Confessional statement of convicts not legally valid: Advocate S Nagamuthu

Mumbai: Former Justice of Kerala High Court S Nagamuthu, now a senior advocate, on Wednesday challenged be-fore the Bombay High Court the conviction of two men on death row in the Mumbai 7/11 train blasts case saying the confessional statement of the duo recorded by the police was given under duress and so cannot be used as evidence against them. Arguing before a special bench of Justice Anil Kilor and Justice Shyam Chandak on behalf of the convicts, Nagamuthu cited various judgements of the apex court and claimed that the confessional statement of convicts Faisal Atta Urehman Shaikh and Ali Shaikh were not recorded as per the guidelines framed by the Supreme Court.

Police detain minor for raping aged woman

Mumbai: Police detained a 17-year-old minor for allegedly raping a 37-year-old woman at knifepoint while she was alone at home in Mankhurd in the Shiveii ĥome in Mankhurd in the Shivaji Nagar area of the Mumbai suburb, an official said here on

According to police reports, the incident occurred around 4:30 p.m. on Monday. The woman, a homemaker, was sitting near the door of her house with her two children inside while her husband was at work.

The accused, who had been monitoring her movements, followed her into the house, locked the door from inside, and brandished a knife. He threatened to kill her and her children if she resisted. He then forcibly assaulted her, locked the door from outside,

Hearing the woman's cries for help, neighbours rushed to open the door and informed her husband and the police.

Muda case: Karnataka HC lifts interim stay on Lokayukta probe against Siddaramaiah

In a significant development, the Karnataka High Court on Wednesday lifted the interim stay imposed on the Mysuru Lokayukta police's investigation into the Mysore Urban Development Authority (MUDA) scam case, involving Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and his co-accused.

Justice M Nagaprasanna directed the Lokayukta to resume its probe, which will now be monitored by the Inspector General of Police.

The court further directed the Lokayukta to submit a progress report by January 27, and all relevant records and files pertaining to the case by January 16. The investigation, which concerns allegations of illegal land allotments linked to Siddaramaiah's wife, Parvati, has faced significant political

During the hearing, Senior Advo-

cate Maninder Singh, representing activist and complainant Snehamayi Krishna, raised concerns about the fairness of the investigation, suggesting that the state-controlled Lokayukta might not conduct an impartial probe.

He also highlighted that a surprise investigation by a committee of IAS officers had removed all records from the Lokayukta, although the High Court clarified that the committee's actions were unrelated to the specific allegations against Siddaramaiah.

The Chief Minister's legal team, led by Senior Advocates Dr. A.M. Singhvi and Professor Ravivarma Kumar, dismissed these concerns, arguing that with the court's earlier directions for the Lokayukta to investigate the case.

The court's decision follows a previous ruling in September, where Sid-daramaiah's plea challenging the sanction granted to file corruption charges against him was dismissed. The Karnataka Lokayukta had subsequently filed an FIR against the Chief Minister and three others on charges of corruption, cheating, and forgery.

With the investigation now resuming under the court's close supervision, political observers believe the case could have far-reaching implications for Siddaramaiah's political future, especially with upcoming elec-

Professor Dhara is renowned for his groundbreaking contributions to the field of liquid crystal science and technology. His research spans a wide range of innovative areas, including the fundamental understanding of topological defects and colloidal interactions, the discovery of new states of colloidal organization enabled by topology, and the development of controllable motile particles for topological active matter. Notably, Professor Dhara has pioneered liquid crystal microdroplet-based optical microresonators and micro-lasers and uncovered novel physiochemical effects and properties in ferroelectric and ferromagnetic nematic liquid crystals.

Tribal woman trampled to death by wild elephant at Edakkara

Malappuram (Kerala) (UNI)

A 52-year-old tribal woman was trampled to death by a wild elephant at Edakkara in Moothedam Gram Panchayat bordering to Nilambur forest on Wednesday.

This was the second attack of wild

elephants against tribal people within a span of eleven days. Mani (35), a tribal youth of Manchiri-Poochapara colony in Karulai village was trampled to death on January 4. According to reports, the de-

ceased was identified as Sarojini (52) alias Neeli, residing in Uchakulam colony at Edakkara.

The incident took place around 1000 hrs, when a group of tribal people went to graze their cattles and collect forest resources from Karulai forest areas, which was about half kilometre away from their houses.

Suddenly, they found a herd of elephants and one of them attacked Sarojini and others fled away from



the scene. Later, they returned to the accident spot and found that the body was lying on the ground. They shifted the body by walking around half a kilometre to their house at Uchakulam colony premises. Local residents alerted the forest department about the incident.

People's representatives and political leaders also rushed to the spot and they demanded that the body has to be shifted to Nilambur hospital for post mortem and inquest, after the visit of the District Collector and top forest officials of the district who should ensure that there will be no further incidents of elephant at-

Wayanad South District Forest Officer (DFO) Danithlal said that arrangements will be made soon to set up hanging fencing and trenches bordering the forest areas within a

Following the elephant attack, on January 5, Nilambur MLA, P V Anvar led Democratic Movement of Kerala (DMK) workers organized a protest agitation to the DFO office and they also damaged the windowpanes and

Police arrested 11 DMK workers including MLA on January 6 and lodged in a jail and released on bail on January 7. This incident created controversy and led to the resignation of Anvar from the post. He recently joined the Trinamool Congress led by Mamata Banarjee at a function held in West Bengal.
