

# Tiger Reserves witness soaring foreign tourist numbers

## A wildlife tourism boom in Madhya Pradesh!

**Bhopal:** Madhya Pradesh is rapidly emerging as a premier destination for wildlife tourism, with its majestic Tiger Reserves experiencing a continuous surge in both domestic and international visitors. This growing popularity highlights the state's success in attracting nature enthusiasts from across the globe.

The latest figures for 2024-25 (up to May) reveal a significant increase in foreign tourist arrivals to Madhya Pradesh's renowned Tiger Reserves. Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve led the pack with an impressive 32,528 foreign visitors, followed by Kanha Tiger Reserve (23,059), Panna Tiger Reserve (15,201), Pench Tiger Reserve (13,127), and Satpura Tiger Reserve (10,038).

These numbers represent a substantial leap compared to the previous year (2023-24), where Bandhavgarh saw 25,894 foreign tourists, Kanha 18,179, Panna 12,538, Pench 9,856, and Satpura 6,876. Looking at the broader trend, foreign tourist arrivals have shown remarkable



growth: 109 in 2020-21, soaring to 5,945 in 2021-22, 21,266 in 2022-23, 25,894 in 2023-24, and reaching 32,528 by May 2024-25. Over the past five years, the state's Tiger Reserves have collectively hosted 738,637 Indian tourists and 85,742

foreign tourists, totaling 824,379 visitors. This tourism boom has translated into substantial revenue. The Tiger Reserves generated approximately Rs 4.65 crore in 2020-21, Rs 11.88 crore in 2021-22, Rs 13.90 crore in 2022-23, Rs 14.10 crore in 2023-24, and a remarkable Rs 16.67 crore by May 2024-25. Cumulatively, over the last five years, the Tiger Reserves have garnered an impressive income of approximately Rs 61.22 crore.

Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve has cemented its status as the top choice for tourists, consistently witnessing an annual increase in visitor numbers. Indian tourist arrivals have steadily grown from 120,800 in 2020-21 to 160,500 by May 2024-25, with figures of 169,738 in 2021-22, 164,559 in 2022-23, and 123,032 in 2023-24. This growth is mirrored in the rising numbers of foreign tourists, solidifying Bandhavgarh's position as a must-visit destination for wildlife enthusiasts.

# CM's security breach at VIP road in Bhopal

## Car intercepts convoy, driver apprehended

**Bhopal.** A serious lapse in security for Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav has emerged in Bhopal after a speeding car intruded into his convoy on VIP Road. A potentially major accident was averted thanks to the swift action of the pilot vehicle.

The accused driver, attempting to evade a police check, was driving on the wrong side of the road when he unexpectedly encountered the Chief Minister's motorcade.

Police quickly apprehended the driver, identified as Milan Tiwari from Guna, and seized his car. A case has been registered against him under the Motor Vehicles Act and sections of the BNS.

According to police, the incident occurred late last night around 12:30 AM. Chief Minister

Dr. Mohan Yadav was returning to his official residence from the State Hangar with his security detail.

As the convoy passed through Lalghati, a blue Baleno car (MP 04 ZA 3262) suddenly appeared from the wrong side and stopped in front of the Raja Bhoj statue.

The pilot vehicle of the Chief Minister's convoy immediately stopped the car, moved it to the side, and alerted the police.

Officers arrived at the scene, took Milan Tiwari into custody, and impounded the vehicle.

During questioning, police discovered that Tiwari is a competitive exam aspirant. He had reportedly traveled to Bhopal with his friend, Shubham Dhakad from Guna, to gather information about coaching classes.

# Youth dies in collision while rushing with medicine for ailing father

**Bhopal:** A 26-year-old youth, Surendra Rajak, lost his life in a tragic road accident at Lalghati, Bhopal, while rushing to deliver life-saving medicine to his ailing father. The incident occurred on Wednesday evening and claimed Surendra's life early Thursday during treatment.

Surendra, a resident of Malipura Peergate, worked at a jewellery shop and had been married just two months ago. His father, Kanchhedi Rajak, is seriously ill and admitted to Chirayu Hospital in Malipura. When the required heart-related injection was unavailable there, Surendra was directed to Chirayu Hospital in

Bhainsakhedi to collect it.

In his urgency to return with the injection, Surendra took a shortcut and rode his bike on the wrong side of the Lalghati bridge. According to Koh-e-Fiza police station in-charge KG Shukla, a speeding Bullet motorcycle coming from the opposite direction collided with him. Surendra suffered a severe head injury and succumbed to it during treatment the next morning. Two youths on the Bullet were also injured.

The police have seized the Bullet and registered a case. Surendra's body was handed over to the family after postmortem. Further investigation is underway.

## Girl dies as unknown vehicle hits two-wheeler

**Bhopal:** A tragic road accident occurred near IT Park on New Jail Road, Bhopal, where a young girl student preparing for competitive exams lost her life after being hit by an unknown vehicle. The incident took place in the early hours of Thursday. The deceased has been identified as Rochelle, daughter of Solomon (23), a resident of Minal Residency and originally from Chhindwara. After completing her B.Tech from a private college on Raisen Road, she was preparing for competitive exams. According to Gandhi Nagar police, Rochelle had gone to a dhaba on Parwalia Road with a friend to have coffee late Wednesday night.

While returning around 3:30 am on Thursday, an unidentified vehicle collided with their two-wheeler near IT Park. Rochelle sustained serious injuries and succumbed to them during treatment in the morning. Her friend, who was riding the bike, was injured.

**Bhopal:** In a somber series of events, an elderly man in Bhopal's Nishatpura area tragically ended his life by hanging himself at home yesterday evening. Separately, a young man in Bairagarh died after consuming poison. Police have registered cases in both incidents and initiated investigations.

According to police, Santosh Sahu (65) of Devki Nagar hanged himself around 7:30 PM yesterday. His body was recovered and sent for post-mortem to Hamidia Hospital. The absence of a suicide note means the reasons for his drastic step remain unknown.

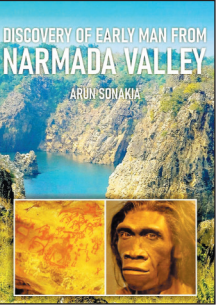
Meanwhile, Bairagarh police reported that Kailash Majhi (34) of Behta village consumed a poisonous substance at home on June 14th. He succumbed during treatment at Chirayu Hospital. Investigations revealed that he was distressed by an illness, leading him to take his own life.

In another incident, Aishbagh police found the body of a man, approximately 50 years old, on the railway track near Moti Nagar yesterday morning. Police determined he died after being hit by a train.

**Bhopal:** Indira Gandhi Rashtriya Manav Sangrahalaya, Bhopal, will host a special book release event on 20 June at 12 noon in the museum's library hall. Museum Director Prof. Amitabh Pandey stated that the book provides valuable insights into early human development in the Narmada Valley and marks a milestone in Indian prehistoric studies.
