

Two students drown during picnic outing

Bhopal: A joyous picnic at Kolar Dam turned to tragedy as two Bhopal students, Prince Singh and Ujjwal Tripathi, drowned after venturing into deep waters. Their friends' desperate cries for help shattered the festive atmosphere. After an arduous 18-hour search operation, police and SDRF teams recovered their bodies, casting a pall of grief over the community.

Fatal fun: Friends swept away

The devastating incident unfolded near Sehere at Kolar Dam. Four friends from Bhopal had gathered for a leisurely day, but the fun took a fatal turn when Prince Singh and Ujjwal Tripathi entered the water. Eyewitnesses recounted that the quartet was enjoying themselves before the two victims drifted into deeper sections of the dam and disappeared beneath the surface. Their friends' valiant attempts to rescue them proved futile.

Eighteen-hour ordeal: Bodies recovered

The grim search operation, a collaborative effort by Bilkisganj police and the SDRF team, lasted for eighteen grueling hours. On Monday, both bodies were finally

retrieved from the reservoir. Prince Singh, a student from Balaji College, Bihar, and Ujjwal Tripathi, from IAS College, Chhatarpur, were among the group, which also included Shailendra Dhakad and Satyam Patel. The friends had ventured approximately 1.5 kilometers

into the forest after climbing the dam's embankment before deciding to swim.

Police confirmed that the victims drowned due to entering deep water. Their companions immediately alerted authorities, prompting Bilkisganj Station In-charge Sandeep Meena and his team to rush to the scene, quickly joined by the SDRF. A search operation was launched without delay, leading to the recovery of the students' bodies by afternoon. A case has been registered, and investigations are underway.

This tragic event has sent shockwaves through the area, leaving the students' families in profound grief. Police are urging the public to exercise extreme caution when swimming in reservoirs, emphasizing the importance of avoiding deep waters and adhering to safety guidelines to prevent future tragedies.

Tyrannical attack on peaceful protestors: Jitu Patwari

Police brutality in Harda

Bhopal: In Harda district of Madhya Pradesh, the brutal actions of the police against the peaceful demonstrators of Karni Sena and the Rajput community are deeply condemnable, inhumane, and a blatant violation of democratic values. This incident once again highlights that under the government of Chief Minister Mohan Yadav, advocating for justice and rights has effectively become a criminal act.

The police response, involving lathi charges, water cannons, arrests, and threats, demonstrates that the government is willing to go to any lengths to suppress the voice of the people. What is particularly alarming is the fact that the demonstrators included senior citizens, women, and young peo-

ple—who were all subjected to forceful attacks.

 - ◆ All charges filed against the peaceful protestors must be dropped immediately.
- The Congress party has always stood by the voice of the people, the Constitution, and the pursuit of justice—and will continue to do so.

Six state speakers converge in Bhopal

Committee to streamline legislative processes concludes first meet

Bhopal: In a significant move towards enhancing legislative efficiency, the first meeting of the Committee of Presiding Officers, chaired by Madhya Pradesh Assembly Speaker Narendra Singh Tomar, concluded in Bhopal on Monday. The gathering brought together Speakers from six Indian states with the crucial objective of reviewing and refining the committee system within the nation's legislative assemblies.

The high-level meeting saw the active participation of Uttar Pradesh Assembly Speaker Satish Mahana, Rajasthan's Vasudev Devnani, Himachal Pradesh's Kuldeep Singh Pathania, Sikkim's Mingma Norbu Sherpa, Odisha's Surma Padhi, and West Bengal's Biman Banerjee.

Prior to the formal discussions, all attending Speakers collectively engaged in a symbolic tree plantation drive within the Assembly premises, conveying a powerful message of environmental conservation.

This committee, comprising presiding officers from seven states, was established under the umbrella of the National Presiding Officers' Conference. Its core mandate is to ensure that the functioning of committees within



legislative assemblies becomes more effective and coordinated across the country.

