### Hamas seeks ceasefire guarantees as scores more killed in Gaza

Hamas is seeking guarantees that a new U.S. ceasefire proposal for Gaza would lead to the war's end, a source close to the militant group said on Thursday, as medics said Israeli strikes across the territory had killed

scores more people.

Israeli officials said prospects for reaching a ceasefire deal and hostage deal appeared high, nearly 21 months since the war between Israel and Hamas began.

On the ground, intensified Israeli strikes across Gaza continued unabated, killing at least 59 people on Thursday, according to health authorities in the territory. Efforts for a Gaza truce have gath-

ered steam after the U.S. secured a



ceasefire to end a 12-day aerial conflict between Israel and Iran.

### 4 dead, 38 missing after passenger ship sinks

Jakarta: Four people have been confirmed dead, 38 are missing, and 23 others survived after a passenger ship sunk in the Bali Strait of Indone sia on Thursday, a senior official from the East Java Search and Res cue Office, Tholeb Vatelehan, said.

The wooden vessel, KM Tunu Pratama Jaya, was traveling from Ketapang seaport in Banyuwangi Regency, East Java, to Gilimanuk seaport in Jembrana Regency on Bali Island when it went down, according

"As many as 23 people survived the incident, four were dead, and 38 others remained missing," Vatelehan told Xinhua via phone.

Search and rescue operations have since been launched from both Bali Island and East Java, as the incident occurred near the maritime boundary between the two regions.

### MERCOSUR, EFTA expect

Moscow: Member states of the Southern Common Market (MER-COSUR) and the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) are poised to sign a landmark Free Trade Agreement (FTA) later this year, according to a joint statement following talks between the two trading blocs.

"In light of the progress achieved, MERCOSUR and the EFTA states share the commitment to take the necessary steps to ensure that the Free Trade Agreement is signed in the coming months of 2025," the statement said.

The statement was published during a MERCOSUR summit in Buenos Aires.

The MERCOSUR - EFTA Free Trade Agreement will create a free-trade zone of almost 300 million people and a combined GDP of more than US\$ 4.3 trillion," the statement said.

A US federal judge has blocked President Donald Trump's latest effort to shut the nation's asylum door, ruling that the White House overstepped both Congress's immigration statutes and the Constitu-

In a 128-page opinion, Judge Randolph D Moss of the US District Court for the District of Columbia on Wednesday wrote that Trump's January proclamation, which branded the rise in border crossings as an "invasion" and tried to create "an alternative immigration system," bypassed the protections Congress built into the US Immigration and Nationality Act.

Since the proclamation would have denied humanitarian screenings to people entering between



ports of entry as well as at official crossings, the court found it "fundamentally irreconcilable" with the statutory text guaranteeing anyone on US soil a chance to seek refuge,

Yesterday's ruling echoed earlier defeats for categorical asylum bans. In 2018 and 2020, federal courts blocked two previous Trump administration orders that sought to disqualify people who crossed the border irregularly.

### China warns against trade deals that harm third parties after US-Vietnam pact

China today expressed concerns over the recent trade agreement between the US and Vietnam, warning that trade deals should not target or harm the interests of third parties.

This statement comes after US

President Donald Trump announced a trade deal with Vietnam, which includes a 20% tariff on Vietnamese exports to the US and a 40 per cent tariff on goods deemed to be transshipped through Vietnam.

The trade agreement, announced by Trump, aims to level the playing field for US businesses in Vietnam.

As per the deal, "20 pc tariff will be imposed on Vietnamese exports to the US, and 40 pc tariff on goods deemed to be transshipped through



The trade agreement will help provide Vietnam the US total access to its markets for trade, allowing US products to enter Vietnam at zero tariff. China is upset as the deal would ensure 40% tariff on transshipping that aims to prevent goods from third countries, particularly China, from being exported to the US through Vietnam.

In a post on Truth Social, Trump said the deal would open Vietnamese markets to American goods without any tariffs. As part of the agreement, Vietnam has also pledged to impose a 40% tariff on products that originate in other countries but are routed through Vietnam before being exported to the U.S.

Earlier, Trump had imposed a hefty 46% tariff on Vietnam, which would have impacted the supply chain of various products.

The US-Vietnam trade deal has sparked concerns about its potential impact on global trade.

### US strikes pushed Iranian N-plan by up to 2 years: Pentagon

Washington (UNI)

The Pentagon today said that US strikes last month on three key Iranian nuclear facilities have set back Tehran's nuclear program by as much as two years.

"We have degraded their program by one to two years, at least intel assessments inside the department assess that," Sean Parnell, a Pentagon spokesperson, said at a news briefing, without providing further de-

tails.

"All of the intelligence that we've seen led us to believe that Iran's, those facilities especially, have been completely obliterated," Parnell

On June 22, US forces bombed the three Iranian nuclear facilities of Natanz, Fordow, and Isfahan.

'No one exactly knows what has transpired in Forďow," Iranian Foreign Minister Seyed Abbas Araghchi

told CBS News in an interview Tuesday.
"What we know so far is that the

## Experts warn 'new era of drought' driven by climate change

Bucharest (Romania) (UNI)

Experts warn extreme heat and worsening drought conditions gripping large parts of Europe, signify a global pattern of new era of drought.

Extreme heat condition driven by climate change across Europe, fuelling wildfires and prompting urgent weather alerts across multiple countries, poses escalating threats to food security, ecosystems, and national economies, urging global

action and collaboration. Germany experienced what may have been its hottest day of the year on Wednesday, with temperatures forecast to reach 40 degrees Celsius, according to the German Weather Service, which has issued extreme heat warnings across much of the country and highlighted a rising risk



of wildfires, especially in the south-

Similar conditions have been reported across Central and Western Europe with Czech Republic, Poland, Prague, Slovakia, Croatia,

Romania and Netherland experience varying degrees of high temperature weathers, with multiple fire related accidents reported and alerts issued across the country. Southern Europe is faring no bet-

ter as Spain continues to endure a record-breaking heatwave, with June 2025 confirmed as the country's hottest month on record

Tragically, two farmers died on Tuesday in a wildfire that scorched 5,000 hectares in La Segarra, northeast Spain. Italy, Bosnia, Herzegovina have also issued orange weather alerts across the country,

A new report released on Wednesday, Drought Hotspots Around the World 2023-2025, presents a stark picture. Jointly prepared by the UN Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) and the US National Drought Mitigation Center (NDMC), the report warns that drought has become one of the most widespread and damaging crises of our time.

### **Indonesian Prez orders** immediate rescue of **Bali Strait ferry victims**

Jakarta: Indonesian Prabowo Subianto has ordered the National Search and Rescue Agency (Basarnas) to immediately rescue the passengers and crew of the interisland ferry Tunu Pratama Jaya, which sank in the Bali Strait due to severe weather.

Teddy Indra Wijaya, cabinet secretary, stated that the President issued the directive directly from Saudi Arabia, where he is performing the Umrah pilgrimage and undertaking an official visit.

From the Holy Land, he immediately instructed Basarnas and related agencies to initiate an emergency response and rescue the passengers and crew as quickly as possible,' Teddy said on Thursday.
