Eurasian Vulture released in Sarar Beat of Raisen



Bhopal: A Eurasian Vulture was successfully released near Halali Dam in Sarar Beat, Raisen Forest Division, on Saturday. Rescued from Satna Forest Division, the vulture was treated at the Mukundpur Rescue Center and Van Vihar before its release upon

recovery.

Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Rajesh Khare, highlighted the region's favorable conditions for vultures, emphasizing the area's suitability for their rehabilitation. He announced plans to establish a

"vulture restaurant" in Sarar Beat, aimed at supporting the species' recovery. In the coming days, six more vultures from Bhopal's Vulture Breeding Center will also be released in the area.

Aseem Shrivastava, Principal Chief Forest Conservator, addressed the significant decline in vulture populations due to harmful veterinary medicines, including Diclofenac and Nimesulide. These medicines, now banned due to their lethal effects on vultures, are a key focus of ongoing conservation efforts.

Chief Wildlife Conservator Shubhranjan Sen assured that employees were trained on the harmful effects of these substances, and proper precautions would be taken to protect the vultures.

The release event was attended by officials from Bhopal, Raisen, Vidisha, along with representatives from WWF and BNHS, marking a significant step in vulture conservation efforts.

MP Pollution Control Board to launch awareness campaign

Bhopal: In a significant step towards controlling the air pollution caused by stubble burning, the Madhya Pradesh Pollution Control Board has decided to implement a series of actions. During a meeting of the Board's governing body, an in-depth discussion was held regarding the pollution caused by the burning of paddy and wheat stubble post-harvest. Several crucial decisions were made to tackle this issue.

The meeting was chaired by Dr. Navneet Mohan Kothari, Principal Secretary and Chairman of the Department, who instructed the launch of a comprehensive awareness campaign to prevent stubble burning by farmers across the state. Dr. Kothari emphasized that the campaign would be conducted through print, electronic, and social media platforms, particularly targeting rural areas. A budget of ₹8 crore has been approved for the initiative.

Chief Minister inaugurates hospital in Badnagar

▶ Govt to provide grants to private hospitals to promote medical tourism

Bhopal: Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav stated that doctors hold the highest place in society and that medical service is the greatest service to humanity. He urged all doctors to always uphold compassion, empathy, and humanity in their hearts. Dr. Yadav announced that to promote medical tourism in Madhya Pradesh, the state government will provide grants to private hospitals and large medical groups.

Financial assistance will also be given to pri-

ivate efforts promoting wellness centers, naturopathy centers, and Ayurvedic (AYUSH) treatments. The government is also encouraging the establishment of cow shelters (Gaushalas).

The Chief Minister was speaking at the inauguration of Kabra Hospital and Research Center in Badnagar, Ujjain district, on Sunday. Present at the event were Saint Pandit Kamal Kishore Nagar Maharaj, MP Anil Firojiya, BJP National Organization Secretary Shiv Prakash,

District In-charge Minister Gautam Tetwal, Badnagar MLA Jitendra Singh Pandya, Nagda MLA Dr. Tej Bahadur Singh, hospital director Dr. Vasudev Kabra, and other public representatives.

Dr. Yadav mentioned that a cement plant worth ₹3,500 crore is being established in Badnagar with the state government's initiative, which will create employment opportunities and boost the industrial development of the region.

Only 25% students could reach internship in BU job fair

Bhopal: A job fair was organized in Barkatullah University, in which about 25% students could reach interview and internship. They still haven't got a job. Due to this, questions have started being raised on the study system and quality of education of BU. The job fair was organized by BU and the employment office. 56 reputed companies participated in the job fair, which included major institutions like banks, LIC and Directorate of Agricultural Engineering. Apart from the teaching department (UTD) of BU, students of more than 400 colleges affiliated to BU also registered their presence in the organized job fair. About two thousand students had registered themselves in the fair. In the fair, various companies selected only 25% students and decided to call them for interview.
