

IIT Madras gears up for 3rd edition of Kashi Tamil Sangamam

Chennai; The Indian Institute of Technology-Madras (IIT-Madras) is all set to e 3rd edition of 'Kashi Tamil Sanga-mam', an event of the Union Ministry of Education, to be held from February 15 to 24. Maharashtra: Youth dies after choked by kite thread

Nashik: A twenty-three-yearold youth riding a two-wheeler in Maharashtra's Nashik disthread got stuck in his neck on Tuesday, police said, The deceased youth has been identified as Šonu Dhotre, who had come to Nashik from Valsad in Gujarat for Sankranti. He was to get married four months later. The incident occurred around 12:30 p,m, while Dhotre was crossing the Chau-phuli of Pathardigaon village on his two-wheeler. Seeing him bleeding profusely, some citizens immediately took him to a private hospital for treatment.

Private passenger transport companies to be under one regulation: Maharashtra

Mumbai: Maharashtra Transport Minister Pratap Sarnaik on Tuesday said all private passenger transport companies like Ola, Uber and Rapido will be brought under one regulation. He was addressing a meeting organised in the Mantralaya (secretariat) during the day. Sarnaik said after studying the policy brought by the central government regarding private passenger transport companies, it is necessary to bring these companies under one transport rule. Passenger safety should be given priority. Four-wheelers, bikes, taxis will be brought under the provision. He said women drivers should also be given priority to ride bikes, as the emphasise was on generating maximum employment.

Justice Sujoy Paul appointed as Acting Chief Justice of

Telangana High Court Hyderabad: Justice Sujay Paul has been appointed as the new Chief Justice of the Telangana High Court. President Droupadi Murmu issued the notification, officially assigning the responsibilities of Chief Justice to Justice Sujoy Paul, who is a senior judge of the Telangana High Court. This appointment follows the transfer of the current Chief Justice, Justice Alok Aradhe, to the Bombay High Court as its Chief Justice. Born on June 21, 1964, Justice Sujoy Paul holds degrees in B.A., M.A., and LL.B. He was enrolled with the Bar Council of Madhya Pradesh in 1990 and has served various organisations, including banks, the Human Rights Commission, and other boards.

BJP is using bomb threats to schools for political gains: AAP

Senior Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader and Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh on Tuesday accused the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) of engaging in petty politics by using bomb threats to schools for political gain, just ahead of the upcoming

This came after BJP spokesperson Sudhanshu Trivedi asked AAP to clarify its ties with individuals linked to NGOs involved in activities such as protesting against Afzal Guru's hanging, while citing the Delhi Police investigation into hoax bomb threat emails and calls in the national capital. Delhi Police today claimed that a school student, who was recently apprehended for allegedly sending bomb threats to more than 400 schools in the national capital, is linked to an NGO supported by a po-



Addressing the media, Singh asserted, "Several threats have been made to blow up Delhi's schools, but police have not been able to provide

any information, but today BJP leader Sudhanshu Trivedi has come up with a fabricated story."

It is extremely shameful that BJP is

using bomb threats to schools for political gains, Singh said adding that AAP has been raising concerns about Delhi's deteriorating law and order for a long time, but the BJP-led gov-ernment at the Centre has done

nothing.

"Just a while ago, you might have watched the press conference of Delhi's self-appointed Police Commissioner, Sudhanshu Trivedi. He has now been unofficially appointed as the Police Commissioner of Delhi, unveiling new revelations every day," he said. "Information that even the police cannot provide is now being communicated by Sudhanshu Trivedi. When the police remain silent, Anurag Thakur speaks. What the police don't know, Smriti Irani seems to know. For example, they mentioned the name of one of our Dalit MLAs, Jai Bhagwan Upkar, saying that he received a notice," Singh accused.

He said that that the party had always given respect and recognition to all those who have made contribution to the Congress and will keep on doing so in the future

On the former Prime Minister's remark that "history will be kinder to me', the Congress Chief said, "I would like to assure Dr Manmohan Singh ji that history is indeed very kind to you".

