

Dalit youth shot dead in Morena during Ambedkar Jayanti Rally

Congress slams BJP for “caste-backed violence”

Bhopal/Morena: A peaceful Ambedkar Jayanti procession in Hingona village, Morena, turned tragic when a Dalit youth, Sanjay Semil, was shot dead following a dispute over DJ music. The accused are reportedly supporters of state agriculture minister Aidal Singh Kansana, as alleged by the victim's father, Chimbhan Singh. Two more Dalit youths were also injured in the incident. The killing has triggered a political storm. Madhya Pradesh Congress president Jitu Patwari, after speaking with the victim's family via video call, condemned the incident, calling it “another horrifying example of BJP's casteist mindset.” Patwari labeled the murder as “not an isolated event, but part of a pattern of atrocities under BJP rule.”



Citing NCRB 2022 data, Patwari claimed Madhya Pradesh ranks third in crimes against Dalits, with 3,876 registered cases and a 4.2% year-on-year increase. He also referenced past caste-

based violence in Sagar and Chhatrapur, and recent temple entry denial to a Dalit groom near Ambedkar Nagar (Mhow) as further proof of “institutionalized discrimination.”

“Why is the PM silent?": Patwari

Patwari questioned Prime Minister Modi's silence, stating: “If BJP truly believes in ‘Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas,’ why does caste violence thrive under their rule?” He accused BJP of harboring “hatred for Dalits, Ambedkar, and the Constitution.”

Announcing his visit to Morena, Patwari demanded a high-level probe, immediate arrests, and a fast-track trial. He reaffirmed Congress's commitment to fight caste atrocities: “This is not just a fight for social justice, but a battle to defend the Constitution and democracy itself.”

Telemedicine services should be effectively used: Shukla



Bhopal: Deputy Chief Minister Rajendra Shukla said that telemedicine services should be effectively used at sub health centers and community health centers to provide expert consultation facilities to citizens living in rural and remote areas at their nearest health center.

So that the facility of expert consultation can be made available in remote areas. Shukla re-

viewed various departmental subjects in the ministry and gave necessary instructions.

Complete the works under PM-Abhiman Yojana

Shukla conducted a comprehensive review of the ongoing works under the Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission. He said that the works should be completed within

the stipulated time limit, so that the expansion of health services is possible soon.

Shukla said that timely registration and ANC check-up of every pregnant woman should be ensured. High risk pregnancy should be identified on time so that safe delivery and better monitoring of the newborn can be ensured. He directed that there should be no negligence at any level in maternal and child health services. Deputy CM Shukla reviewed Matri Shishu Sanjeevan Mission and Anmol 2.0.

Shukla reviewed the implementation of Ayushman Bharat Yojana. He said that it should be ensured that the beneficiaries get high quality medical services easily. He asked to complete the process of Ayushman empanelment on priority.

Anand Grams will be built to bring happiness to people: Gangrade

Bhopal: State Anand Sansthan Director Praveen Kumar Gangrade said that to bring happiness in the lives of people, as many Anand Grams as possible should be established at the village level. He said this in a review meeting of Anand Club members, Anandam associates and Anandaks held in Khar-gone. Director Gangrade said that the activities of the Anand Department in Khar-gone district are commendable, but there are still more possibilities. He appealed to connect others with the Anand Sansthan while being happy himself. He especially described the role of Happiness Volunteers as important for taking activities like Anand, Alpaviram to every village.

Construction of overbridge between Ashima Mall and Bawadia Kalan from June

Krishna Gaur expressed displeasure over officials who were negligent

Bhopal: Minister of State for Backward Classes and Minority Welfare (Independent Charge) Smt. Krishna Gaur on Tuesday reviewed the construction work going on in Govindpura area with various departments in the ministry. Expressing displeasure over the delay in construction work and careless officials, she directed to work within the time limit.

Gaur said that to provide relief to the common people from the traffic problem, an



overbridge will be built between Ashima Mall and Bawadia Kalan. Lakhs of people who commute daily

will get the benefit of this. The tender for the construction of the overbridge will be issued this week and its con-

struction work will be started in the month of June. Minister of State Smt. Gaur has also given instructions to install traffic signals on the Bavadia Bridge, this will provide relief to the residents from long jams.

Krishna Gaur said that the officials of PWD department should complete this work soon by coordinating with the officials of BHEL for the repair of roads in BHEL area. On the long delay in the construction work of the

road being built near MGM School Ayadhpuri, she said that negligence in road construction work will not be tolerated. She directed the officials to complete the road construction work as soon as possible.

