Religious tourism

An economic survey report has made a big disclosure on the economics of Prayagraj Maha Kumbh and the increasing religious tourism in the country. In the first two days of Prayagraj Maha Kumbh, about 4 crore devotees have taken a dip at the confluence of the holy Ganga, Yamuna and Saraswati. It is estimated that in the coming 50 days, about 40 crore people will mark their presence in the Maha Kumbh of Prayagraj. The report shows that due to this, revenue of four lakh crore rupees will be generated. This figure is very shocking. The Uttar Pradesh government has kept a budget of Rs 8000 crore for the success of Maha Kumbh, most of which has also been spent in preparation.

Now if the Uttar Pradesh government gets 10 percent tax in the revenue of 4 lakh crore, that means the government earns Rs 40,000 crore. Obviously, no industry in the world can pay such a huge tax to the government in a period of just one and a half months. Apart from this, about 2 lakh people will get direct and indirect employment. Small traders and hawkers will earn so much in just 50-55 days that they can survive for the whole year. According to this report, Maha Kumbh was held in Allahabad in 2013. The budget for it was 1200 crores. Whereas the revenue generated was 12000 crores. Similarly, 16 crore people came to visit the newly built Ram temple in Ayodhya in a year. Due to this, a revenue of 80,000 crores was generated in Ayodhya in a single year.

The Uttar Pradesh government collected 8000 crores rupees in the form of direct tax. Whereas due to GST and other indirect taxes, the central and state governments got hundreds of crores of rupees separately. Apart from this, about 30,000 people are getting permanent employment and 50,000 other people are getting temporary employment. Actually, due to the Ram temple in Ayodhya, relitremendously. Scientists Say Earth's Mantle Is Split Into Two Halves

A new study reveals that Earth's mantle is divided by the Pacific Ring of Fire, a geological scar reflecting the formation and breakup of the supercontinent Pangaea.

One of Earth's regions, known as the African domain, encompasses most of the planet's landmass. It extends from the east coasts of Asia and Australia, across Europe, Africa, and the Atlantic, to the west coast of North America. In contrast, the Pacific

domain primarily covers the Pacific Ocean. According to new research, the mantle beneath the African domain contains a greater diversity of elements and isotopes compared to the Pacific domain.

This distribution reflects the last two supercontinent cycles over the past billion years, explained Luc Doucet, a senior research fellow in Earth and planetary sciences at Curtin University, in an interview with Live Science. During this period, two supercontinents emerged: Rodinia, which formed approximately 1.2 billion years ago and broke apart about 750 million years ago, and Pangaea, which formed around 335 million years ago and began breaking up 200 million years ago. "What we observe today is essentially the result of transitions from Rodinia to Pangaea, followed by the breakup of Pangaea," Doucet noted. Both supercontinents formed over what is now the African domain. As oceans closed between landmasses, the oceanic crust was forced beneath the continents in a process called subduction, occasionally dragging pieces of continental rock into the mantle.

The significance of Mahakumbh is magnified as it provides a sacred space for deep contemplation on these pillars, ensuring their harmonious progression.

150 years of India Meteorological Department

Sir, The Prime Minister on the 150th anniversary of the India Meteorological Department (IMD), has targeted zero-error weather forecasting up to three days, and 90 per cent accuracy in forecasting up to five days by 2047. The IMD's aim is zero loss of life by 2047 for all types of severe weather events by enabling disaster managers, stakeholders, and the general public to take early action fol-

lowing early accurate warning.

The IMD, the nations weather life line institution established in 1875 by the British government to centralize weather data collection in India is one of the oldest meteorological department in the world and as had a steady growth and in recent years progressed by leaps and bounds. An institution that got established to predict and collect climatic conditions and calculations after a cyclone that struck Kolkata in 1864 and a famine that hit Odisha in 1866 has now now taken the role of a saviour not only for India but the whole of South Asian region giving timely warnings of weather changes and also plays a fundamental role in disaster risk reduction by protecting communities from extreme weather events. Its expertise also supports key sectors such as agriculture, water resource management, energy, tourism, aviation, and public health

On this historic occasion, the PM launched 'Mission Mausam,' an initiative aimed at transforming India into a 'Weather-ready and Climate-smart' nation through advanced weather surveillance technologies, high-resolution atmospheric observations, next-generation radars, satellites, and high-performance computing systems. OnePlus 13 vs iQOO 13: Which Snapdragon 8 Elite-powered phone should you buy?

Cheaper isn't always better, and neither is the most expensive option. The OnePlus 13 (review) and iQOO 13 (review) are currently two of the hottest contenders in the high-performance Android smartphone space. Powered by the Snapdragon 8 Elite chip, these devices offer topnotch performance, premium design, and excellent camera capabilities. However, with a price difference of Rs 10,000, these two smartphones cater to different types of users.



The iQOO 13 and OnePlus 13 feature 2K-resolution screens that are sharp, colour-accurate, and bright. However, the iQOO 13 has a flat display with a higher refresh rate of 144Hz, but can only be unlocked in gaming mode. In contrast, the OnePlus 13 features an advanced quad-curved 120Hz display that combines the practicality of a flat screen with the premium aesthetic of a curved display. For gamers, the iQOO 13 might be more appealing, while for everyday use, the OnePlus 13 has a slight edge.

Both the iQOO 13 and the OnePlus 13 sport a triple 50 MP camera setup, but the tuning makes a difference. The iQOO 13 includes a 2x telephoto lens, whereas the OnePlus 13 offers a 3x telephoto lens. Additionally, the OnePlus 13 benefits from Hasselblad tuning, giving it the upper hand in terms of overall camera performance.

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
