Pratika, Mandhana lead India to record-breaking win



India secured a record-breaking victory over Ireland on Wednesday, winning by a massive margin of 304 runs—their biggest-ever in One Day Internationals (ODIs).

The emphatic triumph came after India posted an astonishing total of 435/5, surpassing their previous best of 370/5 set just three days ago.

The Indian innings was led by stellar performances from Pratika Rawal and Smriti Mandhana, both of whom scored centuries. Pratika, in particular, was the standout, scoring 154 runs.

Mandhana also contributed significantly with a powerful knock of 135 runs, which included seven sixes. The duo shared a dominant opening partnership of 233 runs, marking India's fourth century partnership in just six innings together.

Mandhana's 80-ball performance was a treat to watch, as she continued her rich vein of form, while Rawal's knock was built on impeccable timing and placement, showcasing controlled strokeplay.

Richa Ghosh, promoted in the

batting order to maintain momentum, made an impact by scoring 59 off 42 balls. However, after Pratika's dismissal, India's scoring slowed down, with just 48 runs added in the final six overs of their innings.

In reply, Ireland's batting crumbled under pressure, with the visibled under pressure, with the visi-tors bowled out for just 131 in 31.4 overs. Only four Irish batsmen reached double figures, with Sarah Forbes top-scoring with 41 off 44 balls, and Orla Prendergast con-tributing 36 off 43 balls. Despite a late 64-run partnership between Forbes and Prendergast,

Ireland's hopes were dashed as the remaining eight wickets fell for just

India's bowling was led by Deepti Sharma, who claimed figures of 3-27, playing a crucial role in dismantling the Irish lineup.

"We were expecting them to come out strong, and they have had their national league a lot longer than we have. We knew they'd be good, but no better way to start the series than with such a strong team," she

Having a wealth of experience in sports such as netball, basketball, and equestrian, Cottrill spoke about ĥer recent introduction to Kho Kho.

"I'd never actually heard of Kho Kho before. I had heard a lot about Kabaddi, as AFL players have played Kabaddi, but Kho Kho was new to me.

A friend of a friend called me up, and I rallied some friends to form a team. I only learned the rules recently, and we have been training pretty regularly to prepare for the competition.

Drawing on her diverse porting background, Cottrill ighlighted how her skills in long-distance running have contributed to her quick adaptation to Kho Kho.



Djokovic battles through to **Australian Open third round**

Melbourne, (UNI): Novak Djokovic overcame a second-set stumble to stay on track for a record-breaking 25th Grand Slam title after a four-set victory over Jaime Faria at the Aus-

Open on Wednesday. The 10-time tournament winner defeated the talented 21-year-old 6-1, 6-7 (4), 6-3, 6-2 in three hours. Although Faria's hard-hitting play occasionally flustered Djokovic, the Serb's defensive brilliance helped him navigate through the challenges. In the third round, Djokovic will face 26th seed Tomas Machac, who came from behind to beat

Playing on his favored Rod Laver Arena, the site of many of his most iconic triumphs, Djokovic extended his streak of 18 consecutive second-round appearances in Melbourne.

Ranked 120th, Faria is a rising star, as evidenced by his commanding win over Russian Pavel Kotov in the opening round of his Grand Slam debut. However, the pressure of the center court seemed to get the better of the young player. Djokovic seized the opportunity, raising his level of play after a sluggish opening-round victory over 17-year-old American wildcard Nishesh Basavareddy.

However, the 37-year-old was far from satisfied. Frustrated with his performance, he hit his racquet on the table beside his chair during the changeover after the fifth game. The outburst seemed to fuel Djokovic, who responded by

producing clean ball striking and delicate drop shots to seal the first set. The second set appeared to be under control for Djokovic, who broke Faria in the third game with a backhand winner. But errors began to creep into Djokovic's game, including a misfired smash into the net, allowing Faria to win four consecutive games.
