Three killed in road accident in Bihar

Chapra: At least three people were killed in separate accidents at different places in Scran district of Pilota Palica sources and trict of Bihar. Police sources said here on Tuesday that Naitik Kumar (02), son of Chandan Kumar, died after being hit by an uncontrolled e-rickshaw in Ami Chauhan Patti village of Dighwara police station area. The villagers handed over the e-rick-shaw driver to police. Sources said Shyam Kishore Singh (38), son of Awadhesh Singh, a resident of Chandpatti Thahara village, was hit by an unknown vehicle and was killed near Haranbagha Dhala on National Highway 722 in the Maker police station area of the district.

Three killed, 20 Injured in accident in Maharashtra

Buldhana: At least three persons were killed and 20 injured in a collision between a Madhya Pradesh Transport Corporation Bus and a brick-laden truck on Tuesday. According to the sources, the accident took place on the Khamgaon–Nandura road in Vidharbha region of Maharashtra. The collision was so severe that the front portions of both truck and bus were badly damaged. According to eyewit-nesses, both truck and bus were travelling at high speed at the time of the incident. The critically injured were hospitalised in Akola.

Two nabbed in Manipur

Imphal: Two militants were apprehended by security forces in the last 24 hours. Police said on Tuesday that an active cadre of PREPAK (Pro) was nabbed frim Ningthoukhong Kha Khunou Ward No. 4 under Bishnupur-PS, Bishnupur District. From his possession, large numbers of empty cases were recovered from him. Another cadre of the same outfit was nabbed from Bidya Nagar under Jiribam-PS, Jiribam District.

Three of a family electrocuted in TN

Chennai: Three members of a family died of electrocution in the southern Virudhunagar district of Tamil Nadu on Monday evening. Police said Tirupathi (28), a mike set owner, was tying a loudspeaker in connection with a temple festival at Kaariseri village, when the wire he was connecting to it came into contact with a electric transformer. His wife Lalitha (25) and Grandmother Bagyam (65), who tried to save him, also suffered shock and died on the spot. Two people, Kavin and Dharmar, who tried to save them suffered injuries and were admitted to hospital. Police have registered a case and are investigating.

NIA chargesheets 4 more in Nettaru murder case

Bengaluru: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Tuesday chargesheeted four more people, including three absconders, in connection with the brutal 2022 murder of BJP Yuva Morcha member Praveen Nettaru by cadres of the banned Popular Front of India (PFI), the agency said on Monday. With the filing of this second supplementary chargesheet, the total number of accused chargesheeted in the case has risen to 27, including six who remain absconding. The four named in the latest chargesheet are Abdul Nasir, Naushad, Abdul Rahaman and Ateeq Ahmed. Among them, Nasir, Naushad and Rahaman are still on the run.

Supreme Court slams UP Govt over child trafficking

Orders Fast-Track trials across India



New Delhi (UNI)

While criticising the Uttar Pradesh government's handling of child trafficking cases, the Supreme Court on Tuesday laid down stringent guidelines for the prevention and expedited trial of such offences across the country.

A bench comprising Justice J.B. Pardiwala and Justice R. Mahadevan directed that all High Courts call for the status of pending child trafficking cases from trial courts and issue directions to ensure that trials are

concluded within six months. The top court also mandated that such cases be heard on a day-to-day

basis to prevent delays in justice. The court's strong observations came while hearing a case involving a trafficked newborn who was al legedly sold to a couple in Uttar Pradesh for Rs 4 lakh. The couple re portedly desired a male child and

knowingly accepted the stolen baby.
While cancelling the anticipatory bail granted to the accused, the Supreme Court criticized the Allahabad High Court and the Uttar Pradesh police for their lax approach. "This is a case of cancellation of anticipatory bail, but we delved into the larger issue of child trafficking, Justice Pardiwala remarked.

Assam govt makes Assamese compulsory official language across state except Barak Valley, BTR districts

Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Tuesday announced that Assamese will be the compulsory official language for all government notifications, orders, acts, etc. across Assam, while Bengali and Bodo will be used respectively in the districts of Barak Valley and Bodoland Territorial Region (BTR).
This decision will come into force

from today, i.e. April 15.

