Punjab govt cancels IAS, PCS officers' leave

Chandigarh: Amid escalation at the borders, the Punjab government on Friday announced cancellation of leave of IAS/PCS officers. An official order by personnel secretary said in view of the prevailing situation and preparedness for the emergency system, it has been decided that no officer shall proceed on any kind of leave or leave their station of posting without explicit approval of the chief secretary. "All the leaves approved stand cancelled," it said. The May 9 dated order said these instructions come into force immediately. "Meticulous compliance may be ensured failing which suitable action under relevant rules shall be initiated," the communique to all IAS/PCS officers in Punjab added.

Missile-like debris found in Hoshiarpur village

Hoshiarpur: Debris resembling parts of a missile was found in the fields near Kamahi Devi village in Hoshiarpur district on Thursday evening, officials said. SP Mukesh Kumar said on Friday that the debris appeared to be of missile-type origin. Acting promptly, the local police informed the Indian Air Force. A team of Air Force officials soon arrived at the site, conducted a preliminary inspection, and took the debris with them for further investigation and disposal, the officer said.

Woman killed, 4 injured, 50 structures damaged

As multiple attacks on Indian territory by Pakistan Armed Forces during the last night were "effectively repulsed and a befitting reply was given," a woman was killed and four others injured in cross-border shelling in the Uri sector of Baramulla district.

Officials said last night Pakistan intensified artillery fire across the

Line of Control (LoC) in Kashmir in which nearly 50 structures were damaged in Baramulla and Kupwara districts.

The intense cross border shelling erupted last evening moments after Pakistan escalated the skirmish by attacking Jammu with drones and missiles.

Officials said a 38-year-old woman identified as Nargis Bashir of Rajarwani Uri, was killed when the vehicle she was travelling in was hit by a shell fired from Pakistan.

The woman and some of her family members had boarded a vehicle

to flee from the village after artillery shelling from Pakistan.

While Nargis was killed, her three relatives were also injured in the explosion.

The three were shifted to Baramulla hospital where condition of all of them is stated to be stable.

The entire Uri sector witnessed intense cross-border shelling overnight, with mortar and artillery shells landing deep inside civilian areas. The heavy exchange of fire continued unabated until morning, causing panic among residents.

Similar shelling was reported in

north Kashmir's Kupwara district, where the intensity remained high. Pakistani shells landed in several villages, including Chowkibal, Panzgam, Soontipora, Dolipora, Batpura, and Rawathpora, prompting residents to take shelter indoors.

Earlier on the intervening night of Thursday and Friday, Pakistani forces launched multiple attacks using drones and other munitions along the entire western border.

The Indian Army said Pak troops also resorted to numerous cease fire violations (CFVs) along the Line of Control in Jammu and Kashmir.

States step up emergency preparedness amid border tension

In the wake of escalating tensions between India and Pakistan, several states have ramped up security measures and placed emergency services on a high alert to deal with any eventuality.

In Punjab, the state government has initiated a comprehensive review of emergency arrangements in

the border districts. As per the Chief Minister's Office (CMO), ten cabinet ministers will head to various sensitive zones following a cabinet meeting later today.

Their inspections will cover hospitals, fire services, ration supply, and other essential services.

Ministers Lal Chand Katarachakk and Dr Ravjot Singh are assigned to Gurdaspur, while Kuldeep Dhaliwal and Mohinder Bhagat will oversee preparations in Amritsar.

Bihar BJP chief Dilip Jaiswal said the entire state is under heightened alert following directives from the Centre. "Bihar, particularly Purnia which borders both Bangladesh and Nepal, remains highly sensitive. The Chief Minister is scheduled to convene a comprehensive review of the security situation tomorrow."

Security of ships, ports enhanced

Mumbai: In the wake of the escalating tensions between India and Pakistan, the Mumbai-headquartered Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has enhanced security arrangements at all ports, terminals, shipyards and ships. Following the directive, security arrangements of the coastal area in Mumbai was reviewed by the deputy commissioner of police port zone. Heavy police bandobast was deployed outside JNPT port at Panvel, Sarsaon dock, Bhay Ka Dhaka, Indira Dock and Yellow Gate.

The Director General, DGCA has asked all the chief information security officer of all port facilities to review the security of IT and communications systems and take appropriate measures to prevent/mitigate the threats of cyberattacks. The security system has been enhanced from MARSEC Level-1 to MARSEC Level-2 with immediate effect. This directive is issued in the interest of national maritime security and must be treated with utmost urgency and priority.



The CM told officials to conduct mock drills in all districts and establish a war room at the district level. Set up a coordination mechanism with hospitals during blackouts.
