given a dignified burial, the Judge also directed the police to provide adequate security to ensure that the last rites were held peacefully. Mr Armstrong's family too has accepted it after which works relating to digging a pit at the burial site commenced.



Lakhs of devotees throng Puri for grand Rath Yatra

Amidst tight security cover, lakhs of devotees from across the country thronged this pilgrim city of Odisha to witness the world famous Rath Yatra of Lord Jagannath and his siblings Lord Balavadra and Devi Subhadra, the presiding deities of the Sri Jagannath temple,

Chants of "Jai Jagannath", "harobol" and the clanging of cym-bals rented the air around the 12thcentury shrine and the three km long Grand road, popularly known as "Ba-da danda" as the deities were taken out from the "Ratna Sinhasan" of the temple's sanctum sanctorum to their respective chariots by the

daitapaties - the temple servitors. This time., after a gap of almost 53 years, the rituals such as Netra Ustav, Nabajouban darshan of the deities and the Rath Yatra were performed on a single day on July 7.

Since all three major rituals were performed on a single day on Sunday, the pulling of the chariots is all likely to be suspended after rolling down a few meters on the grand road. The journey would resume on Monday morning for the final desti-nation - he Gundicha temple, locat-ed 3 kms away from the Jagannath temple.

President Droupadi Murmu will not only witness the Rath Yatra but also pull the chariots, temple sources said

Early in the morning, the servitors offered 'Gopal bhog' (breakfast) to the deities who were then taken out from the 'Ratnavedi' in a ceremonial 'pahandi bije' to their respective well-decorated chariots parked outside the temple.

Hundreds of temple servitors carried the deities on their shoulders from the temple amidst the blowing of conch shells through Ananda Bazar and the 'Baishi Pahacha'(the twenty two steps of the temple) to the Lions Gate.

The chariots - the red and yellow 'Nandighosha' of Lord Jagannath with 16 wheels, red and green 'Taladhwaja' of Balabhadra with 14 wheels and the red and black 'Devadalana' of Devi Subhadra with a dozen wheels, were lined up outside the temple near the Lions
