

Embarrassed PWD Engineers Can't Greenlight Controversial 90-Degree Bridge

● Redesign ordered ● 90 Degree ROB of Capital



Bhopal: A massive controversy surrounds the 90-degree railway overbridge (ROB) in Aishbagh, Bhopal, drawing national attention. Sources reveal that embarrassed Public Works Department (PWD) engineers are now too ashamed to even issue the inauguration letter to the government. Consequently, the government has decided to redesign this problematic ROB.

Gross Negligence and Design Flaw

The PWD engineers, responsible for oversee-

ing the construction, reportedly made minimal site visits over two years. This negligence resulted in a 90-degree blind turn on the Rs 17.37 crore bridge, a glaring error in traffic engineering. Experts are calling it one of the biggest blunders in road design.

Construction began in August 2022 and was initially slated for completion by August 2024, but remains unfinished. This lapse has severely questioned the professionalism of both PWD and Railway authorities.

Technical blunder under senior engineers' watch

The Aishbagh ROB's oversight was entrusted to five senior engineers from the PWD's Bridge Section, including Chief Engineer G.P. Verma, former SDO Ravi Shukla, current SDO Govind Raghuvanshi, then-Executive Engineer Javed Shakeel, and an Assistant Engineer. How such a severe technical flaw as a 90-degree bend occurred under their watch remains a critical question. Notably, former SDO Ravi Shukla was previously suspended for negligence in another bridge construction.

Current status: Redesign and rectification

Currently, the department is hastily laying asphalt near the problematic turn, seemingly attempting to expedite inauguration despite the glaring design flaw. Dr. Rahul Verma, a professor associated with MANIT, reiterated that a 90-degree turn is a monumental error in road engineering. Railway authorities have now offered their land to help rectify this critical mistake, signaling a collaborative effort to salvage the project.

Lack of oversight from top officials

Despite multiple inspections by local MLA and Minister Vishvas Sarang, who had set a strict June 15 deadline, the PWD's Engineer-in-Chief has yet to inspect the construction site even once. Other senior officials have shown similar disinterest.

Leading the nation in screening and awareness: Deputy CM Shukla urged citizens to join the pledge for a sickle

cell-free Madhya Pradesh by 2047, emphasizing the importance of universal screening and mandatory pre-marital sickle cell card checks. Madhya Pradesh currently leads the nation in sickle cell screening, having tested over 1.06 crore citizens. This initiative has identified over 2 lakh carriers and 29,277 patients, with more than 80.09 lakh sickle cell cards distributed. Free medication, vaccinations, blood transfusions, and genetic counseling are

provided to all identified patients. "Match sickle cell card before Kundali": Shukla stressed the critical importance of pre-marital sickle cell testing, advising, "Match the sickle cell card before Kundali [horoscope match] for marriage." He explained that if both partners are carriers, their children face a high risk of inheriting severe sickle cell disease. This makes pre-marital screening not just a personal decision but a vital social responsibility for safeguarding future generations.

Human Rights Commission demands answers in 4 cases

Bhopal: The Madhya Pradesh Human Rights Commission (MPHRC) has taken serious cognizance of four distinct cases, demanding responses from the respective authorities. Lightning strikes and mob justice under scrutiny: In Bhind district, the MPHRC has sought a report within one month from the Collector regarding the tragic deaths of two individuals struck by lightning in Indurkhi village, Ron. Additionally, in Raisen district, the Commission has demanded a response within three weeks concerning the death of one of two youths who were brutally beaten near Mehgaon temple on suspicion of cow smuggling. Medical negligence and police brutality alleged: The MPHRC is also investigating a case in Khandwa district, seeking answers regarding the death of a Dalit woman at a private hospital on Indore Road, allegedly due to doctor's negligence. Furthermore, in Indore district, the Commission has taken serious note of an incident where a truck driver allegedly sustained broken teeth and injuries after being slapped by a Sub-Inspector. The MPHRC has directed the Police Commissioner, Indore, to conduct an inquiry into the matter and submit an action taken report within one month.
