55-year-old man dies by suicide in Bhopal

Dispute over liquor consumption turns tragic

Bhopal: A 55-year-old man died by suicide late Sunday night in Shahpura's Saraswati Nagar area following a heated argument with his wife over money for alcohol. The incident occurred around 11:30 p.m.

According to Sub-Inspector MR Dhakad, the deceased, identified as Poonamchandra, son of Nathu, was formerly employed as a laborer but had been unemployed for the past year. His two sons were supporting the family financially. Poonamchandra was reportedly addicted to alcohol, and frequent disputes occurred at home due to his drinking habits. On Sunday evening, around 9 p.m., Poonamchandra asked his wife for money to buy liquor. She refused and advised him to go to sleep, which led to an argument. In a fit of anger, he locked himself in a separate room of their slum home.

When he didn't come out for a long time, his wife and sons became concerned. They knocked on the door, which was locked from inside. After forcing it open, they found him hanging. He was immediately taken to JP Hospital, where doctors declared him dead on arrival. The police were informed by hospital authorities. A case has been registered, and an investiga-

DPSS to siege MP Assembly on July 30

Demand 52% OBC quota and revival of student union polls
Bhopal: The Dalit Pichda Samaj Sangathan (DPSS) has announced a major protest on July 30, declaring plans to gherao the Madhya Pradesh Assembly in support of two key de mands: 52% reservation for OBCs and the reinstatement of student union elections. This decision was taken during a crucial meeting of the organization held in Bhopal DPSS National President Damoda Singh Yadav said that there would be no compromise on the reservation issue. He said that despite the Supreme Court's ceiling of 27%, OBCs currently receive only 14% reservation in Madhya Pradesh while social and caste census data justifies a 52% share. "If Scheduled Castes can get 16% and Scheduled Tribes 20%, why are OBCs denied their due?" he questioned.

Notorious fugitive 'Chikna' with sword captured by Teela Jamalpura Police

breakthrough, Bhopal's Teela Jamalpura Police have apprehended Mohammad Faizan alias Chikna (40), a notorious criminal with a Rs 2,000 bounty on his head, who had been evading capture for 18 months from Raisen Kotwali.

Acting on a tip-off, Teela Police received intelligence that Faizan was brazenly brandishing a sword in the Tila police station area. This

dangerous individual is linked to 23 criminal cases across Bhopal and Raisen, including serious charges of murder, assault, theft, extortion, and illegal weapons possession. Teela Jamalpura Police Station In-



dispatched a team. On July 13, 2025, officers swiftly moved in, cordoning off the area around Salman Baba Wali Gali, where Faizan was seen. The team successfully apprehended the armed fugitive.

Faizan was presented in court and has since been sent to jail. The arrest was made possible by the crucial efforts of Sub-Inspector Sabir Khan, Badri Prasad Vishwakarma, Ja-

gat Singh, Head Constable Naresh, Head Constable Nepal Singh, and other dedicated officers. Their quick response brought an end to this dangerous individual's time

Bhopal Metro trial begins at 90 kmph

Bhopal Metro has commenced at a speed of 90 kmph, covering the entire 6.22 km stretch from Subhash Nagar to AIIMS. This is the same speed expected during its commercial operations. To expedite the testing process, the number of metro trips has also been increased.

Simultaneously, progress is being made on completing unfinished work at metro stations—particularly at AIIMS, Alkapuri, and DRM Tiraha. Entry and exit infrastructure at these stations is being developed on priority. Authorities have set a September deadline to complete all

Only after receiving a satisfactory report from CMRS will passenger services officially begin on the Bhopal Metro line.

Taxi Union Strike causes disruption and fare hike Bhopal: The taxi union strike had a

mixed impact across the capital city. While union leaders claim that the wheels of 2,500 taxis have come to a halt, the ground reality appeared different. According to reports, only around 400 to 500 taxis joined the strike, with the rest continuing to operate as usual.

Passengers, however, felt the pressure. With fewer taxis available, many commuters turned to e-rickshaws and autos for transport. Several of these drivers took undue advantage of the situation, charging fares two to three times higher than normal. At Bhopal railway station, a passenger reported being charged Rs 80 for a trip from Jumerati Bazaar—a ride that usually costs Rs 35–40. Incentives stopped, subscription

Passengers bore the brunt of the strike, especially at major transit points like stations, airports, and bus stands, where transportation was available but at inflated rates. Despite this, no administrative monitoring was observed to regulate fares. Posters and pamphlets were put up city-wide to inform the public, and the protest continued from 11 AM to 5 PM at Ambedkar Maidan.

NSUI District President Akshay Tomar asserted this action is a "result of NSUI's struggle," but the university is "desperately trying to protect itself by backdating the order."
