In a post on X, he said: "I thank the people and Government of Ghana for conferring 'The Officer of the Order of the Star of Ghana' upon me.

historical ties between India and Ghana."

Ghana friendship. India will always stand with the people of Ghana and continue to contribute as a trusted friend and devel-



## Monsoon Session of Parliament to begin from July 21

New Delhi (UNI)

Union Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju has announced that the Monsoon session of the Parliament will begin on July 21 and continue till August 21.

Rijiju on Wednesday said that President Droupadi Murmu has approved the government's proposal to convene the Session while highlighting that no Parliament sittings will be held on August 13 and 14 due to Independence Day celebrations.

In a post on X, Union Minister Kiren Rijiju wrote, "The Hon'ble President of India has approved the proposal of the Government to convene the Monsoon Session of Parliament from 21st July to 21st August,

2025. In view of the Independence Day celebrations, there will be no sittings on the 13th and 14th of August."

Both Houses of the Parliament are scheduled to convene on July 21 at 11 am, after a break of over three months.

Earlier, Rijiju had informed that the Cabinet Committee on Parliamentary Affairs, chaired by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, had recommended the dates.

It is pertinent to mention that Opposition leaders have been demanding convening of a special session of Parliament to discuss 'Operation Sindoor' post the Pahalgam terror attack in which 26 people were killed.

## WHO launches '3 by 35' initiative to tackle chronic diseases



New Delhi (UNI)

The World Health Organization (WHO) today unveiled its ambitious "3 by 35" initiative, urging nations to raise taxes on tobacco, alcohol, and sugar drinks by at least 50% by 2035.

The initiative comes as a direct response to the rising global burden of noncommunicable diseases (NCDs), such as heart disease, cancer, and diabetes, which now account for over 75% of all deaths worldwide.

"Health taxes are one of the most efficient tools we have," said Dr Jeremy Farrar, Assistant Director-General, Health Promotion and Disease Prevention and Control, WHO in a statement here. "They cut the consumption of harmful products and create revenue governments can reinvest in health care, education, and social protection. It's time to act."

Blatant spike in NCDs have placed an immense strain on global health systems, already grappling with reduced development aid and growing public debt.

Gurugram (Haryana): Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla on Thursday said that frequent disruptions, once a recurring feature, have now significantly reduced in the Parliament of India, resulting in enhanced productivity and meaningful debate.

Inaugurating the first-ever National Conference of Chairpersons of Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) of States

and Union Territories in Manesar, Gurugram, he mentioned that the Lok Sabha has increasingly witnessed late-night sessions and long-duration debates, reflecting a mature and responsible democratic culture.

He called upon urban local bodies to incorporate structured procedures, including regular sittings, robust committee systems, and citizen

engagement, to further strengthen grassroots democracy.

In his address, Birla emphasized the importance of incorporating proven democratic practices such as Question Hour and Zero Hour in ULBs, noting that such provisions in Parliament have played a vital role in holding the executive accountable and raising public concerns systematically.

## DAC clears 10 capital acquisition proposals of Rs 1.05 lakh crore

New Delhi (UNI): The Defence Acquisition Council, chaired by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, today accorded Acceptance of Necessity (AoN) for 10 capital acquisition proposals amounting to around Rs 1.05 lakh crore through indigenous sources.

The AoNs were accorded for procurement of armoured recovery vehicles, electronic warfare system, integrated common inventory management system for the Tri-Services and Surface-to-Air missiles.

### Explosive substances including IED seized from terrorist's houses: DIG

**Rayachot:** Deputy Inspector General Koya Praveen has said that the police seized explosive substances including IED from the houses of the two terrorists, who were arrested by the Tamil Nadu IB officials three days ago in Rayachot in Annamaya district.

Addressing a press conference here today, DIG Praveen said that the Tamil Nadu IB officials arrested two terrorists 'Abubakar Siddique' and 'Mohammad Ali' in Rayachot three days ago. The two arrested terrorists were involved in a number of cases including bomb blasts in Tamil Nadu and Karnataka.

The police conducted a thorough search in their houses and seized explosive material including IED, Fuel oil, Ammonia Nitrate and GunPowder from their houses. The police also seized maps of three main cities and railway networks, the IGP added.

The two arrested terrorists are affiliated with the 'Al Ummah' terror outfit. They planned to conduct blasts in three cities.
