### IndiGo Flight From Ahmedabad **Reports Engine Fire Before** Takeoff; All Passengers Safe

Ahmedabad: An IndiGo flight carrying 60 passengers from Ahmed-abad to Diu aborted takeoff at Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport when one of its engines caught fire during the takeoff roll. Thanks to the quick response of the flight crew, a Mayday call was issued immediately, and the aircraft was evacuated safely before it could leave the ground. IndiGo confirmed the incident was caused by a technical malfunction and that the plane would undergo thorough maintenance before returning to service. The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has launched a formal inquiry as this incident forms part of a recent rise in technical issues in India's aviation sector.

### Three arrested with arms in J&K's Bandipora, case lodged under UAPA

Srinagar; Security forces apprehended three individuals in Jammu and Kashmir's Bandipora district late Tuesday night and recovered arms and ammunition from their possession, officials said on Tuesday. The arrests were made at a checkpoint jointly set up by security forces. According to officials, the suspects attempted to flee upon spotting the naka, prompting a swift chase by personnel. "All three individuals were arrested and some arms and ammunition was recovered from their possession, " officials said. A case has been registered at Police Station Aragam under relevant sections of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UA-PA). Further investigation is currently underway.

### Three militants nabbed in Manipur

Imphal: Manipur Police apprehended three militants in a crackdown on insurgent activities in the state. An active cadre of PREPAK (Pro) was arrested today from Imphal West district. "From his disclosure two other persons were also apprehended from their respective residences from Imphal West. Their mobile phones and wallets were seized for investigation," police said.

### Heavy rains lash Delhi-NCR, IMD issues red alert

New Delhi: Heavy rains battered parts of Delhi-NCR today morning, causing waterlogging and traffic disruptions. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a red alert for the region, warning of moderate to heavy showers, thunderstorms, and gusty winds reaching speeds upto 30-40 kmph. Localities falling under the red alert include Preet Vihar, Shahdara, Seelampur, Vivek Vihar, Ghaziabad, Noida, Faridabad, Palwal, Hodal, Aligarh, Bulandshahr, and Mathura. An orange alert has also been issued for northwest and southwest Delhi, along with neighbouring regions in Haryana and Rajasthan, where light to moderate rain is expected.

# Gujarat ATS busts Al-Qaeda Module

### Four terror suspects arrested in multi-state operation

New Delhi: In a significant triumph against terrorism, the Gujarat Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATS) has disman-tled a module linked to the banned terror organization Al-Qaeda in the Indian Subcontinent (AQIS), arresting four individuals in a coordinated operation spanning Gujarat, Delhi, and Uttar Pradesh.

The arrests were made following simultaneous raids in Gandhinagar and Ahmedabad (Gujarat), Delhi, and Noida (Uttar Pradesh). Two of the apprehended suspects hail from Gujarat, one from Delhi, and another from Noida.

According to sources, all four suspects are between 20 and 25 years old. Preliminary investigations by the ATS indicate that these individuals were radicalized by Al-Qaeda's ideology and maintained contact through social media and suspicious applications. They were actively engaged in spreading extremist propaganda online and allegedly plotting terror attacks at multiple key locations across India. Tĥe objective, sources suggest, was to carry out bombings at vital installations.

The ATS suspects that their network extends to cross-border terror

# Modi embarks on four-day visit to UK,

New Delhi (UNI) Prime Minister Narendra Modi today embarked on his four-day visit to the United Kingdom and the Maldives, expressing hope that the tour will bolster economic growth and deepen bilateral ties.

"Leaving for UK, a country with which our Comprehensive Strategic Partnership has achieved significant momentum in the last few years. I look forward to my talks with PM Keir Starmer and my meeting with His Majesty King Charles III," Modi said in his departure comments on X.

He said that with the UK, "our collaboration spans a wide range of sectors, including trade, investment, technology, innovation, defence, education, research, sustainability, health, and people-to-people ties."

## Parliament disrupted for third straight day amid ruckus

For the third consecutive day today, both Houses of Parliament were adjourned after Opposition members created a ruckus in sup-port of their demands, including demanding withdrawal of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the electoral rolls in Bihar. As soon as the Lok Sabha re-

sumed at 2 PM, presiding officer Krishna Prasad Tenneti began the proceedings, but the Opposition members stormed into the well of

the House shouting slogans.

Appealing to the protesting members, Tenneti asked them to allow the House to consider the important bill related to the reservation of seats for Scheduled Tribe members in the Goa Legislative As-

### Rahul Gandhi presses Modi on Trump's ceasefire claims

New Delhi: Rahul Gandhi, Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha, today intensified his criticism of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, questioning his persistent silence on President Donald Trump's repeated as-sertions of mediating a ceasefire between India and Pakistan.

Speaking to reporters, Gandhi highlighted Trump's numerous claims, "What statement will the Prime Minister give? He can't say Trump mediated the ceasefire. But the truth is, Trump did, and the world knows it." Gandhi emphasized that Trump has claimed credit over 25 times, vet Modi has offered

no response. "Who is Trump to broker a ceasefire? That's not his job. Yet, Modi hasn't answered. You can't run from this truth."

The Congress leader pointed to a perceived contradiction: "On one hand, the government says 'Operation Sindoor' is ongoing, while simultaneously celebrating victory. Meanwhile, Trump keeps saying he brokered, the ceasefire Clearly. brokered the ceasefire. Clearly, something is amiss." The situation worsened on July 14, when Dr. Kothari had the SIYA of-The matter quickly escalated to Chief Secretary Anurag Jain, who informed
