

Bhopal's Mahesh making elders a part of digital revolution

► PM hails his initiative in Mann ki Baat; also mentions Indore's record plantation

Bhopal: Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav has said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi has appreciated the work being done by the people of Madhya Pradesh collectively for environmental protection in his Mann Ki Baat programme. This is a matter of pride and inspiration for everyone. He said that the programme always inspires us to do something new. CM Dr. Yadav expressed this view after listening to the 116th edition of PM Modi's 'Mann Ki Baat' programme during his stay in Mumbai.

Over 12 lakh trees planted in Indore
While mentioning the record plantations in Indore under the 'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam' campaign in his Mann ki Baat broadcast, PM Modi said that more than 12 lakh trees were planted in 24 hours under the campaign in Indore. Due to public participation in the campaign, the barren area of Revati Hills of Indore will now be transformed into a green zone.

No provision called digital arrest
PM Modi, while mentioning Mahesh of Bhopal as part of the initiative the youth took to make the elderly participants in the digital revolution, said that he has taught many elderly people of his locality to make payments through mobile. These elderly



people had a smartphone, but no one told them its proper use. PM Modi called upon the youth to come forward to save the elderly from the dangers of digital arrest. He also said that we have to make people understand repeatedly that there is no provision in

PM Modi said that 'Mann Ki Baat' is about the collective efforts of the country, achievements, capabilities of the people, dreams of

youth and aspirations of the citizens of the country. He appealed to the youth to join NCC in large numbers and said that it helps build a personality for any career. PM Modi informed that the Viksit Bharat Young Leaders Dialogue is being organized in Delhi on 11-12 January. About two thousand youth from villages, blocks, districts and states will participate in it. Prime Minister Modi said that libraries have an important role in empowering society. Youth should also take the initiative to make friends with books. He also discussed the Oral History Project.

Sensitivity towards environmental protection is must
PM Modi, while inspiring people to be sensitive towards environmental protection, said that the sparrow (Gauraiyya) has special importance in maintaining biodiversity. Unique efforts are being made in various states for the return of this bird. By making such efforts of everyone around us, the sparrow can again become a part of our lives. PM also mentioned the special cleanliness campaign launched in government offices to remove old files and scraps and appealed to implement the idea of best out of waste (Kachre se Kanchan) by recycling plastic waste and things considered unusable.

MP aims to contribute 20 pc to country's milk production: CM

Bhopal: Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav has said that 9 percent of the total milk production of the country is produced in Madhya Pradesh. Coordinated efforts will be made to take it to 20 percent. CM Dr. Yadav was discussing with senior officials in a high-level meeting regarding increasing milk collection in the organised sector and strengthening the cooperative milk union and federation at Samatva Bhawan at the CM's residence. Dr. Yadav said that efforts will be enhanced for milk production in the cooperative sector.

In the villages of the state where cooperative societies are working, there will be good success in increasing milk production. Also, an action plan has been prepared for the remaining villages. Efforts are being made at the district level to implement this action plan. In districts like Rajgarh, farmer producer organisations have taken enthusiastic initiatives through the Panchayat and Rural Development Department. It was informed in the meeting that as a result of the contract with the National Dairy Development Board, efforts have been intensified to boost milk production in the state. At the outset, CM Dr. Yadav welcomed NDDB Chairman Meenesh Shah with a flower bouquet.

AIIMS Bhopal restores vision to two through corneal transplants

Bhopal: Under the guidance of AIIMS Bhopal's Executive Director, Prof. (Dr.) Ajai Singh, the institute successfully restored the vision of two patients through corneal transplants during this Diwali.
This achievement highlights the dedication of the Ophthalmology Department team and the growing awareness of eye donation in society. Expressing his delight over this accomplishment, Prof. Singh stated, "Diwali is a symbol of light triumphing over darkness, and there can be no greater gift than the gift of vision during this auspicious occasion. I urge everyone to promote eye donation in society so that light can reach those in need."
Dr. Priti Singh and her team performed these successful transplants during Diwali. The first patient, a 28-year-old woman, had been unable to see from one eye since childhood due to an injury. The second patient, a 50-year-old man, lost his vision due to an infection. Both had sought treatment at various places but could not undergo corneal transplants.

Makwana becomes DGP of MP

Kailash Makwana will be the new Director General of Police of MP. After the CM went on a foreign trip, late night, Additional Chief Secretary of Home Department of MP SN Mishra issued an order to make Makwana DGP. Kailash Makwana will be the 32nd DGP of MP. He will replace Sudhir Saxena.
Sudhir Saxena was appointed DGP on 4 March 2020. Nine names were sent by the state government for DGP. A panel of 3 names was prepared in the meeting held last Thursday in Delhi. Among these, the name of 1988 batch IPS Kailash Makwana was at number one. After this, the names of 1988 batch IPS and DG Home Guard Arvind Kumar and 1989 batch IPS and DG EOW Ajay Sharma were included.
Makwana was made Director General in Special Police Establishment Lokayukta in the year 2022. He was working honestly here. During that time, the techni-

cal cell under the then Lokayukta started investigating the Mahakal Lok Corridor. But the government showed displeasure over Kailash Makwana.
He was removed and made the chairman of MP Police Housing Corporation. Then Shivraj's OSD Yogesh Chaudhary was posted as ADG Special Police Establishment Lokayukta. Then Makwana's ACR (confidential character roll) was reduced.
He was transferred seven times in three and a half years
Makwana had appealed to the MP government 9 months ago to improve his ACR (confidential character roll).
While sending a representation, he had told the government that his ACR was spoiled during the 6 months of being DG in the Lokayukta organization. In the Kamal Nath government, he was transferred three times in just one year. He was transferred 7 times in 3 and a half years.

Shehar Qazi takes stock of preparations of Ijtima site

After defeat, Rawat resigns from post of minister

After losing the by-election on Vijaypur seat, Ramniwas Rawat has resigned from the post of minister. Rawat has sent his resignation to Chief Minister Mohan Yadav on moral grounds. Ramniwas Rawat was the Forest and Environment Minister in the Madhya Pradesh government.
Ramniwas Rawat has lost to Mukesh Malhotra of Congress by more than 7 thousand votes in the Vijaypur by-election. It is worth noting that Rawat won the Vijaypur assembly seat in the last assembly elections held in December 2023.

After this, in April, he left the Congress and joined the BJP and became the Forest Minister. After his resignation from the post of MLA from Vijaypur, this seat became vacant and a by-election was called. Rawat joined the BJP on 30 April 2024 during the Lok Sabha elections, after which he was made a minister on 8 July, the Forest Department was taken back from Nagar Singh Chauhan and he was given the responsibility of the Forest and Environment Department, his rank in the cabinet was 12th. He

resigned from the membership of the Legislative Assembly on 10 July. According to the rules, Rawat can remain a minister for a maximum of 6 months after taking oath as a minister, it was necessary for him to win the assembly by-election to retain the ministerial post, but after the defeat, the situation has changed, now he is neither an MLA nor can remain a minister. However, he can be given the status of a cabinet minister by making him the chairman in any corporation-board.
