

# MP on high alert for internal security

- Every corner under vigilance
- DGP calls meeting of SPs and IGs
- High-level meeting on emergency preparedness



**Bhopal:** In light of the prevailing national scenario, Director General of Police (DGP) Kailash Makwana convened a discussion on Friday with all district Superintendents of Police (SPs), Range Inspectors General (IGs) and Additional Directors General (ADGs), as well as Collectors and Commissioners. He assessed the internal security situation of each district, emphasizing the need for heightened vigilance.

The DGP directed that police focus on the security of crowded areas and critical infrastructure. He stressed the importance of keeping the police force, including the State

Disaster Response Force (SDRF), prepared to handle any emergency situation.

During the afternoon, the DGP engaged in detailed discussions

with all SPs across the state regarding internal security. He inquired about the security arrangements in place for significant buildings, national monuments, and heavily populated areas, to which all officers presented their preparedness strategies. Furthermore, he sought information on the measures taken to tackle potential emergencies.

In addition to these directives, the DGP instructed officials to maintain strict surveillance on social media to prevent any guideline violations. He also issued orders to intensify security checks at airports and railway stations. Furthermore, continuous vehicle checking in urban areas remains a priority. These concerted efforts underscore Madhya Pradesh's proactive stance in ensuring the safety and security of its citizens amidst the current national context.

## Mass leave ban for 13 key departments

**Bhopal:** In a late-night move, the General Administration Department has cancelled all types of leave for employees in 13 critical government departments, including Health, Home, Energy, Urban Development, Panchayat & Rural Development, Public Works, and Food & Civil Supplies. Even previously sanctioned leaves have been revoked, ef-

fective immediately.

Government staff must remain present at their headquarters at all times. Exceptions will only be considered in cases like marriage, childbirth, serious illness, or family emergencies, subject to approval by the district collector or departmental secretary.

### Citizens march with pride to honor

## State gears up for emergency preparedness amid rising tensions

- Temporary shelters in schools and hospitals
- Leave of government employees cancelled

**Bhopal:** In light of escalating tensions triggered by Pakistan's recent provocative actions, the Madhya Pradesh government has swung into action to bolster disaster preparedness across the state. On Friday evening, the Home Department issued a detailed directive to all district collectors, urging immediate implementation of relief and rescue measures.

The new, centrally controlled siren system will be strategically installed across key locations and bustling marketplaces throughout the capital. This integrated system will be linked to the administration's Control and Command Center, ensuring seamless and unified operation.

Collector Kaushalendra Vikram Singh stated that a meeting with the Police Commissioner will be convened soon to finalize the implementation plan. The current siren network, a relic of the 1971 war, is largely defunct. The incoming system promises simultaneous activation across the entire city, providing immediate and uniform alerts to all residents during emergencies.

To ensure public awareness and preparedness, an extensive campaign will be launched to educate citizens about the meaning and appropriate response to the new siren system. Special attention will be given to school and college students, equipping them with essential knowledge on emergency protocols.
