Visakhapatnam (Andhra Pradesh): Following Delhi Capitals' (DC) victory over Sunrisers Hyderabad (SRH), captain Axar Patel expressed happiness over pacer Mitchell Starc's five-wicket haul and shared the franchise's plans for their upcoming matches at their primary home venue, Arun Jaitley Stadium.

A crucial 77-run partnership between Aniket Verma (74 off 41 balls, with five fours and six sixes) and Heinrich Klaasen (32 off 19 balls, with two fours and two sixes) helped SRH recover. However, Kuldeep Yadav (3/22) and Starc (5/35) dismantled the batting lineup, bundling SRH out for 163 in 18.4 overs.
