

110 centres operating to provide sports facilities to students

▶ Players in the state won 53 medals in national competitions

Bhopal: To provide high level sports facilities to the students studying in government schools in the state, the School Education Department has established 110 nodal sports centres in government schools of every district. Through these centres, high level sports material and sports training facilities are being provided to the students along with sports infrastructure. This arrangement has significantly improved the sports performance of the students in government schools. Along with this, the participation of students in school sports competitions organised at various levels has also increased. About 200 players from various nodal centres participated in the state level school sports competition and won

80 medals in various sports.

National School Sports Competition

Players of the state participated in various disciplines in the National School Sports Competition. Last year, in the 67th National School Sports Competition, players of Madhya Pradesh won a total of 53 medals including 26 gold, 13 silver and 14 bronze medals in 7 sports in the age group of 14, 17 and 19 years.

To encourage students who perform well in sports in schools, a residential sports institute is being run in Sehore from class 9th to 12th. There are 200 seats in this residential institute. Students here are getting training in the sports of

their interest along with studying in school for 4 years. The students of this residential institute have performed well in various sports competitions.

Activities in Fit India Movement

Under the Fit India Movement, the School Education Department organised the 'Fitness Ka Dose-Aadha Ghanta Roz' (Dose of Fitness-Half Hour Daily) programme in government schools. Under this, students, teachers and parents also participated enthusiastically in various sports activities. Under the Fit India Movement, the 5th 'Fit India Week' was celebrated in all the districts last year.

this program organized on Sunday is to connect the common people with architects.

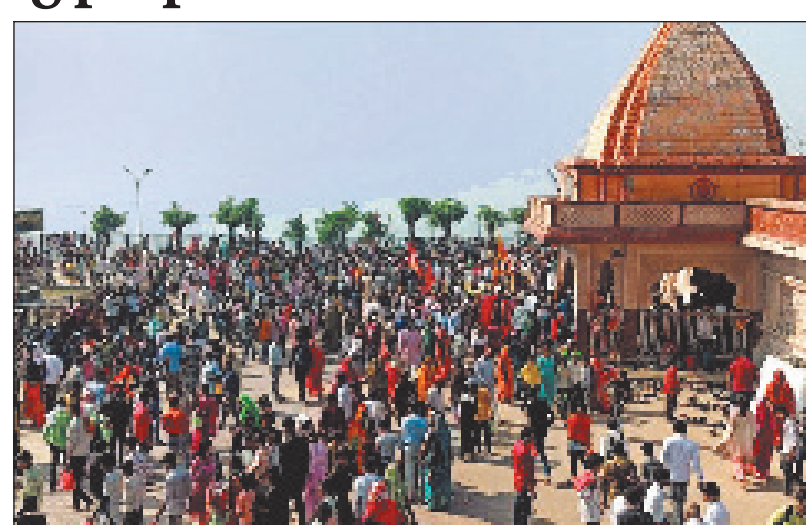

Three idols being prepared in Odisha for Salkanpur Devi Lok



Chronicle Reporter, Bhopal The work of making Devi Lok on the lines of Mahakal Lok of Ujjain in the famous Salkanpur Vijayasan Dham is 50 percent complete. Out of this, the work of 64 Yoginis and 9 forms of Devi is 90 percent complete.

Three idols to be installed in Devi Lok are being prepared in Odisha. The work of Manideep has also been completed. A dome of Vijayasan Dham temple was to be raised, the work of which has also been completed. The construction work of Devi Lok started a year ago, which is going on continuously. Its



complete work is to be done in 2025. Idols of 9 forms of Mata Rani will also be installed here.

Two lakh devotees reached Salkanpur Devi Dham

On the fourth day of Navratri,

on Sunday, about 2 lakh devotees reached Salkanpur for the darshan of Mata Rani. Due to it being Sunday, people reached for the temple darshan, due to which there was a situation of jam at many places throughout the day.

People said that there was a jam from the helipad to the main gate of the temple for two hours. To manage it, two-wheelers were stopped from going towards the temple. After this the jam could be cleared.

Beautification of the main temple with red stones

On the theme of Sapt Matrika, Mahavidya, tableaux of Mahakali, Tara, Chhinnamasta, Sundari Bagla, Matangi, Bhuvaneshwari, Siddha Vidya, Bhairavi and Dhruvavati will be installed here. The main temple will be beautified with red stones and a plaza will be constructed as Bhakti Marg.

Modern ropeway will also be built. Salkanpur Vijayasan Devidham will be fully developed as Devi Lok next year. The work of modern ropeway is also expected to be completed here by 2025. It is being constructed at a cost of 97 crores, which will be completed in two years.
