

Mother seeks protection for son from “Lover” wife

● Fearing “Raja Raghuvanshi-Like” incident

Chhatarpur: In the wake of the highly publicized Raja Raghuvanshi murder case, a palpable fear has gripped recently married men across the nation. Adding to this growing unease, a mother in Chhatarpur has approached the Superintendent of Police (SP) office, desperately seeking protection for her son from his newlywed wife, whom she claims is having an affair and poses a threat to his life.

Janki Ahirwar told authorities that she arranged her son Rahul Ahirwar's marriage to a girl from Bihar just a month ago. However, within days of the wedding, they discovered his wife was allegedly in a relationship with another man from her village, with whom she frequently communicates via video calls.

Son “Terrified” by wife's demand to return to bihar

Janki Ahirwar expressed her son's profound fear, stating that his wife is relentlessly pressuring him to accompany her to Bihar. Rahul Ahirwar, visibly shaken, confided that while the initial days of their marriage were normal, his wife



later revealed her love for another man and admitted to a previous marriage. “She keeps telling me to come to Bihar with her,” Rahul reportedly told his mother. “I’m afraid my wife might do something to me.”

Allegations of extramarital affair

The case originates from the Bajna police

station area in Chhatarpur district. Janki had arranged Rahul's marriage to Nikki, a resident of Aurangabad police station area in Mirzapur district, Bihar. The marriage was facilitated by a local named Sanju Ahirwar, who reportedly charged Rs 80,000 for the arrangement. While Nikki initially seemed to adjust, it gradually became evident that she was allegedly involved in an affair with another man.

Mother fears for son's life after witnessing similar cases

Janki expressed her grave concerns, citing news reports and mobile videos where wives have allegedly murdered their husbands, sometimes disposing of bodies in drums or taking their husbands away to kill them. “I fear that my daughter-in-law might commit a similar act against my son Rahul,” she stated.

Rahul Ahirwar corroborated his mother's claims, confirming that his wife confessed to being in a relationship with another man and having had physical relations with him multiple times. He stated that she doesn't treat him well and constantly pressures him to move to Bihar, fueling his fear of harm.

ASP Vidita Dagar has assured the mother and son of all possible assistance in the matter.

Bride disappears with valuables after wedding

► Fake marriage racket suspected



Rajgarh: A shocking case of fraud has surfaced in Rajgarh district, where a bride fled just after the wedding ceremony on the pretext of going to the washroom. The incident took place on April 23 at Anjanil Temple in the Beawar area. Ram Gopal Verma, a resident of Bankpura, got married to Divya Bhavbhani, allegedly from Bhopal

rural, after paying Rs. 2 lakh through brokers.

According to Ram Gopal, the amount was arranged by selling family jewellery and taking a loan. The match was arranged by brokers Gokul Verma and Jamnalal Verma, who showed the girl's photo and Aadhaar card to gain the family's trust. On the wedding day, all rituals were completed at the temple. However, before the bride's farewell, she disappeared with another man.

When initial attempts for a mutual settlement failed, a complaint was filed at Beawar City Police Station. An FIR has been registered against Divya and the two brokers. Police are investigating the case. Locals say such incidents are on the rise, with fake marriages being used as a tool for financial fraud. The accused often operate fearlessly due to lack of strict legal action.

Woman assaulted during land demarcation

► Police remain silent spectators

Sagar: A deeply disturbing incident has surfaced from Khamaria village under Rahli police station in Sagar district, where a woman was brutally assaulted by more than half a dozen people, including other women. The attack took place when she arrived at the site along with officials from the Revenue Department for the demarcation of her agricultural land. The woman had reportedly deposited around Rs 25,000 as a demarcation fee.

Shockingly, the entire incident occurred in the presence of police personnel, who did nothing to intervene. A video of the assault is now going viral on social media, drawing widespread criti-

cism and putting the district administration under serious scrutiny.

The victim alleged that as soon as she reached the land, members of the opposing party launched an attack. Despite the clear threat to her safety, the police officers on the spot failed to take any action, allowing the attackers to continue unchallenged. This incident has raised serious concerns about the functioning of law enforcement in the area, with citizens questioning the effectiveness and accountability of the Sagar Police. Public outrage continues to grow over the failure to protect the victim and uphold law and order.

Temple accused of hosting meat feast, tomb vandalized

● Tensions erupt in Morena

Morena: Saturday saw heightened tensions in Morena as disputes flared at two separate religious sites.

At the Asmani Mata Temple near Madhopura Culvert, the temple priest and his family face accusations of slaughtering an animal and consuming its meat within the temple premises. This sparked outrage among hundreds of locals who gathered and protested vigorously. Police have since registered a case against the priest and four of his relatives.

Simultaneously, a Mazar (tomb of a Sufi saint) located at the TIT Complex was vandalized by unknown individuals overnight, leading to further unrest on Saturday morning. Given the volatile situation at both locations, a significant police presence has been



deployed to maintain order.

Allegations of sacrificial meat consumption at Temple

According to reports, while the Mazar at TIT Complex was being

vandalized, a crowd gathered at the Asmani Mata Temple. Upon entering, they reportedly discovered a bowl containing meat. The temple priest, Rambharose Prajapati, along with his four sons and other family members, reside within the temple. They are now

accused of offering an animal sacrifice and consuming its meat on the temple grounds. Locals emphasize that the temple, approximately fifty years old, holds deep religious significance for the community.

