24/7 flood control and strict monitoring: Minister Silawat mandated the establishment of 24-hour flood control rooms at the district level. He ordered the formation of inspection teams for regular moni-

toring and explicitly stated that no official should leave headquarters during the monsoon season without prior approval from a competent authority.

Proactive communication and compliance: To ensure public safe-

advance notice of dam water releases be provided to all district officials, public representatives, and key organizations.

He stressed the importance of timely public announcements in Furthermore, all pre-monsoon inspection reports must be uploaded to the departmental portal as per the manual. Reports concerning dams in states covered by the Central Government's Dam Safety Act must also be submitted punctually to the central portal.

Expediting water conservation programs: Minister Silawat called for the Jal Ganga Samvardhan program to be executed at full pace within the next 14 days, with a detailed report to be submitted within three days of its completion. While expressing satisfaction with the progress of ongoing construction projects, he urged officials to complete as much work as possible before the rains intensify.

Girl alleges abduction and rape

Initially claims voluntary marriage

Bhopal: A 28-year-old girl from the Berasia area of Bhopal, who was reported missing in May has now accused a known youth of kidnapping and rape. The police have registered a case against the accused, though no arrest has been made

According to Berasia Police Station in-charge Virendra Kumar Sen, the girl, a graduate, was reported missing by her family on 25 May. The police registered a missing person's report. On 28 May, she returned and told the police that she had willingly gone with a youth named Prashant Malviya and had married him of her own free will. She said she wished to go home and later marry Prashant with her

Girl returned to the police with a different account

However, on 16 June — 19 days later — the girl returned to the police station with a different account. She alleged that Prashant had abducted her on his bike, taken her to his house in the Semra area of Bhopal, held her captive, and raped her over three days. She said she had initially remained silent due to threats from Prashant.

Based on her latest statement, the police have filed an FIR against Prashant Malviya under serious charges, including kidnapping, wrongful confinement, rape, and issuing threats. The investigation is ongoing, and efforts are being made to arrest the accused.

It's reported that the pathway issue has been a longstanding dispute, previously addressed by the Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) who had demarcated the route. This simmering disagreement ultimately erupted into the violent clash Police have filed a case against Bal-mukund Patidar, Shivprasad, Surendra, mukund Patidar, Shiyprasad, Shiehida, and Khushilal based on a complaint from Brajesh Patidar. Conversely, a case has been registered against Bra-jesh and Rameshwar following a com-plaint by Abhinav Patidar. No arrests have been made in either case yet.

Massive demolition drive in Kolukhedi against illegal colonies

Bhopal: A major crackdown was carried out on Wednesday in Kolukhedi village of Bhopal, targeting illegal colonies spread over nearly 8 acres. The district administration, with the help of three JCB machines, demolished unauthorized constructions in the Huzur tehsil area. Additionally, encroachments spread across 13 acres of adjacent land were also cleared during the drive. Huzur SDM Vinod Sonkia informed that a detailed investigation was conducted before the action. Following confirmation of illegal development, the administration, backed by police personnel, launched the demolition operation. Two unauthorized colonies in Kolukhedi were affected by the drive. The land where the illegal construction was taking place is valued at around Rs 10 crore. This colony was reportedly being developed by Shiv Realty under the name "Rehan Golden". The demolition covered constructions and boundary walls on land parcels falling under Khasra numbers 157/1/1, 157/1/2, 157/2/1, 157/2/2, 158/1, and 158/2. The total area involved was 4.207

Gunga police solve murder case within 36 hours Bhopal: In a swift breakthrough, Gun-

ga police in rural Bhopal solved the murder case of a 30-year-old man from Bhaiskheda village within 36 hours of the incident. The body of the victim, Arjun Singh Thakur, was found under a neem tree near the Chhappan Maharaj temple on the morning of June 15. He had suffered deep injuries to his head and face. Following the discovery, police launched an intensive investigation. Arjun's brother, Makhan Singh, informed authorities that Kaluram alias Kallu Thakur (60), a fellow villager, was the first to report the body. It was later revealed that Arjun was last seen drinking alcohol with Kaluram. Upon interrogation, Kaluram confessed to the crime. He admitted that during a heated argument while drinking, he struck Arjun with a stone, killing him on the spot.


Four-year-old dies under mysterious circumstances from burn injuries

Family claims matchstick accident, police launch investigation

Bhopal: A four-year-old boy in Bhopal has tragically died from burn injuries under suspicious circumstances. Initially, the family was reluctant to allow a post-mortem examination. They claim the child, Ahmed Hasan, suffered the accident while playing with matchsticks. He later succumbed to his injuries during treatment at the hospital. Police, however, suspect the family may

be concealing details about the incident. After the post-mortem, the body was released to the family, and authorities have registered a case to initi-

ate an investigation into the matter. The incident occurred on June 10, according to the Gandhi Nagar police station. The family stated that Ahmed Hasan, son of Abdul Hasan, was playing with



Hotel in Gandhi Nagar and resided there Ahmed Hasan was taken to Hamidia Hospital for treatment, where he passed away on the morning of June 16. Police

were notified of his death by the hospital. Upon their arrival, the family initially resisted a postmortem examination. The Gandhi Nagar police have registered Case No. 37/25 and are now scrutinizing CCTV footage from the hotel to uncover the truth. Police suspect the family is withholding crucial information about the incident.

B Tech student dies by suicide, family in deep shock

Bhopal: A 23-year-old B.Tech student, Mudit Pataria, died by suicide in Bhopal on Tuesday. The incident took place in a rented flat located in a multi-storey building in Patel Nagar, where Mudit lived with five of his friends. The reason behind the suicide is still unknown, and no suicide note has been found so far.

According to Piplani police, Mudit, a native of Panna district, hanged himself in his room late Tuesday night. His friends became concerned when he did not come out of his room for a long time. Despite knocking on the door repeatedly, there was no response. Eventually, the police were called, who broke open the door and recovered his body. His mobile phone has been seized for investigation.

Was the only son

Mudit was in the second year of his B.Tech course at a private college in Bhopal. His father, Kamta Prasad Pataria, a temple priest in Panna, arrived after receiving the tragic news and broke down on seeing his son's body. He had high hopes for his only son's future and had sent him to Bhopal for a better education.

Police have registered a case and begun an investigation to determine the cause of the suicide.