The crucial minutes and conclusions drawn from this inaugural meeting are set to be presented to the Lok Sabha. The ultimate aim is to implement the recommendations as a new, standardized system across all legislative assemblies in India, fostering greater accountability and efficiency in parliamentary procedures.

MP Police statewide anti-drug campaign from today

Bhopal: To make Madhya Pradesh a drug-free state, the Police Department has launched a state-wide public awareness campaign titled "Drug Se Doori – Hai Ja-roori", which will run from 15 to 30 July 2025. The initiative is being spearheaded by the Narcotics Wing of the Police Headquarters under the guidance of Director General of Police Kailash Makwana.

Additional Director General of Police (Narcotics) K. P. Venkateswara Rao informed that the campaign aims to educate adolescents and youth about the harmful effects of drug abuse, prevent addiction, and rehabilitate those already affected through counseling and support.

The campaign will see active participation from government departments, NGOs, religious leaders, social workers, public representatives, and security committees of villages and cities. Awareness programs will be conducted in schools, colleges, public places, and via digital media.

The core message is that drug addiction harms not just the individual but the entire society, and collective efforts are crucial to combat it.

SEIAA chairman's office sealed, reopened amidst fiery accusations

War on corruption

Bhopal: The office of Shiv-narayan Singh Chouhan, Chairman of the State Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA), was sealed and then rapidly reopened on Monday in Bhopal, sparking a furious row. Chairman Chouhan immediately blasted the move as retaliation for exposing widespread corruption in environmental clearances. While senior officials intervened to reopen the office by evening, the incident has ignited a full-blown scandal.

The initial sealing was reportedly ordered by Dr. Navneet Mohan Kothari, Principal Secretary of the Environment Department. However, the official explanation from APCO's administrative officer, Manohar Patil, cited an "electrical fault" on Sunday, July 13th, as the reason for temporarily closing the chairman's and other senior officers' rooms. These rooms, according to Patil, were reopened on Monday after preliminary repairs.

Chairman Chouhan fiercely refutes this, alleging the sealing was a direct attack after he uncovered corruption in environmental ap-

provals. He accused Principal Secretary

Kothari and APCO Member Secretary R. Uma Maheshwari of flagrantly violating rules by granting approvals to 237 select projects

without any SEIAA meeting, despite over 450 files pending. Chouhan revealed the SEIAA hadn't met for 65 days, and upon finding his office locked, was told he was not allowed to sit there. He promptly escalated the matter by writing to Chief Secretary Anurag Jain.

Chouhan declared that environmental clearances granted without the authorized committee's approval are illegal, carrying a potential five-year prison sentence. He has formally petitioned the central government and the Chief Minister, demanding FIRs against the culprits. This conflict reportedly began on May 23rd, when APCO's In-charge Member Secretary, Shriman Shukla, issued "deemed environmental clearances" for over 450 cases, including more than 200 related to the mining department, with the Principal Secretary's approval. Chouhan had previously objected to this and escalated his concerns to the Union Environment Ministry.

Govindpura Civil Hospital to become modern healthcare hub

Bhopal: Minister of State for Backward Classes and Minority Welfare, Krishna Gaur announced that the Govindpura Government Civil Hospital in Hathaikheda will be developed as a modern, dedicated health center to cater to more than five lakh residents. She made the statement while presiding over the Rogi Kalyan Samiti meeting on Monday.

Gaur emphasized the hospital's expansion into an ideal model facility with accessible and quality healthcare. She instructed staff to prioritize women's health and behave sensitive-

ly towards patients. To enhance services, modern equipment, computers, sheets, and stationery will be arranged using CSR funds. A dedicated unit for biomedical waste disposal and systems for smooth Aabha ID generation will also be established.

Plans to construct staff quarters and link medical students for internships were discussed. Smt. Gaur noted this would strengthen human resources and give students hands-on experience. She also directed that

fire safety systems be upgraded through the Police Housing Corporation and the necessary NOC be secured from the Municipal Corporation. Increased night police patrolling and adequate nursing staff in all critical units were mandated.

Currently, the 100-bed hospital operates with 11 doctors and 20 nurses. More staff and modern resources will be added soon.