Minister of State Mrs. Gaur has also directed to complete the construction work of 4 km long drain from Piplani to Khajuri Kalan before the rains. She asked to complete the incomplete construction work of about 5 km road being built from Anand Nagar to Transport Nagar as soon as possible.

Police personnel felicitated



Bhopal: The United Malayalee Association (UMA) felicitated the police personnel of Misrod Thana for their commendable efforts in tracing a missing boy from Kerala and reuniting him with his family.

The boy, Vishal Manikandan, who is mentally unstable, had gone missing from his home on 2nd April 2025. A missing person complaint was lodged by his parents at the Ernakulam Police Sta-

tion. On 9th April, the Misrod Police found Vishal near a showroom and brought him to the police station. Due to his mental condition and difficulty in communication, the police contacted the President of the United Malayalee Association for assistance in finding parents.

Considering Vishal's abnormal behavior and the challenges in keeping him at a regular facility,

the Association arranged for his stay at Karuna Sadan, Idgah Hills. During this period, the police provided continuous support and security, as the boy repeatedly attempted to escape.

The next day, Mr. Manikandan, Vishal's father, a retired Govt. Officer arrived and the boy was safely reunited with his family. The family, who had been frantically searching for him, felt immense relief and gratitude upon finding him safe.

As a token of appreciation, members of the United Malayalee Association visited Misrod Thana and felicitated the police personnel involved in the operation. O.D. Joseph, President of UMA, stated,

“This act of cooperation and compassion reflects the high standards of professionalism and humanitarian spirit displayed by the Misrod Police. Their timely and sensitive response not only brought comfort to a distressed family but also reinforced our faith in the vital role of the police in serving the public with empathy.”

Case filed against MLA's son and eight others in Dewas temple assault case

Priest's family expresses satisfaction

Dewas: A violent incident at the revered Mata Tekri temple has ignited political and social tension in Madhya Pradesh. The case, which had been simmering for days, escalated after police filed an FIR late Monday night against Rudraksh Shukla, son of Indore-3 BJP MLA Golu Shukla, and eight others for allegedly assaulting priest Updeshnath and creating a ruckus at the temple.

Based on CCTV footage and the detailed statement given by the priest, the police acted swiftly. SP Puneet Gehlod confirmed that nine individuals, including Aman Shukla, Honey, Lokesh Chandwani, Manish Tejwani,

Aniruddh Singh Panwar, and Jeetu Raghuvanshi, have been booked under multiple sections of the IPC. The footage shows a group of 25-30 people, indicating more names may be added to the FIR.

The priest's family has expressed satisfaction over the prompt police action, saying it has renewed their faith in justice.

Political tempers flare

The incident has quickly taken a political turn. Former minister Sajjan Singh Verma visited the temple, washed the priest's feet with Ganga water, and lashed out at the BJP, stating, “Aurangzeb broke

temples, today some people are acting like ‘Hindu Aurangzeb’ by disrespecting holy places.”

Former CM Digvijaya Singh also weighed in, alleging that Rudraksh visited the temple “drunk, exposing BJP's true respect for religion.”

BJP hits back

In response, BJP MLA Rajesh Sonkar accused Verma of political drama, saying, “He must apologize for insulting saints like Dharendra Shastri and Pradeep Mishra. Now he's speaking Aurangzeb's language.”

The investigation is ongoing. Authorities have heightened security in Dewas to maintain law and order around the temple and prevent further unrest.

Umang Singhar demands Live Telecast of MP Assembly proceedings

Calls it a constitutional right

Bhopal: Leader of Opposition Umang Singhar has once again stirred the debate on transparency in governance by demanding the live broadcast of Madhya Pradesh Assembly proceedings. Taking to social media, Singhar questioned why the state assembly continues to function behind closed doors when the Lok Sabha and several other state assemblies already telecast their sessions live.

Singhar emphasized that this is not a privilege, but a constitutional right of the people. “The Assembly is the temple of public expectations. Every word spoken here is said in the name of the



people—so why should it remain hidden from them?” he wrote. Raising a pointed challenge to the ruling BJP

government, he asked, “Is the government afraid that if the proceedings are made public, citizens will know who speaks for them, who asks real questions, and who dodges accountability?” He argued that citizens have the right to witness whether their elected representatives are truly raising public concerns or merely playing politics within the Assembly walls. “When Parliament and multiple state legislatures already allow live telecasts, what is stopping Madhya Pradesh?”

Calling it a step toward democratic transparency, Singhar reiterated that live telecast is not a matter of convenience but a public right rooted in the spirit of accountability and open governance.
