# Youth commits suicide 3 days before anniversary

**Bhopal:** In a heartbreaking turn of events, a man in Bhopal has died by suicide, just three days before his wedding anniversary. The 34-year-old, identified as Ravi Jadoun, was found hanging from a ceiling fan in his residence in the Aishbagh area. His wife was away in Vidisha, at-

tending a relative's wedding, when the tragic incident occurred. Ravi, who had been working as a delivery boy for a courier company in Bhopal for the past decade, was alone at home on Tuesday night. He used a gamchha (traditional towel) to end his life. The police were alerted to the scene and conducted a forensic examination, but no suicide note was recovered. The circumstances surrounding Ravi's death remain unclear. His wife had recently given birth to a baby girl nine months ago, adding to the mystery. The police have registered a case and are investigating the matter further. This incident has left family and friends in shock and mourning. The investigation is ongoing, and authorities are working to determine the reasons behind this tragic suicide.

# 8th grade student found hanging in hostel

► Father suspects foul play

**Bhopal:** A 14-year-old student of St. Joseph School, Vansh Kushwaha, was found hanging in his hostel room in Tara Sevaniya on Tuesday evening. While police suspect suicide, Vansh's father, Santosh Kushwaha, insists his son couldn't have taken his own life. "He was brave and had big dreams—something is wrong," he said.

The incident occurred around 7:30 PM, shortly after Vansh returned from his yoga class. He was found hanging by a towel tied to the window. On Wednesday afternoon, Parvaliya police handed over the body to the family after a post-mortem examination.

## Mysterious note & no suspicious activity in CCTV footage

During a search of the room, police discovered a torn notebook page with a cryptic message in English:

"What will happen in my life ahead? I don't understand anything. How can someone cheat like this? However, no one is at fault. Everyone is good. I don't know what will happen next."

Handwriting experts are verifying if the note was written by Vansh.

CCTV footage from the hostel shows no suspicious activity. Vansh was last seen filling a water bottle after returning from yoga. His roommates had gone to the mess for dinner, and when they returned, he was found hanging.
