

Deputy CM dedicates MRI service centre

JP Hospital first dist hospital in state to provide MRI service



Bhopal: Deputy Chief Minister Rajendra Shukla has said that work is being done at a rapid pace to equip all the district hospitals of the state with modern facilities. He said that the objective of the government is to provide high level health services to the citizens in their own district. For this, health infrastructure is being strengthened and arrangements for necessary medical equipment

are being ensured. Providing advanced, accessible and affordable health services to the citizens is the top priority of the government.

Deputy Chief Minister Shukla dedicated the MRI Investigation Service Centre at District Hospital Bhopal (JP Hospital). JP Hospital has become the first district hospital in the state to provide MRI service.

Shukla said that the government is continuously making efforts to strengthen and expand health services in the state. He said that MRI investigation service will also be started soon in Ujjain, Indore, Gwalior and Jabalpur. Deputy CM Shukla said that this service will be available to the citizens at 30 percent less charge than the CGHS rate. Also, this service will be free for the beneficiaries registered under Ayushman Bharat Yojana.

The Bhopal MRI Centre has been set up at a cost of Rs 10 crore 50 lakh, which includes building construction, equipment and technical upgradation. A 1.5 Tesla UMR 580 machine has been installed in it, which is equipped with the recently launched advanced technology. It ensures fast, accurate scanning, advanced imaging and energy efficiency. The centre has a scanning capacity of 80 patients per day, providing quality service with minimum waiting time and accurate reporting.

Free of cost to Ayushman beneficiaries

Advanced MRI facilities will be made available to patients at up to 30 percent less than CGHS rates. This facility will be provided completely free of cost to the beneficiaries of Ayushman Bharat Yojana. MRI Abdomen (Plain) (CGHS rate Rs. 2125) is available here at Rs. 1423. MRI Brain (Plain) (CGHS rate Rs. 1998) at Rs. 1338, MRI Shoulder (Plain) (CGHS rate Rs. 2000) at Rs. 1339 and MRI Knee (Contrast) (CGHS rate Rs. 4500) will be done at only Rs. 3014.

Along with tigers, it is a better place for the residence of Indian wolves, vultures and many kinds of animals and birds. The special thing here is that a large number of migratory birds come here. Which are the center of attraction in the winter season.

Apart from Asian countries, many kinds of birds come from European countries, in which vultures gather the

most here, about seven species of vultures come here in the winter season. Apart from the Himalayas, these migratory birds reach here after travelling 3 to 4 thousand kilometres from European countries. This time also these migratory birds have started reaching Nauradehi. They can be easily seen around the ponds and river pools of the Tiger Reserve.

Why did the migratory birds like the Nauradehi Tiger Reserve? Talking about the biggest tiger reserve of Madhya Pradesh, the migratory birds like its climate, vast forests and natural

water sources a lot. For this reason, apart from the countries around India, a large number of migratory birds reach here in the winter season from other countries of Asia and Europe. Experts say that the migratory birds stay around the three ponds and both the rivers of the Tiger Reserve. These include Jagrasi Kheda, Chhevla and Jagtarai ponds.

They can be easily seen around the ponds or pond-like structures of the Byarma and Bamner rivers flowing here. The migratory birds like the climate here so much that some birds travel 3 to 4 thousand kilometers to reach here. Apart from seven types of vultures, Woolly Necked Stork found in Haryana, Painted Stork (Sarus) can also be seen. Black Storks come here for breeding and make ponds and trees on the river banks their home.

The historic Shri Ramleela fair located on the banks of the Patchitra Vaishwati has been going on for the last 123 years. The foundation ceremony was held on Monday. During this, Shri Ram Lola Mela Committee Chairman Collector Roshan Kumar Singh and Honorary Secretary Anil Sharma and various officials of the committee were present. The fair's leelas were formally inaugurated on Tuesday with the Makar Sankranti festival. With which the fair will conclude, before this there will be various Leelas every day in which there will also be Leelas like Shri Ram Janam Mahotsav and Ravana Vadh. On Tuesday, on the occasion of Makar Sankranti festival, a large number of people from the city as well as the surrounding rural areas reached the banks of Vaitravati to take a bath in Vaitravati.

There should be 50 percent GST exemption in the fair

Hence, you are requested that if with your efforts, 50 percent GST exemption on sales in the fair for one month is approved by the Madhya Pradesh Government and it can be restarted from this year, then it will be a great blessing for the citizens, shops and traders of the entire Vidisha district.
