RPF cracks down on AIIMS Bhopal organizes BLS training session for nurses 4 transgender

Accused of harassing and extorting passengers at Bhopal Railway Station

Bhopal: In a decisive move to ensure passenger safety, the Railway Protection Force (RPF) at Bhopal Railway Station apprehended four transgender involved in forcibly extorting money from passengers aboard trains. The action was taken following a passenger complaint about harassment during a journey on Train No. 12534 Pushpak Express. On the night of May 8 at 9:40 PM, during routine checks in Sleeper Coach Š-3 on platforms 2 and 3, the RPF found the accused clapping loudly, intimidating travelers, and extorting money. Passengers stated that when they refused to pay, they were threatened with violence, creating panic and chaos in the coach. The individuals arrested — Shamim Sheikh, Sonam Sharma (20), Shivani Tiwari (22), and Maya Kumari (21) — all residents of Karond, Nishatpura (Bhopal), were found without tick-



ets or valid authorization to be in the station premises. They have been booked under Sections 145 (unruly behavior on railway property), 154 (intimidation of passengers), and 137 (traveling without a ticket) of the Railway Act. The swift operation was led by ASI Raghvendra Singh, Head Constable Vishnu

Prasad Badhaiya, and Constable Lalit Vishwakarma. Senior Divisional Security Commissioner Prashant Yadav emphasized a zero-tolerance policy against such acts and confirmed ongoing efforts to ensure a safe, secure environment for rail passengers across

Auto driver dies of suicide by hanging

Takes this step under influence of alcohol

Bhopal: In Ratibad area, an auto driver committed suicide by hanging himself in his house in the early hours of Friday. He had returned home after drinking alcohol late at night. The police have registered a case and started investigation. After the postmortem, the body has been handed over to the family. According to the police, Ranjeet Singh, son of Kamal Singh (35), a resident of Pooja Colony, was an auto driver. He was addicted to drinking alcohol. Due to a dispute, his wife lives separately with her children in Nishatpura and works. Ranjeet reached home late Thursday night in an inebriated state. On Friday early morning, the family saw the body hanging from the noose and informed the police. The police sent the body for postmortem. Investigation revealed that he had taken the auto on installments, and had also taken loans from some people. He was unable to pay the installments. In such a situation, he was worried. Police suspect that he committed suicide due to depression.

Youth succumbed to poisonous substance in Eitkhedi: In a separate incident, a youth died of suicide by consuming poisonous substance. Sanjay Sahu (30), son of Bhur Singh, resident of Raipur village Intkhedi used to work as a laborer. On Thursday night, he consumed poisonous substance at home. Seeing him vomiting, the family took him to the hospital where he died during treatment late at night. Sanjay was unmarried, the reason for suicide could not be revealed due to non-availability of suicide note.

The reg istration window will close at 12 PM, while the payment portal will remain open until 3 PM Choice filling for preferred courses and colleges will be available from May 14 to May 18, with a choice-locking window on May 18 from 4 PM to 11:55 PM. Seat allotment for Round 1 will take place on May 19 and 20, and selected candidates must report to their allotted institutions between May 22 and May 26 for admission formalities and document verification. The NEET SS 2025 results were announced on April 25, covering 15 subject groups, including specialized fields like Critical Care Medicine and Medical Oncology, newly introduced this year. Bhopal – "Tribal art and culture are so vast, they cannot be fully understood in a single lifetime," said Dr. Vasant Nirgune, retired Survey Officer from the Madhya Pradesh Adivasi Lok Kala Parisȟad, at a thought-provoǩing seminar titled "Tribal Art in the Context of Design" at NIFT Bhopal. Dr. Nirgune, a respected educationist and cultural philosopher, emphasized that tribal communities draw knowledge and creativity directly from nature and life, rather than formal institutions. "Every tribal group has a distinct artistic identity rooted in cave art traditions like Bhimbetka," he explained, adding that their cultural expressions—be it lanexplained, adding that their cultural expressions—be it language, music, or design—are unique and never imitated across tribes. The seminar brought together experts including B.R. Satpute (Tribal Research & Development Institute), Dr. Archana Jain (Jinshakh Enterprises), and Deepa Dixit (Ragini Foundation), along with NIFT Bhopal faculty Dr. Anupam Saxena, Dr. Latika Bhatt, and Ms. Supriya Yadav. Man sentenced to jail for attacking woman in her Home

Bhopal: A Bhopal court has delivered a decisive verdict, sentencing Yogesh Yaday to a total of one year and six months of rigorous imprisonment along with a fine of Rs 2,000 for forcibly entering a woman's home and assaulting her with a stick. The judgment, pronounced by Judicial Magistrate First Class Rahul Singh Yadav on May 9, 2025, found Yadav guilty under Sections 452 (house-trespass after preparation for hurt) and 323 (voluntarily causing hurt) of the Indian Penal

The incident, which occurred on January 18, 2024, saw Yadav barging into the victim's residence in the Pipilani police station area while she was cooking. He hurled abusive insults and

demanded the return of Rs 20,000 he claimed to have spent on bail and legal fees related to an FIR filed against him by the victim and her daughter. When she refused, Yadav physically assaulted her with a stick, causing injury to her wrist. Intervention by the victim's mother, daughter, and neighbors eventually stopped the attack. Before leaving, Yadav issued a chilling death threat if the case was not withdrawn.

Following a thorough investigation into the FIR lodged at Pipilani police station, the prosecution, led by Assis tant District Public Prosecution Officer Smt. Neeraj Bhargava, presented compelling arguments, evidence, and documents before the court, leading to Yadav's conviction and sentencing.
