#### **INDIA bloc leaders to** meet Kharge today

New Delhi: Floor leaders of IN-DIA bloc will meet Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge at his Parliament House office on Monday. The Winter Session of Parliament begins on Monday. Earlier in the day, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju had convened an allparty meeting. The Winter Ses-sion of Parliament will begin from Monday and will conclude on December 20.

### **Telangana achieves** record paddy procurement

**Hyderabad:** Telangana is on track for record-breaking paddy procurement, following a his-toric production of 153 lakh metric tonnes (LMT) cultivated metric tonnes (LM1) cultivated across 66.07 lakh acres by 40 lakh farmers, Civil Supplies and Irrigation Minister Capt N Ut-tam Kumar Reddy announced on Sunday. Speaking to the me-dia after a surviso vicit to prodia after a surprise visit to procurement centres in the Huzurnagar constituency, Reddy highlighted the state's robust agricultural performance despite challenges, including the non-func-tionality of the Kaleshwaram project. He credited the Congress government's proactive measures for ensuring efficient procurement and farmer support. As of November 23, Telan-gana has procured 21.73 LMT of paddy, valued at Rs 5,040.01 crore. Of this, 16.06 LMT comprises coarse varieties (Doddu), and 5.67 LMT are fine varieties (Sannaalu). To encourage the cultivation of fine varieties, a bonus of Rs 283.25 crore has been announced, with Rs 80.17 crore already disbursed. Payments worth Rs 2,760.22 crore have been released to farmers, surpassing last year's Rs 2,414.23 crore by Rs 345.99 crore. The remaining Rs 2,279.78 crore will be disbursed shortly, Reddy assured.

# No relief from high pollution levels in Delhi as AQI remains 'very poor'

The air quality in the Delhi-NCR remained in the high concerning zone as several areas continued to be in the 'severe' AQI category on Sunday. No relief from high pollution lev-els in Delhi as AQI remains 'very

poor'

According to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), the average air quality index (AQI) in the national capital till 7.30 a.m. was 366, which is in the 'very poor' category.

In eight areas, the AQI level remained above 400 and between 500. It was 410 in Alipur, 412 in Anand Vihar, 408 in Nehru Nagar, 404 in Vivek Vihar, and 409 in Wazirpur.

Whereas in other parts of the na-tional capital, the AQI level remained between 300 and above 400. It was 392 in Ashok Vihar, 313 in

Aya Nagar, 362 in Burari Crossing, 353 in Chandni Chowk, 354 in



Mathura Road, 356 in Dr Karni Singh Shooting Range, 400 in Dwarka Sec-tor 8, 327 in IGI Airport, 380 in Dilshad Garden, 340 in Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, 302 in Lodhi Road, 372 in Major Dhyanchand Stadium, 328 in Mandir Marg, 319 in Najaf-

The AQI in Faridabad was 309, Gurugram 240, Ghaziabad 312, Greater Noida 304 and in Noida it was 309.

A layer of smog was visible in the whole of the Delhi-NCR.

As per the CPCB, AQI between 0-50 is considered 'good', 51-100 is 'satisfactory', 101-200 is 'moderate', 201-300 is 'poor', 301-400 is 'very poor' and 401-500 is 'severe'.

The anti-pollution measures under Stage 4 of the Graded Response Action Plan are currently in place to address the deteriorating air quality.

The measures include a ban on the entry of trucks, except for those carrying essential items or using fuels such as LNG, CNG, BS-VI diesel, or electric power. Construction at public projects has also been stopped.

## **Telangana Police boost NDPS conviction rates**

#### Hyderabad (UNI)


### NCC remains instrumental in motivating cadets to contribute in nation-building: Maj Gen Bevli

## Fresh snowfall shuts strategic Mughal road in J&K

#### Srinagar (UNI)

The higher reaches of Kashmir valley experienced a fresh snowfall while some plains received rains resulting in closure of several strategic roads on Sunday, officials said.

The historical Mughal road connecting south Kashmir's Shopian district with the twin districts of Poonch and Rajouri in Jammu division, was closed for vehicular traffic as a precautionary measure following the snowfall on Peer Ki Gali on Sunday, traffic police officials said.

Gurez-Bandipora road was also shut for vehicular traffic due to accumulation of snowfall on the Razdan top and other connected roads of the north Kashmir district. The traffic on Sonamarg-Kargil road has also been suspended due to slippery conditions, they said.

The overnight snowfall covered the ski resort of Gulmarg in north



Kashmir Baramulla district in a white blanket, much to the delight of the tourists staying there.

Reports of snowfall were received from Karnah in frontier Kashmir district of Kupwara. Leh in the Union Territory of Ladakh also received the season's first snowfall on Sunday.

Barring the picnic spot of Kokernag in south Kashmir the day temperature marginally dropped and recorded below normal at all the

weather stations of the valley on Sat urday. Srinagar recorded the maximum temperature at 12.3°C and it was 1.6°C below normal on the previous day.

The minimum temperature recorded during the intervening night of Saturday and Sunday at various Kashmir weather stations was 2 to 6°C above normal except at Gulmarg.

Gulmarg recorded a low of minus 1.5°C and it was 0.4°C above normal for the valley of meadows during this period of the season.

The Meteorological Centre Srinagar predicted that the weather generally will remain cloudy with the possibility of light rain/light snow over higher reaches and at isolated

places till forenoon today. The weather is likely to remain generally dry till the end of Novem-ber.

#### Delhi Court acquits man accused of murdering woman in 1998

New Delhi: Delhi's Saket District Court recently acquitted a man accused of stabbing a woman to death 26 years back in 1998. The accused had absconded and was declared a proclaimed offender by the Court.

He was arrested in the year 2022 from his native village in Dausa Rajasthan after 24 years of the incident. An FIR was registered in the police station Okhla Industrial Area in March 1998.

Additional Sessions Judge (ASJ) Rajneesh Kumar Gupta acquitted Niranjan of the offence of murder of Maya.

The court said that the prosecution has failed to prove its case beyond reasonable doubt against the accused for the offence punishable under Section 302 IPC.
