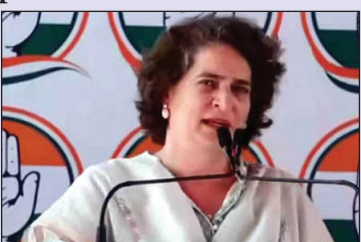

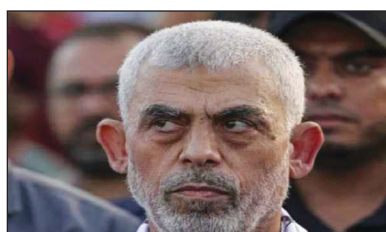

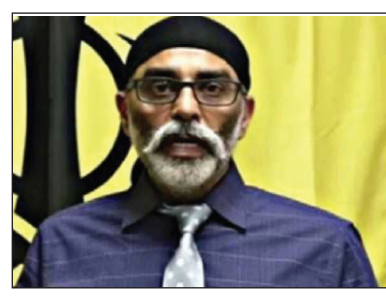

US Justice Department files murder-for-hire charges against Vikas Yadav in Pannun case

Washington/New Delhi (UNI) The US Justice Department has filed murder-for-hire charges against former Indian government employee Vikas Yadav, 39, in connection with his alleged role in the foiled plot to assassinate US-Canadian citizen and Khalistani terrorist Gurbatwant Singh Pannun in New York.



Administration Anne Milgram of the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) said: "We charge that Yadav, an employee of the Indian government, used his position of authority and access to confidential information to direct the attempted assassination of an outspoken critic of the Indian government here on U.S. soil."

'India and Pakistan should live like good neighbours': Nawaz Sharif after EAM Jaishankar's visit

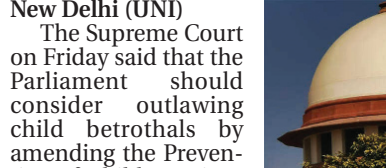

Parliament should consider outlawing child betrothals by amending PCMA : SC

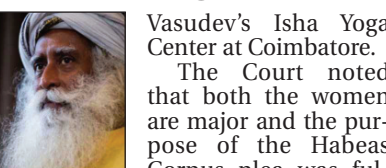
New Delhi (UNI) The Supreme Court on Friday said that the Parliament should consider outlawing child betrothals by amending the Prevention of Child Marriage Act (PCMA), 2006. A bench, comprising Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud, Justice JB Pardiwala and Justice Manoj Misra, was hearing a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) filed by the Society for Enlightenment and Voluntary Action, which sought steps to combat child marriages.



The court emphasized that such practices deprive children of the ability to choose a life partner once they have matured and developed their sense of agency. The ruling comes with several guidelines aimed at strengthening the implementation of the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act (PCMA).

SC closes Habeas Corpus proceedings against Jaggi Vasudev Isha Yoga Center

Non local shot dead in J&K's Shopian

Srinagar: A non-local man from Bihar was shot dead in Jammu and Kashmir's Shopian district on Friday officials said. The incident occurred in the Wandana Malhora area of Shopian early in the morning. The victim, Ashok Chauhan, in his thirties and a resident of Banka district in Bihar, was shot dead around 9 a.m. in Wandana, where he had gone to collect corn. "Ashok, a corn seller by profession, was residing in the Sangam area of Anantnag. This morning, he went to collect corn from Wandana Malhora, a border village of Shopian, where he was shot dead by terrorists," a security official said.