FIR filed against priest and family

The presence of meat in a temple that also houses an idol of Lord Hanuman has deeply offended the religious sentiments of many. Protests erupted in front of the temple on Saturday morning. Upon receiving news of the commotion, CSP Deepali Chandoulia arrived with a police team to calm the crowd.

Based on a complaint filed by local resident Amit Upadhyay, police have registered a case against priest Rambharose Prajapati and his sons Manoj, Raju, Balram, and Gauri Prajapati.

State’s first bird tower built in Sagar

● A unique step for avian safety and environmental protection

Sagar: In response to growing concerns about the loss of natural bird habitats due to urbanization, pollution, and tree cutting, a remarkable initiative has been taken in Sagar, Madhya Pradesh. The state's first bird tower has been constructed in the City Forest of Mangalgiri area. This specially designed six-storey structure offers safe shelter for around 2,500 birds across 800 nesting grooves.

The tower ensures protection for birds against harsh weather conditions like cold winters, heavy



rains, and scorching summer heat. Bird lovers of Sagar had raised concerns with local MLA Shailendra Jain regarding the lack of safe shelters for birds. Recognizing the urgency, the MLA proposed the tower, which was built under the guidance of former DFO Mahendra Pratap Singh at a cost of Rs 6.30 lakh.

Provisions for food and water have been made

This 50-foot-high structure is more than just a shelter. Provisions for regular food and water have been made to ensure the well-being of the birds. An oxygen park is also being developed nearby to enhance the area's ecological bal-

ance.

Tower has begun to attract birds

Since its completion, the bird tower has begun to attract birds, and their morning chirping fills the air. According to Ranger Ravi Singh, this tower is a significant step toward improving the region's environment and promoting compassion towards animals. It not only provides a safe haven for birds but also stands as a symbol of environmental awareness and wildlife care. This innovative project marks a new chapter in urban ecological efforts, blending conservation with urban planning in a meaningful way.

Fiery crash claims two lives in Mandla

► Motorcycle collides with parked tipper

Mandla: A tragic accident in Mandla district has resulted in the instant deaths of two young men after their motorcycle collided with a parked tipper truck and burst into flames. The victims were reportedly returning home after attending a wedding ceremony.

= Horrific collision ignites motorcycle

According to police officials, Sandeep Singh Bhartiya (22) and Shyamal Bhartiya (24), both residents of Mohgaon Sani village, were on their way back from a wedding celebration in Madhmuau

village. Late at night, as they were passing through Orai village, their motorcycle crashed into a tipper truck parked on the side of the road.

The impact of the collision caused severe injuries, leading to their immediate deaths at the scene. The motorcycle subsequently caught fire. Onlookers quickly stopped and alerted the police. With the help of local residents, officers extricated the bodies and sent them to Bichhia Hospital for post-mortem examination.

Ambulance collision claims two lives, one injured in Jabalpur

Jabalpur: A tragic accident at Mohani Trisection, under the Kundam police station's jurisdiction, has resulted in the deaths of two young men and left another injured after their motorcycle was struck by an ambulance.

Police reported that Bharat Singh Kulaste, a resident of Chaurai Kala and a teacher at Harduli Kala High School, informed authorities about the incident. His son, Aman Kulaste (21), along with Suryachand alias Kissu Singh (19) and Ajay Armo (19), were traveling from their new home in Chaurai Kala to their old residence in Chaurai on a motorcycle.

According to the report, an ambulance bearing license plate CG 15 DT 5070, approaching from the Jabalpur side, was allegedly being driven at high speed and negligently. The ambulance collided with their



motorcycle, causing all three riders to fall and sustain severe injuries to their limbs, heads, and bodies.

They were rushed to Kundam Hospital, where doctors declared Aman Kulaste deceased. Suryac-

hand alias Kissu and Ajay Armo were referred to Medical College for further treatment. Sadly, Suryachand alias Kissu Armo also succumbed to his injuries at the Medical College.

Audacious Rs 50 Lakh heist in Khajuraho

● Thieves strike home while whole family sleeps

Khajuraho, Chhatarpur: In a brazen display of confidence, thieves in Madhya Pradesh have pulled off a daring robbery in Khajuraho, making off with over Rs. 50 lakh in valuables from a cloth merchant's home. The audacious heist unfolded in the dead of night, with the family sleeping soundly, completely oblivious to the crime.

The incident occurred near the Bamitha police station between approximately 12 AM and 2 AM. The cunning culprits first disabled the CCTV cameras, cutting their wires, before entering the house. They then proceeded to ransack the rooms, making a clean sweep of gold and silver jewelry along with cash from the almira. Astonishing-



ly, the merchant was sleeping in a nearby room and remained undisturbed throughout the entire operation. It wasn't until the family awoke in the morning that they discovered the ransacked room, with their precious jewelry and cash missing. Police were immediately notified and arrived at the scene with a dog squad. Initial reports suggest the

thieves made off with around 500 grams of gold, 15 kilograms of silver, and Rs 2 lakh in cash.

Police have registered a case and are currently scouring footage from nearby CCTV cameras in hopes of identifying the culprits. The incident highlights a troubling trend of increasing boldness among criminals in the region.

► Rajgarh College shines in tech education
