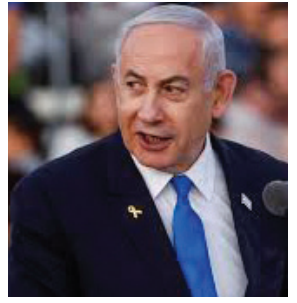

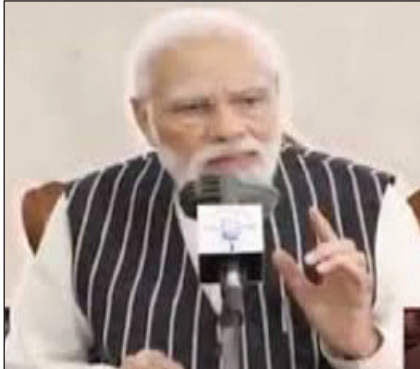

PM calls upon youth to come forward to save elderly from risk of cyber fraud

New Delhi (UNI) Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday called upon youth to come forward to save the elderly from the risk of digital arrest. Addressing the 116th episode of Mann ki Baat, the Prime Minister stressed that the elderly are the most common victims of such crimes, and it is everyone's responsibility to keep them safe from cyber fraud. "We have to explain to people again and again that there is no provision of digital arrest in the government; this is a blatant lie, a conspiracy to trap people. I am happy that our young friends are participating in this work with full sensitivity and are motivating others as well," he said. The Prime Minister announced that on the 162nd birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda next year, 'Vikasit Bharat Young Leaders Dialogue' will be held in



Delhi. "To connect 1 lakh such youths, new youths, to politics, many special campaigns will be run in the country. 'Vikasit Bharat Young Leaders Dialogue' is also one such effort," he added. On the occasion of NCC Day today, PM Modi recounted his days as an NCC

Cadet. He shared that the experience gained from it is invaluable. He added that NCC instills a spirit of discipline, leadership, and service in the youth. "Today, efforts are being undertaken continuously to strengthen NCC in the country. In 2014, about 14 lakh youth were associated with NCC. Now in 2024, more than 20 lakh youth are associated with NCC," he said. Touching upon the subject of cleanliness, Modi said that a special Swachhata Abhiyan was launched to remove decades-old files and scrap from government offices. He said this campaign has brought amazing results in government departments and freed up a lot of space in offices. The Prime Minister pointed out that the concept of 'waste to wealth' is very old in India. He cited a few examples of youth who are transforming waste into

wealth and promoting a sustainable lifestyle. He spoke about Akshara and Prakriti from Mumbai, who are creating fashion items through fabric scraps. Akshara and Prakriti's team transforms fabric scraps into fashion products. The Prime Minister also called upon people to participate in the 'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam' campaign. "People from all over the country participated in this campaign with great enthusiasm. I am very happy to tell you that this campaign has crossed the important milestone of planting 100 crore trees. A 100 crore trees, that too, in just 5 months." Modi informed that in Bihar, the women of 'Jeevika Self Help Group' are running a campaign to plant 75 lakh trees. The focus of these women is on fruit trees, so that income could also be generated in the future.

Mob pelts stones, 3 killed and dozens injured

During mosque survey in UP's Sambhal

Agencies, Sambhal (UP) Three people were killed and around two dozen others, including policemen and senior officials, were injured in a clash that broke out during a survey of a mosque in Uttar Pradesh's Sambhal district on Sunday morning, officials said. The stone-pelting incident occurred when a team arrived at the Shahi Jama Masjid to conduct a fresh survey of the mosque. Locals allegedly pelted stones at security personnel and attacked the police force. The police used tear gas to control the situation. Officials said that four senior police officers, around 20 policemen,



and a deputy collector were seriously injured as the mob pelted stones at the security force. A police Public Relations Officer (PRO) also sustained a bullet injury to his leg during the incident.

A magisterial inquiry has been ordered into the incident, they said. Moradabad Divisional Commissioner Aunjaneya Kumar Singh said, "After the survey was completed, stone pelting started by three groups from three directions. The police used tear gas and plastic bullets to handle the situation. Another group started setting vehicles on fire and also began firing." He added that the situation is under control. "The police PRO was shot in the foot during the firing. The deputy collector's foot was fractured. The Circle Officer (CO) was injured. A total of three people are confirmed dead in the firing. The situation is under control, and we are speaking to with their representatives," Divisional Commissioner Singh told reporters.