He said that the Congress stood on the power of ideas. Adding that all the major national heroes including Dadabhai Naoroji, Mahatma Gandhi, Sarojini Naidu, Sardar Patel, Nehru, Maulana Azad, Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose, Rajendra Prasad were the party's heritage.

SC dismisses KTR's plea against FIR in Formula-E Race 'scam' case

The Supreme Court on Wednesday dismissed as withdrawn a Special Leave Petition (SLP) filed by Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) MLA Kalvakuntla Taraka Rama Rao (KTR) challenging a Telangana High Court order that refused to quash an FIR against him in connection with the alleged Formula-E race 'Scam' case.

A bench comprising Justice Bela M. Trivedi and Justice P.B. Varale declined to interfere at this stage, prompting KTR to withdraw his plea. The FIR accuses KTR, the then Urban Development Minister, of misusing funds of the Hyderabad Metropolitan Development Authorities.

The Telangana High Court, in its January 7 order, observed that as the Urban Development Minister, KTR had control over HMDA and its

The High Court held that there



was a prima facie case against him under Section 409 of the Indian Penal Code (criminal breach of trust by a public servant) and under Sections 13(1)(a) and 13(2) of the Prevention of Corruption Act (criminal misconduct by a public servant).

Justice K. Lakshman of the High Court noted that HMDA is a corporate body with its funds, and the allegations in the FIR suggested that KTR misused these funds for purposes unrelated to public welfare.

Senior Advocate Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for the State of Telangana, opposed the plea, arguing that the investigation was still ongoing and that interference at this stage was premature. The advocate representing KTR argued that the case was po litically motivated, with no evidence

of personal financial gain. The entire charge is about payments made for the event to prevent a loss. There is no allegation that KTR benefited personally or took a single rupee," the counsel submitted. The bench refused to entertain the plea, observing that it was not in clined to intervene in an ongoing in vestigation. After the court ex pressed its disinclination, KTR with drew his petition. The High Cour had previously rejected KTR's con tention that the FIR lacked ingred ents of Section 409 of the IPC, noting that as the Minister for the MA & UI Department, he had direct control over HMDA and approved financial decisions related to the event.

Smallest newborn in Southeast Asia regains life at Lourdes Hospital

Kochi: A newborn baby, "Nova," weighing only 350 grams at birth, has overcome extreme odds to regain health, setting a new record as the smallest newborn in Southeast Asia. A baby from Hyderabad previously held the record for the smallest newborn in India and Southeast Asia, weighing 375 grams at birth.

The second position is occupied by Kashvi, who was born weighing 380 grams and is now studying in UKG with good health, and he was brought into the world in 2019 at Lourdes Hospital in Er-

Born prematurely at just 23 weeks of gestation, Nova's survival was uncertain, but thanks to the dedication and expertise of Dr. Rojo Joy and the neonatal team at Lourdes Hospital, Nova's life was saved after over 100 days of advanced and intensive care.

For any newborn, survival typically requires at least 24 weeks of growth in the mother's womb.



The Supreme Court on Wednesday directed the Chief Secretary of Punjab to submit a complete comparative medical report of farmers' leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal, who has been on a hunger strike for over 49

The reports, including Dallewal's latest vitals, are to be handed over to the Registrar (Judicial) of the Supreme Court, who will then obtain a medical opinion from the Director of AIIMS.

A bench comprising Justice Surya Kant and Justice N.K. Singh after the State of Punjab claimed that Dallewal's health condition was "improving" but later clarified that his vitals were "stable" rather than improving.

Senior Advocate Kapil Sibal, appearing for the State of Punjab, informed the bench that a medical facility had been set up just 10 meters from the protest site and that an affidavit on Dallewal's latest vitals had been submitted. Sibal added that his



parameters were currently stable. Justice Kant expressed concern

over the claim of "improving vitals" and questioned the State's position, noting the inconsistency with earlier reports indicating deteriorating health. "How can a person's vitals improve after fasting for more than 46 days?" Justice Kant remarked, emphasizing the need for accurate and transparent medical updates. Sibal clarified that the statement

of "improvement" was based on the findings of a Medical Board and reiterated that Dallewal's condition is stable, not improving.