CM Sarma took to social media post on X to make this announce-

"Beginning this Bohag, Assamese will be the compulsory official language for all government notifications, orders, acts, etc, across Assam. In the districts of Barak Valley and BTR, Bengali and Bodo languages



shall be used respectively," Himanta Biswa Sarma wrote in a social media

According to the official notification of the Assam Government, the tives to implement Assamese as the

official language of the state, as per the Assam Official Language Act, 1960. According to the Act, Assamese will be used alongside English in all official works. This move aims to promote the use of local languages in government offices and enhance administrative efficiency.

"In exercise of the powers conferred under section 7 read with section 3 of the Assam Official Language Act, 1960 (Assam Act No. XXXIII of 1960) the Governor of Assam is hereby pleased to make the following directions for the use of Assamese as the Official Language in the state of Assam and use of local languages in the Barak Valley, Hill Districts, and the Bodoland Territorial Region (BTR) under the Sixth Schedule areas," the official notification reads.

setback for CM Siddaramaiah

In a major setback to Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, a special court for people's representatives in Bengaluru on Tuesday allowed the Lokayukta police to continue their investigation into the controversial Mysore Urban Development Authority (MUDA) land

The court also stayed its ruling on a petition filed by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) challenging the closure report submitted by the Karnataka Lokayukta police.

The ED, alongside the complainant, activist Snehamayi Krishna, raised objections to the report, urging a more comprehensive inves-

The court set the next hearing for



May 7, when it will decide on the closure report following the submission of a full investigation report by the

Lokayukta police. During the proceedings, presiding judge Santosh Gajanan Bhat not-

ed that the scope of the inquiry

should not be limited to the four individuals initially named but should extend to all parties implicated in

The case revolves around allega-tions of corruption in land allotment by MUDA, with Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and his family at the centre of the controversy.

Earlier this year, the Lokayukta police submitted a preliminary report clearing Siddaramaiah, his wife Parvati, and others of any criminal wrongdoing, stating that there was insufficient evidence to proceed

with prosecution. However, the closure report has now been challenged by both the ED and Krishna, who argue that key as pects of the case were overlooked or inadequately investigated.

SP will be wiped out in 2027 assembly polls: Keshav Maurya

Uttar Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Keshav Prasad Maurya on Tuesday claimed that the Samajwadi Party (SP) will be wiped out in the Assembly elections 2027.

Before leaving for Lucknow, the Deputy CM met party officials and workers at the Circuit House and advised them to strongly join the preparations for the upcoming dis-trict panchayat and assembly elec-

tions to be held in 2027. He said that SP chief Akhilesh is nervous due to the fear of his party being wiped out in the Assembly elections 2027.

"Due to this, he is making a malicious attempt to break the social fabric by making baseless statements," he said.

Maurya said that the BJP is doing positive work very seriously on the mantra of 'Sabka Šaath, Sabka Vikas'



under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, whereas the SP always believes in 'development of its family with the support of some'.
"The SP has never liked the develop-

ment of the poor, backward, and Dalits," he claimed.

He said that it is certain that this policy of his (Akhilesh) will prove to

be Bhasmasur for his party.
"The historic public support received by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on the birth anniversary of Baba Saheb Dr Bhimrao Ambedkar on Monday is also not being digested by the SP. It has lost its digestion. The fake PDA balloon of the SP has burst. Despite this bitter truth, it is still far away from the ground reality," he

In an attack on the Congress, the Deputy CM said that the history of politics is a witness that the Congress itself has been punctured by doing the politics of Muslim appeasement

for decades. "The truth is that there is no other way left for them except to drag themselves on the crutches of re-

gional parties. Despite all this, their arrogance is as if the burden of the country is on them. Despite being in the opposition, their behaviour is

like that of the ruling party," he said. "The only change in its history is that now it has abandoned 'Gandhi's Khadi' and has started wearing 'T-shirts'.
