► Funds to be disbursed tomorrow in Jabalpur

Bhopal: Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav is set to bring cheer to millions of beneficiaries across Madhya Pradesh tomorrow, Monday, June 16. From a program held in Bargi, Jabalpur district, he will digitally transfer funds for June into the accounts of beneficiaries under several key welfare schemes.

The Chief Minister will disburse the June installment of the Mukhyamantri Ladli Bahna Yojana to 1.27 crore Ladli Bahnas, totaling a massive Rs 1551.44 crore.

This marks the 25th installment for the scheme, which provides Rs 1250 to each eligible sister every month.

Extensive financial aid and development projects on the agenda: Beyond the Ladli Bahna Yojana,

CM Yadav will also transfer Rs 341 crore to the accounts of 56.68 lakh Social Security Pension beneficiaries. Additionally, over 27 lakh sisters will receive Rs 39.14 crore for cylinder refilling directly into their accounts via a single click.

In a further boost, the Chief Minister will disburse Rs 150 crore in ex-gratia payments to 6,821 labor families under the Sambal Yojana, also through a single click.

During the event, Chief Minister Dr. Yadav will not only distribute benefits to various scheme beneficiaries but also inaugurate and lay the foundation stones for numerous development projects, underscoring the government's commitment to progress across the state.

It has now come to light that the relationship between Sonam and her associate, Raj, was far from purely professional; they shared an exceptionally close bond. Shillong police reportedly possess clear evidence of their intimate relationship. This comes as a year-old photograph, believed to be from Mangal City, has recently emerged.

Instagram photos and office closeness hint at deeper relationship

Sources indicate a photograph of Raj and Sonam taken in the parking lot of Mangal City Mall has surfaced. This location is significant as



it's where Sonam's brother Govind's firm is also located. Reportedly, Sonam posted this photo on her Instagram account, 'Bitti Raghuvanshi,' last Diwali, showing her in a saree and Raj in a kurta. Despite Raj addressing Sonam as "Didi" (elder sister), police sources reveal that digital and other evidence found in Shillong confirms a relationship that transcended a typical professional or familial bond.

Raj's special status: More than just an employee

While Sonam served as the HR Manager at her brother Govind's firm and Raj handled the accounts section, Raj received notably more attention from Sonam compared to other employees. Their connection extended beyond the office walls, with Raj even assisting with household chores for the Raghuvanshi family.

Sources suggest that Raj frequently drove family members around when Govind was absent. Govind himself had noticed their closeness. He had even checked the office CCTV cameras once, where he saw Raj referring to Sonam as "Didi." At the time, Govind didn't suspect anything amiss. However, with both Sonam and Raj now arrested for Raja's murder, the family has begun to grasp the true nature of their relationship. After the extent of Sonam and Raj's alleged conspiracy came to light post-marriage, Govind reportedly contacted the police and called Sonam's home to inquire about his brother, gradually unraveling the layers of this deep relationship and the alleged conspiracy.

Aspiring doctor dies in Ahmedabad plane crash

Gwalior: The recent Ahmedabad plane crash has claimed the life of Aryan Rajput, a promising MBBS student from Jigasoli, Gwalior. His remains arrived in his hometown late Friday night, and he was laid to rest on Saturday in a somber ceremony attended by tearful villagers and prominent political figures. The tragic incident cut short Aryan's dream of becoming a doctor, leaving his family and community heartbroken.

= Hostel meal becomes fatal for aspiring doctor
Aryan Rajput was pursuing his MBBS at Ahmedabad's BJ Medical College. On the day of the horrific accident, he was at the college hostel's mess, having a meal. Tragically, a plane crashed into the building at that moment, severely injuring Aryan. His friends rushed him to the hospital, but he succumbed to his injuries just hours later.

The devastating news was initially withheld from Aryan's parents. When his body arrived in Jigasoli late Friday night, the entire village was overcome with grief, and his parents were inconsolable.

Bhopal: While the government and police continue to urge citizens to follow traffic rules, what happens when those very rules are broken by the lawmakers themselves?

Union Minister and Tikamgarh MP Virendra Khatik has landed in controversy after a video of him riding pillion on a motorcycle—without a helmet—went viral on social

media. The incident occurred in Pachmarhi, Narmadapuram district, where Khatik had arrived to attend a BJP training camp.

According to reports, the training event was set to be inaugurated by Union Home Minister Amit Shah. However, several MPs and MLAs, including Khatik, had already reached the

venue a day earlier. With some time on his hands before the formal proceedings, the minister decided to explore the scenic surroundings.

He asked a BJP worker to bring a motorcycle, hopped on the back seat, and took off for a ride through the picturesque hills of Pachmarhi. What caught everyone's attention—and drew criticism—was that neither the minister nor the rider was wearing a helmet.

This isn't the first time Minister Khatik has been seen disregarding traffic norms. In a recent instance amid escalating tensions between India and Pakistan, he was spotted riding a bike in Tikamgarh without a helmet.

The latest video has sparked debate online, with many questioning the double standards of public figures that advocate for law and order while violating basic safety rules themselves.