Jagjit Singh Dallewal, a cancer patient with age-related ailments, has been on a fast-unto-death since Nodemanding a statutory guarantee for Minimum Support Price (MSP) for

His health has deteriorated significantly, and he is now unable to take water. Medical experts have stated that even if he ends his fast, full recovery may be difficult.

The Supreme Court was hearing a contempt petition against Punjab officials for failing to comply with an earlier Apex Court directive to shift Dallewal to a hospital. The Court had clarified that

Dallewal could continue his hunger strike under medical supervision but expressed displeasure at the State's

On January 6, Sibal informed the Court of a "breakthrough" in negotiations between the Punjab Government and the protesting farmers, facilitated by Justice (Retired) Nawab Singh, Chairperson of a High-Powered Committee constituted by the Supreme Court.

Telangana CM embarks on key Delhi visit and foreign tour

New Delhi/Hyderabad: Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy has arrived in the national capital, Delhi ahead of the inauguration of the new All India Congress Committee (AICC) central office on Wednesday.

Accompanied by Deputy CM Bhatti Vikramarka, TPCC Chief Mahesh Kumar Goud, and other ministers, the Chief Minister will participate in the ceremony scheduled for 1030 hours, party sources said.

The inauguration has drawn several top Congress leaders from across the country, including Andhra Pradesh PCC President YS Sharmila, who met AICC President Mallikarjun Kharge and General Secretary KC Venugopal to discuss political developments

Following the AICC office opening, CM Revanth Reddy will hold a special meeting with senior Congress leaders to deliberate on critical state issues, including the expansion of the Telangana cabinet, the composition of the TPCC executive committee, and filling nominated posts.

SC directs Kerala govt to maintain confidentiality of data in Malankara Orthodox-Jacobite Church dispute

The Supreme Court on Wednesday directed the State of Kerala to refrain from publishing or circulating data regarding the population, assets, and churches belonging to the Malankara Orthodox and Jacobite factions, amidst ongoing tensions between the two denominations. The bench, comprising Justice

Surya Kant and Justice N.K. Sigh, emphasized the need for utmost caution in matters of religious disputes, asserting that judicial intervention in such sensitive issues must be handled delicately. "Courts have to tread very carefully in religious affairs. Today you have come; tomorrow, some other group might come. We must exercise extreme caution," Justice Surya Kant re-



marked during the hearing. In December 2024, the Court di-

rected the Kerala government to provide detailed data on the population of the Orthodox and Jacobite denominations (preferably sub-region/gram panchayat-wise), a list of churches under their complete administrative control, and the status of churches where disputes over management persist.

The Malankara faction raised concerns during Wednesday's hearing, apprehending that the publication of such data could escalate tensions between the two communities. Senior Advocate K.K. Venugopal, representing the Malankara side, argued that the figures could create "heartburn" and proposed that the data be submitted to the Court in a sealed cover. He further contended that the "numbers game" might lead to confusion and disrupt the delicate balance established by previous court judgments.

Senior Advocate Krishnan Venugopal, also appearing for the Malankara faction, echoed this sentiment, arguing that the publication of manipulated figures could lead to further disputes.

Karnataka challenges VC appointment draft

Karnataka government has urged the University Grants Commission (UGC) to immediately withdraw its draft guidelines on the appointment of Vice Chancellors, terming them a violation of the federal structure and an encroachment on the rights of State Governments. In a letter to Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, Karnataka Higher Education Minister Dr MC Sudhakar expressed strong opposition to the proposed rules, which he claimed undermine the State's authority over higher education governance.

Dr Sudhakar highlighted that the draft UGC (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment and Promotion of Teachers and Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations, 2025, exclude State Governments



from the Vice Chancellors' selection process. The guidelines empower the Chancellor/Visitor to appoint a search-cum-selection committee and make appointments without any involvement of the State Government. Calling the provisions unacceptable, Dr. Sudhakar argued that they contradict existing state legislation, jeopardise the federal structure, and dilute the State's responsibility to provide quality edu-