Maha: Ajit Pawar elected as group leader of NCP (AP)

Mumbai: NCP-AP president Ajit Pawar was elected as the group leader of party in a meeting of newly elected party MLAs held at his Deogiri bungalow here on Sunday. The Mahayuti comprising BJP, Shiv Sena (Shinde), NCP-AP has registered a historic, record-breaking victory in the Maharashtra Assembly elections and retained power. The Chief Minister's Ladki Bahin Yojana was a game-changer for Mahayuti due to higher women's turnout in election, up by seven percent in this election as compared to 2019 elections, and this donation of votes from the women propelled the Mahayuti to win with a resounding majority, upsetting the game of opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA). The call for Hindu unity with slogans like 'Batenge to Katenge', 'Ek Hai to Safe Hai' also went in favour of the Mahayuti across the state. As a result, the Mahayuti won 230 assembly seats, surpassing the magical majority figure of 145.

CM begins UK tour, to visit British Parliament

Bhopal: Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav has begun his UK tour, aiming to establish the state as a prominent player on the global investment stage. The tour's primary objectives include attracting foreign investment, promoting global industrial cooperation and engaging the Indian Diaspora in the state's progress. Dr. Yadav, on Monday will visit the British Parliament where he will be welcomed and accompanied by British MP Baroness (Sandip K Verma). He will then tour the Parliament with MP Baroness Verma and pay homage to Mahatma Gandhi's statue at Parliament Square, Westminster.



The Chief Minister will host a lunch at the Taj Hotel, St. James' Court in honor of British MPs including Baroness Verma, Lord Kulveer Singh and Shri Bob Blackman. He will also meet with British representatives and discuss investment opportunities in Madhya Pradesh. CM Dr. Yadav will then visit the King's Cross site in London, where he will meet with administrative and trade representatives from Madhya Pradesh, as well as Dr. Param Shah from FICCI and CEO of King's Cross Management, Tom Goodall. They will discuss industrial investment opportunities in the state.

NC Government will boost health sector in J&K: Farooq

Srinagar: National Conference President Farooq Abdullah on Sunday said that the government is dedicated to rectifying the losses incurred in the health sector over the past 10 years. Farooq made these remarks while speaking to a delegation of paramedic employees from Government Medical College (GMC) Anantnag and its affiliated hospitals, who visited him at his residence in Gupkar, Srinagar on Sunday. He emphasized that the government led by Omar Abdullah is committed to addressing the setbacks experienced in the health sector over the last decade. The delegation members sought the establishment of a job policy and the regularization of their services within a specific timeframe.

Assam Rifles in joint operation seize 1 kg narcotics worth Rs 16 cr

Agartala: Assam Rifles in a joint operation with the Customs department successfully seized 1000 gm of Crystal Methamphetamine commonly known as ICE in the international market valued at approximately Rs 16 crore in Badharghat, Tripura on Sunday, a press release said. Following a tip-off, Assam Rifles swiftly launched the operation, which culminated in the seizure of the contraband and its subsequent handover to the Customs Department. The operation is an addition to a series of successful operations carried out by Assam Rifles in its fight against drug trafficking. Earlier the Assam Rifles in two joint operations with the Anti-Narcotics Squad of Mizoram, recovered 107 grams of heroin worth Rs 74.90 lakhs.

Hemant Soren to take oath as Jharkhand CM on Nov 28



Agencies, Ranchi Jharkhand Mukti Morcha executive president Hemant Soren to take the oath as Chief Minister of Jharkhand on November 28. "On 28 November the oath ceremony of the new government will

take place," Hemant Soren told reporters on Sunday. Hemant Soren also tendered his resignation as Jharkhand Chief Minister to the Governor Santosh Gangwar and staked a claim to form Government, at the Raj Bhawan. "Today we have started the procedure to form the (INDIA) alliance government and in that series, we have staked a claim to form Government in front of the Governor. I also tendered my resignation to him...Congress and the RJD in charge were also present here...On 28 November the oath ceremony will take place," he added. Congress leader Subodh Kant Sahay said that Soren has been elected as the leader of the INDIA bloc in Jharkhand.

Govt ready to discuss every issue: Rijiju

New Delhi (UNI) Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju on Sunday said that the government is ready to discuss every topic, but the discussion should be held in a peaceful manner so that it can be beneficial. In the meeting called ahead of the winter session of Parliament starting from Monday, the opposition has demanded discussions on issues like corruption charges against industrialist Gautam Adani, violence in Manipur, pollution in North India and increase in railway accidents and unemployment issues in the country.



Rijiju after the all-party meeting while talking to the media said that the meeting was productive, and leaders of political parties have given

good suggestions. "We had a productive all party meeting today. All political party leaders have given good suggestions and have also put some demands. We took note of all the points put up by the floor leaders. Forty two leaders from 30 political parties attended the meeting." "The suggestions that were given by the floor leaders, will be sent to the Business Advisory Committee and after consent of the Lok Sabha Speaker and Rajya Sabha Chairman it will be decided which issues will be taken up for discussion," Rijiju said.
