Almost every road in the capital is dilapidated. It seems as if these are not city roads but village roads. Broken roads everywhere, potholes everywhere; Bhopal's roads have been in a poor state for a long time. Every day people have to face many problems.

If you ask the public about the problem, they also tell you about the problems caused by the roads. Whereas the officials do not get tired of crying about the rain. Only potholes are visible on thousands of kilometers of roads in the capital. The condition of many roads is such that it is difficult to understand whether there are potholes

in the road or the road is built in the potholes. Although, in the recent past, Nagar Nigam has got patch work done, even after that, the roads of the city still look bad. Not only this, these bad roads have been in the headlines of newspapers for a long time. There are many posh areas in Bhopal where a lot of high-class people live, but even after this the roads here are very bad. These include Kohefiza, Rohit Nagar, Chuna Bhatti, Kolar area, area around Bansal Hospital, Shahpura, Bittan Market, Number 7, Lalita Nagar, Sarvdharm Colony, Mahabali Chauraha, roads around D Mart, etc. All the roads are in very bad condition. These are very



famous areas of the district, the roads here are very bad. This is the condition of the roads of only a few areas of Bhopal. Apart from this, what to talk about the whole of Bhopal. These roads have become even worse in the rain, whereas, no steps have been taken so far to repair these roads. After patchwork in a small area, the work of the Municipal Corporation has also cooled down, but the potholes on these roads are still there and they cannot be counted. These potholes are the cause of accidents for people every day. Sometimes small and sometimes big accidents have happened. In some cases, people have even lost their lives. The life of the people passing through here is becoming difficult due to these potholes. Even a little rain in the capital turns this road into a pond.



Due to these potholes, people's budget is getting spoiled. Because, these potholes are having a bad effect on both people's health and vehicles. People have started having pain in their waist and body. At the same time, vehicles get damaged due to these potholes. Which directly affects people's pockets. These pictures of potholes are telling the trouble of the people themselves. The surprising thing is that, despite the roads being in such a bad condition, no official or public representative pays atten-

tion to these potholes and who knows when they will?
