National Voters Day will be observed today

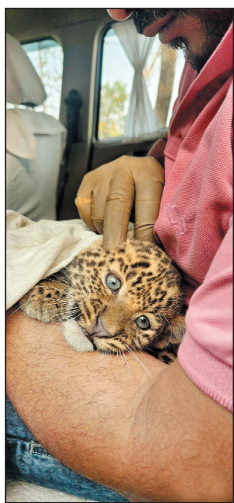

In the three-day period, Raj Bhavan entry has been fixed from Gate No. 2. Exit of visitors will also be from Gate No. 2. Parking of vehicles of visitors coming to visit Raj Bhavan will be done in Minto Hall premises.



Additional Chief Secretary to the Governor KC Gupta said that citizens will be allowed to visit Raj Bhavan from 2 pm to 7 pm on 25 and 27 January and from 11 am to 2 pm on Republic Day, 26 January. The tour route for visiting Raj Bhavan will start with entry from Gate No. 2 during the

period fixed for visiting. On this route, there will be Uphaar Gallery located in Sandipani Auditorium, exhibition based on Art and Calligraphy in Constitution, introduction exhibition of prominent personalities of Constituent Assembly and personalities of Madhya Pradesh in Constituent Assembly.
