Divisional review meeting of Public Relations Department held

Officers were also encouraged to engage with beneficiaries of government schemes to document and share their success stories. MP on high alert after Pahalgam terror attack

- Intelligence agencies closely monitoring suspicious activities
- MP considered a safe haven for sleeper cells

Bhopal: In the wake of the recent terrorist attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, Madhya Pradesh is on high alert. Intelligence agencies have ramped up surveillance following key inputs, monitoring every suspicious activity across the state. Although no major terrorist incidents have occurred in the region, several terrorist networks have been uncovered in recent years, leading to the establishment of the NIA office in

Tight security at Railway Stations: Following the Pahalgam attack, the state's police and investigative agencies have become more vigilant. Security has been heightened at public places, including railway stations and trains. In response to intelligence inputs, the state has intensified its counter-terror measures. Rahul Lodha, the SP for Railways, stated that strict surveillance is being maintained at all stations to ensure safety.

checks Additional forces have been deployed at stations and their surroundings. Dog squads are conducting checks, while track monitoring ensures smooth rail operations. CCTV cameras are also being used extensively to monitor suspicious activities, with thorough checks of both luggage and individuals.

MP's terror track record: Over the three years, Pradesh's security agencies have arrested terrorists from groups such as JMB, HUJI, IM, and PFI, with links to Pakistan and Bangladesh. These organizations aimed to radicalize youth. Earlier, agencies had uncovered the activities of outfits like SUF, SIMI, and ISIS. In 2015, the NIA detained six members of SUF in Ratlam, highlighting the ongoing threat of terrorism in the region.

Hamidia Hospital installing CT scan and MRI Machines

Bhopal: In compliance with the Na tional Medical Council (NMC) regulations, medical colleges are required to manage and operate CT scan and MRI services. In line with this, Hamidia Hospital, affiliated with Gandhi Medical College, is set to take charge of operating both services. The installation of a 6-crore CT scan machine has already begur in Block 1 of Hamidia Hospital, and it is expected to be fully operational within seven days. Both CT and MR services will be available at the nev location by April.

Patients Will Save Time and Effort

The new machines are being installed on the ground floor, offering improved accessibility. Currently the CT and MRI services are being operated under a private partner-ship model in the old building. As a result, patients have to walk 700 meters under the scorching sun or be transported by stretcher or wheelchair. Once the new machines are up and running, this inconvenience will be significantly reduced. Additionally, the 12-crore MRI machine is still awaited, and its installation will further enhance the hospital's diagnostic capabilities, ensuring a smoother experience for patients.

Bike rider falls after hitting divider

Crushed by another vehicle

Bhopal: In Misrod area, a bike rider collided with a divider. As soon as he fell on the road, a heavy vehicle crushed him. The youth died on the spot in the accident. The accused driver fled from the spot. Police has sent the body for postmortem. The accident happened late on Thursday night.

According to the information, Avinash Thakur (36), resident of Obedullaganj, used to run a fabrication shop on 80 Feet Road Ashoka Garden. On Thursday night at around eight o'clock, he closed the shop and left for home on his bike. Avinash reached near Éleven Mile on Hoshangabad Road, when suddenly his bike went out of control, due to which he fell on the road along with the bike after hitting the divider. As soon as Avinash fell on the road, an unknown high-speed vehicle coming from behind crushed him. The wheel of the car passed through his head, due to which he died

Youth injured in the accident died

Meanwhile, according to Chunabhatti police, Ashish Das, son of Sanjay Kumar Das (34), was a resident of Seoni Malwa district Hoshangabad. Ashish's elder brother Ajay Kumar Das lives in Saumya Park Land Colony in Awadhpuri and does a private job. On Wednesday morning, Ashish Das left on his bike to go to his brother in Bhopal. At around 9:30 in the morning, Ashish was going towards Chunabhatti from Kaliyasot Dam Road. He was hit by an unknown vehicle near Bansal Hospital, due to which he was seriously injured. Passersby admitted him to Bansal Hospital for treatment. Ashish Das died during treat-

Fire engulfs WALMI Hills near Kaliasot Dam, trees destroyed Affected area is a tiger movement and biodiversity heritage site

Bhopal: A fire broke out on the WALMI hill near Kaliasot Dam in Bhopal at around 6 pm on Thursday evening. The fire engulfed the hill in no time. The flames reached the government residences located in WALMI. Due to this 8 houses had to be evacuated.

The flames were controlled late at night. Smoke was coming out from 6 to 7 places at around 10 am on Friday. As a precaution, the fire brigade and forest department team are on the spot. Officials say that there is no danger of fire at the moment. After the fire, MLA Rameshwar Sharma, Collector Kaushalendra Vikram Singh, DFO Lokpriya Bharti, Municipal Corporation Commissioner Harendra Narayan, SDM Ravishankar Rai also reached the spot.



Passers-by saw the smoke rising. Seeing the flames and smoke rising on the hill, passers-by informed the fire control room. After this, fire engines reached the spot and started controlling the fire. Due to trees, bushes and uneven road, the fire was not controlled quickly. There are also reports of some employees getting minor burns while extinguishing the fire. Fire brought under control: DFO

DFO Bharti himself went into the forest with the staff to extin-

guish the fire. He said that the fire has been brought under control Forest department ranger Shivpal Piparde said, by 12 o'clock at night, the fire has been brought under control to a large extent. We are constantly monitoring it.

Biodiversity heritage site

Notably, this affected forest area had recently received government designation as a biodiversity heritage site. It spans about 100 hectares across Chandanpura and Damkheda villages near Kaliasot Dam, as biodiversity heritage site. These hills, currently within the WALMI campus premises, became the epicentre of this fire incident.
