Numbers of 22 MEMU trains will change from Jan 1

Senior Divisional Commercial Manager Saurabh Kataria said that all passenger trains which are running with zero number will be run again with regular train numbers. These MEMU trains include Bina-Katni Mudwara, Bina-Guna, Itarsi-Katni, Bhopal-Bina, Kota-Bina, Khandwa-Beed Passenger Special, Bina-Gwalior, Bina-Damoh, Bina-Lalitpur.

The purpose of this change is to facilitate the passengers and simplify the identification of trains. All passengers are requested to get information about the new train number before their journey. Factionalism of leaders sink Rawat's electoral boat

Both the former MLAs maintained their enmity till the end, even giving them ministerial status did not work

Harish Dubey, Gwalior BJP leaders are in a state of coma after the defeat in Vijaypur assembly seat. The review of the reasons for the defeat has already begun. It is believed that the local BJP leaders of Vijaypur did not accept Ramniwas Rawat wholeheartedly.

Even before the announcement of Rawat's candidature, two old BJP leaders Babulal Mewara and Sitaram Adivasi, who had been MLAs from Vijaypur seat, had opened a front against Rawat. The move of giving ministerial status to Sitaram by making him the head of Sahariya Vikas Sangh also did not prove to be effective. The enmity of the angry leaders remained and Rawat's fate was the same as that of former minister Imarti Devi of Dabra. It is believed in the Congress camp that the trend of Congress MLAs joining the BJP by defection can now be stopped to some extent.

The command of the election campaign of BJP in Vijaypur was directly handled by the Speaker of the Assembly Narendra Singh Tomar and Jyotiraditya Scindia,



the big stalwarts of the politics of this region, kept a distance from the election campaign, hence the result of Vijaypur is also being linked to the factionalism prevailing at the local level in the ruling party. The question is being raised whether the BJP had to face defeat due to the battle for supremacy among the stalwarts? In political circles, surprise is also being expressed on the fact that why did

the public show affection towards the Congress despite all the welfare schemes of the BJP? The bigwigs of the Congress played an effective role in bringing the tribal and backward class voters closer by campaigning vigorously here.

Hundreds of vehicles get stuck in traffic jams every day in the new and old city, causing trouble to thousands of people. The construction work going on at various places has completely ruined the traffic system. Now people have to face a lot of trouble even in going to the bus stand and railway station. The situation is such that the police have to manually maintain the traffic system at all places.

Status of MP Nagar: The traffic situation in MP Nagar has worsened. Due to the construction of the Metro Rail project and the GG flyover bridge, there are traffic jams at various places. There is a traffic jam on the road from MP Nagar's DB Mall, Board Office Square, Pragati Petrol Pump, Mansarovar Complex Square, Rani Kamlapati Railway Station, Jyoti Talkies Square, ISBT Tiraha, Anna Nagar Square, JK Road Tiraha, Prabhat Petrol Pump Square, 80



Feet Road Ashok Garden to the station.

Red buses run on one way

Road construction work is going on from Alpana Talkies to Royal Market, due to which the red buses engaged in public transport are being run on one way. Due to increased traffic load on a single road, vehicles keep crawling on the entire road throughout the day. Many times there is a traffic jam due to traffic on a single road, which has to be cleared with great difficulty.

Facing difficulty in reaching railway station

Construction work of the metro

rail project is going on at platform number 6 of Bhopal railway station, due to which the road on one side has been closed. Vehicles coming and going to the station have to pass through the same route, due to which the traffic system remains disrupted day and night. Many times passengers miss their trains due to the jam. The office for the construction work of the metro project has also been built outside, due to which traffic is getting disrupted.

Every minute, there is a jam in the old city

There is a jam of vehicles in Hamidia Road, Nadra Bus Stand, Bharat Talkies, Bhopal Talkies,

Sindhi Colony, Shahjahanabad, Royal Market, DIG Bungalow, Karond Chouraha, Kohefiza Police Station Chauraha, Hamidia Hospital Gate, Kotwali Peergate, and other areas of the old city in every minute. Due to road construction work, wiring has been disturbed at many places, due to which traffic signals are also closed. Due to this also the problem has increased. The condition of Hamidia Road and Nadra Bus Stand of the old city is the worst. About 350 buses operate from Nadra Bus Stand daily, due to which the traffic system has collapsed. A new building is being constructed at the old bus stand. Also, a new bus stand is being built in front of the DIG bungalow, but till the bus stand is not shifted to the new place, the situation seems to be the same.

Due to construction work going on, there is difficulty in smooth functioning of the traffic system at many places. Traffic is being run manually by applying additional force. Recently, officials of PWD, Municipal Corporation, Electricity Department and Narmada Project and other departments have inspected. Efforts are being made to smoothen the traffic system before the Jtima.

Talented candidates should be selected for unreserved posts

Chronicle Reporter, Jabalpur A PIL was filed challenging the non-implementation of reservation rules in the recruitments to be held in the High Court.

The bench of Chief Justice Suresh Kumar Kaith and Justice Vivek Jain of the High Court has said in its order that talented students should be selected for unreserved posts.

In the petition filed by Madhya Pradesh Scheduled Caste and Tribe Officer Employees Association (AJAKS), it was said that not a single SC and ST candidate has been selected in the Civil Judge Recruitment Examination 2022.

In the result of the exami-

nation, the cut off for the unreserved category was 113 marks and 109 marks for OBC. Meritorious students of reserved category who got 113 to 129 marks were not selected in the unreserved category.

Due to not selecting a single candidate of SC-ST category, the High Court has written a letter to the state government to obtain permission to fill the vacant posts from the general category, considering them not suitable. It was said in the petition that during the hearing of the petition filed earlier, the High Court had accepted that 50 percent of the

candidates from the unreserved category are not selected in the preliminary and examination. The cut off for the unreserved category for recruitment to the posts of Steno and Assistant Grade 3 was 74 and the cut off for the reserved category was 88 marks.

It was said in the petition that the reservation rules and the guidelines of the state government are not followed in the recruitments in the High Court.

It is mandatory to score 20 out of 50 marks in the interview for recruitment. The High Court arbitrarily applies it by citing Article 234 of

the Constitution. The division bench had issued notice to the Registrar General, Principal Secretary and Law Secretary of the High Court and issued orders to keep the other recruitment petitions including the Civil Judge examination pending.

It was decided to hear the petition in the full court of the High Court on Thursday. After hearing the petition on Thursday, the division bench, while disposing of the petition, cited the Supreme Court's order in its order and said that talented candidates should be selected for unreserved posts, irrespective of their class. Advocates Rameshwar Singh Thakur and Vinayak Shah argued on behalf of the petitioner.

Wild elephant management study team reaches Karnataka

Receives important information about wild elephant management

The wild elephant management study team of forest officials of Madhya Pradesh reached Karnataka on Wednesday. On the first day, the study team had a detailed discussion with Dr. Manoj Kumar, APCCF (Project Elephant) of Karnataka State to know the best

practices implemented by the Karnataka Forest Department for Human-Elephant Conflict (HEC) management.

The study team of the state visited Bannerghatta National Park, Bengaluru. During this, DCF Prabhakar Priyadarshi of Bannerghatta National Park, Bengaluru gave field-based information to the team about various HEC mitigation measures.

He informed the study team about various field strategies like elephant control room, monitoring room, railway barriers, solar flooding, hanging tentacle flooding and advanced warning animals.

The Madhya Pradesh study team also interacted with ETF staff and RRT members, from which the study team gained important information about wild elephant management in Karnataka.
