# Over 150 armed criminals nabbed in Tragic end for shot Indore in just four months

#### ▶ Weapons range from knives to pistols; alarming trend of youth flaunting arms on social media reels

Indore: Despite a tightened police crackdown, Indore continues to battle a disturbing surge in armed crime. In the past four months alone, over 150 criminals carrying weapons have been arrested — averaging nearly 40 armed arrests per month. Even more concerning, some of these offenders have been caught not only in Indore but also in adjoining districts, indicating a growing regional spread. From sharp knives to country-made pistols, the weapons seized reflect a serious public safety threat. Police have ramped up operations through regular check-points, combing patrols, and digital surveillance. Yet the trend shows no signs of slowing down — especially among youth who are increasingly seen acquiring weapons as a status symbol or to create reels on social media platforms. Law enforcement has al-



ready apprehended around a dozen such young individuals and taken strict legal action against them. In one recent case, a man named Hirmal, son of Silwar Chauhan, was caught with ten locally-made pis-

tols, which he intended to deliver to other criminals in the city. Police officials assert that their efforts have successfully prevented several major crimes before they could occur. However, the rising fascination with weapons among the city's youth remains a serious concern. Authorities are investigating how these illegal firearms are still making their way into young hands despite the strict vigilance.

Indore criminals caught in Ratlam with illegal arms: In a related incident, three minors from Indore's Pardeshipura area were recently arrested in Ratlam. During a special operation by Ratlam's Station Road police on Thursday, all three were found carrying illegal firearms. A significant cache of weapons was seized from the trio, underlining the growing menace that transcends city limits.

# **Head Constable**

Satna: The tragic news has emerged that Head Constable Prince Garg, critically injured after being shot by an accused within the confines of the Jaitwara police station barracks, has succumbed to his injuries in Delhi. The harrowing incident oc-curred on the night of April

28th when the accused, identified as Adarsh alias Achchu Sharma, breached the station's security and opened fire. Following the attack, the gravely wounded Head Constable Garg was immediately rushed to the district hospital. Given the severity of his condition, he was subsequently transformed to a private bospital in Po transferred to a private hospital in Rewa for specialized care. Despite ten

days of intensive treatment Head Constable Garg's con dition alarmingly deteriorated on Wednesday. Prompted by this critical turn, BJP Dis-trict President Bhagwat Pandey urgently appealed to Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yaday for the constable's trans-fer to Delhi for advanced

medical intervention. Responding swiftly, the Chief Minister directed au thorities to facilitate the transfer. Consequently, Head Constable Garg was airlifted from Rewa to Delhi via air am-bulance on Wednesday night and admitted to Max Hospital. Sadly, despite these efforts, he breathed his last. The shot, which had struck his collarbone, ultimately proved fatal.

#### Lokayukta crackdown in Chhindwara Livelihood Mission manager caught taking Rs 10,000 bribe from Women's Self-Help Group

Chhindwara: In yet another blow to the fight against corruption in Madhya Pradesh, a Block Manager of the State Livelihood Mission has been arrested redhanded while accepting a bribe. The accused, Rajiv

Chaudhary, was caught by the Jabalpur Lokayukta team accepting Rs 10,000 in cash from members of a women's self-help group in Chhindwara district. The operation followed a formal complaint filed by Sonia Bora, president of the Radhe-Radhe Self-Help Group. She alleged that Chaudhary regularly demand ed commissions from group members after disburse-

ment of their honorariums. "After we received our payments, he would go door to door collecting money under the pretext that we hadn't done any actual work," Bora said. She also claimed that non-compliance was met with threats of termination from ongo-

Following verification of the complaint, the Lokayukta team set up a trap. On Friday, at Umrana Rest House, Chaudhary was caught accepting the bribe. Inspector Rekha Prajapati confirmed that the



arrest was made at Bora's residence during the sting

A case has been registered against the accused under the Prevention of Corruption Act, and further investigation is underway. The incident highlights ongoing challenges in grassroots governance and the exploitation of women-led community initiatives.

#### **Fatal collision near Gormi**

Bhind: A devastating collision be tween an Omni van and a motorcy cle near Gormi on Friday has claimed the lives of a mother-in-law and son-in-law, leaving two others on the bike and seven occupants of the van seriously injured. The victims on the motorcycle were identified as Prem Singh, his wife Pushpa Devi, their son Manav, and Prem Singh's mother-in-law, Shanti Devi They were returning from a wedding ceremony in Raupura village when the tragic accident occurred. The Omni van was carrying seven labor-ers returning from work in Inder-garh. Prem Singh, a resident of Khi-tora Pura under Barohi police station, tragically died at the scene. His mother-in-law, Shanti Devi, succumbed to her injuries before reaching the Mehangaon hospital Pushpa Devi and her son Manay sustained critical injuries and have been referred to Gwalior for ad-

# Devotees to witness Baba Mahakal via mobile Bhasma Aarti

Reforms underway at Mahakaleshwar Temple



Ujjain: Ujjain's iconic Mahakaleshwar Temple is introducing key changes to enhance the spiritual experience of devotees. To streamline crowd management and allow more pilgrims to witness the revered Bhasma Aarti, the temple will soon

implement a Mobile Bhasma Aarti. This innovative approach will reduce the number of seated attendees while enabling a greater number of devotees to get a glimpse of Baba Mahakal during the ritual. At a recent management meeting, the Mahakaleshwar Temple Committee also approved the establishment of a Geeta Bhavan in Ujjain, with support from the Municipal Corporation, aiming to promote spiritual learning. In another significant decision, all gold and silver ornaments donated by devotees will now be evaluated on-site within the temple using dedicated machines and trained operators. This move ensures transparency and proper management of valuable offerings. The committee also approved the 2024–25 budget, including provisions for compensating employees for canceled weekly leaves and paying dearness allowance arrears from January to October 2024. Further enhancements include setting up a parking and charging station for the newly donated ecarts, building a retaining wall under the Maharajwada-Mahakal corridor project, and installing ornamental gates at all entry points to boost temple security and aesthetics.

### Residents of Patera in Damoh get benefit of tap water supply

Damoh: The water supply project in Patera town of Damoh district has been successfully implemented, significantly improving the quality of life for its residents. This initiative was completed with the cooperation of the Asian Development Bank and executed by the Madhya Pradesh Urban Development Company, which operates under the Urban Development and Housing Department. The total cost of the project amounted to Rs 9 crore 42 lakh, and the construction agency will also oversee the operation and maintenance of the project for the next 10 years. As part of the project, 2,535 houses in Patera have been connected to a tap water supply, ensuring access to clean drinking water for every household. Water is sourced from the Vyarma River and purified through a stateof-the-art water purification plant established by Jal Nigam. To serve the city's population of over 10,000, approximately 45 kilometers of water distribution pipelines have been laid. Additionally, a ground service reservoir with a capacity of 540 kiloliters has been constructed for effective water storage. Residents



across all 15 wards of Patera Nagar are benefiting from this project. The availability of tap connections in every home has alleviated the burden of traveling long distances for water. This initiative not only enhances the convenience for citizens but also contributes positively to their overall standard of living.
