Zverev clinches epic Wimbledon clash against Norrie

Alexander Zverev showcased his relentless determination at Wimbledon, clinching a hard-fought victory to advance to the fourth round and setting his sights on continued triumphs.

In a dramatic showdown on Centre Court, Zverev overcame a resilient Cameron Norrie in a grueling three-set en-

The German star displayed his trademark power and finesse, securing a 6-4, 6-4, 7-6 (17-15) win after a tense tiebreak that saw him fend off five match points from the British contender.

Zverev's performance underscored his stellar form this season, having reached the

semifinal spot in two decades



semifinals of the Australian Open and the final of the French Open.

His victory over Norrie marks his sixth consecutive win against the British No. 2, further solidifying his dominance in their encounters. Looking forward, Zverev remains focused and determined to advance deeper into the tournament.

With his sights set on a potential quarterfinal berth, he prepares to face either American 13th seed Taylor Fritz or 24th-ranked Chilean Alejandro Tabilo in the next round.

As the Wimbledon action intensifies, all eyes will be on Zverev as he continues his quest for further success on the prestigious grass courts of The All England Club.

Later, Abhay and the experienced Joshna Chinappa, the third seeds, put it past the second-seeded Hong Kong duo of Tong Tsz Wing and Tang Ming Hong 11-8, 10-11, 11-5 to lift the mixed doubles title. "I'm very happy with the way Abhay and I performed this week. We were confident and got better as we advanced in the tournament," Senthilkumar said.

"It was timely of the SRF and HCL to revive the National Doubles Championships after a long gap as it allowed us to gain momentum," he added.

Joshna, who was conferred with the Padma Shri earlier this year, said, "It means so much to me to play for India again, especially since I was out of action for the last five months following a knee surgery.

Amidst the chaos, Shubman Gill emerged as the solitary beacon of hope, top-scoring with a determined 31 off 29 balls. Yet, his valiant effort was overshadowed by the lack of substantial support from the other end. Zimbabwe's Tendai Chatara (3/16) and skipper Sikan-

RBI imposes monetary penalty on PNB for non-compliance regarding loans, advances & KYC norms

In another case of non-compliance by a major PSU bank, the Central Bank has imposed a monetary penalty of more than Rs 1.31 crore on Punjab National Bank (PNB). The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has, by an order dated July 3, 2024, imposed a monetary penalty of Rs 1,31,80,000 on Punjab National Bank for non-compliance with certain direc-tions issued by RBI on 'Loans and Advances: Statutory and Other Restrictions', and 'Reserve Bank of India (Know Your Customer (KYC) Direction, 2016'.

This penalty has been imposed in exercise of powers vested in the RBI conferred under the provisions of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949, the RBI said in a release. The Statutory Inspection for Supervisory Evaluation (ISE 2022) of the bank was conducted by the RBI with reference to its financial position as of March 31, 2022. Based on supervisory findings of non-compliance with RBI directions and related correspondence in that regard, a notice was issued to the bank advising it to show cause as to why a penalty should not be imposed on it for its failure to comply with the directions.

After considering the bank's reply to the notice and oral submissions made during the personal hearing, RBI found, inter alia, that the following



charges against the bank were sustained, warranting the imposition of a monetary penalty.

The bank (i) sanctioned working capital demand loans to two state-owned corporations against amounts receivable from the government by way of subsidies, refunds, or reimbursements, and (ii) failed to preserve the records pertaining to the iden tification of customers and their addresses obtained during the course of business relationships in certain accounts, the Central Bank said.
