Post ISS mission, Shukla in good health

Chennai: The health condition of decorated piot Shubhanshu Shukla, who became the first Indian astronaut to travel to International Space Station and returned after a 18-day stay, was stable and in good health, ISRO said today. After Gaganyatri Shubhanshu Shukla was extracted by SpaceX's recovery teams on July 15, 2025, preliminary health checks were carried out at recovery ship. Initial health assessments indicated that Gaganyatri Shukla was in stable condition with no immediate concerns reported. He was airlifted by helicopter from the recovery ship to the mainland for further medical evaluations and debriefing sessions.

One killed, two injured after Goods train hits workers at Rayagada Yard

Bhubaneswar: One contractual labourer was killed and two others, including a trolley man, sustained minor injuries after being hit by a goods train at the Rayagada railway yard today morning. According to East Coast Railway (ECoR) sources, the incident occurred when an umbrella attached to a push trolley got entangled with a moving goods wagon. The trolley was positioned between Line No. 4 and 5 and was not on any active track. Tragically, one contractual labourer was struck by the train and died on the

Bhopal: Amidst heavy rainfall, a major section of road in MP Nagar, one of Bhopal's busiest areas, dramatically collapsed. A gaping sinkhole, approximately 8 feet deep and 10 feet wide and large enough to swallow a car, suddenly appeared on the

main thoroughfare.

The incident occurred around 1 PM on Thursday. Fortunately, no vehicles or pedestrians were passing by at the exact moment of the collapse, averting what could have been a catastrophic accident.

The affected road, which leads from Board Office towards MP Nagar, is a critical artery for the city. The sinkhole immediately caused severe traffic congestion. ED raids 14 locations in Mumbai, UP in Chhangur Baba conversion case

Enforcement Directorate (ED) sleuths launched raids at 14 places across Uttar Pradesh and Maharashtra today early morning in connection with Chhangur Baba alias Jalaluddin, the mastermind of religious conversions in Uttar Pradesh.

Sources said the raid started from 5 am at 12 locations of Balrampur and 2 places in Mumbai.

The ED has taken action in the case of illegal funding of Rs 100 crore, sources added.

The searches come following ED's formal investigation against Jamaluddin alias Chhangur Baba, who faces serious allegations related to religious conversions, misuse of foreign funds, and activities that could potentially threaten national security and disturb communal harmony.



New Delhi: The Supreme Court to day expressed strong reservations over a petition seeking the registration of a First Information Report (FIR) against sitting judges of the Delhi High Court for their judicial de-

A bench comprising justices Surya Kant and Joymalya Bagchi ques-tioned the maintainability of the plea and asked the petitioner's counsel under what law judges could be prosecuted for delivering judgments.

Tell us under which law judges are liable to be prosecuted for giving judgments against you. Just because there are illegal or perverse petitions being filed, you cannot ask for FIRs against judges," the bench observed.
