MP's youth bear brunt of digital fraud

Cybercriminals' prime target

Bhopal: Cyber fraudsters in Madhya Pradesh have predominantly targeted the state's youth over the past four years, a concerning trend revealed by Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav in a written response to a legislative query. Responding to a question from BJP MLA Riti Pathak, Dr. Yadav provided a detailed breakdown of cy-bercrime incidents: 1021 cases were registered in 2022, followed by 927 in 2023, a rise to 1082 in 2024, and 511 cases so far in 2025. The data further highlights the specific demographics affected. In 2022, 717 young individuals, 83 senior citizens, and 221 from other categories fell victim to these crimes. The pattern continued in 2023, with 700 young people, 62 elderly in-

dividuals, and 165 others impacted. The year 2024 saw 703 youth, 103 seniors, and 276 others affected. As of 2025, 344 young individuals, 31 elderly, and 276 from other groups have been targeted. Across all these years, misuse of social media emerged as the most prevalent form of cybercrime, accounting for 542 cases in 2022, 428 in 2023, 396 in 2024, and 242 cases in 2025. To combat this growing threat, a dedicated Cyber and High-Tech Crime Police Station operates under the Cyber Police Headquarters in Bhopal. This is further supported by four zonal cyber offices located in Indore, Ujjain, Gwalior, and Jabalpur, working to address the evolving landscape of digital offenses.

3 held for youth's murder at birthday party

Bhopal: A youth was brutally stabbed to death late Sunday night in the Banjari area of Kolar, Bhopal. The incident was reportedly the result of an old dispute that occurred during a birthday party a few days earlier. Police have arrested all three accused in the case. The deceased, Shuhham Yaday (23) son of Mor Shubham Yadav (23), son of Mor Singh Yadav, was originally from Sehore's Kotwali police station

He had been living in Gaurav Nagar, Kolar, and working as a driver. According to Kolar police, Shubham had a quarrel on July 22 with Bhupendra Malviya, his elder brother Golu Malviya, and their neighbor Akash during a friend's birthday celebration. JP Hospital's dental unit upgrade tender cancelled Bhopal: The long-awaited dream of receiv-

ing high-level heart and dental treatment at Bhopal's JP Hospital has once again been dashed. After the cancellation of the cardiac unit tender, the tender for upgrading the dental unit has also been scrapped. As a result, patients will continue to face long waits at Hamidia Hospital and AIIMS for advanced care. Deputy Chief Minister Rajendra Shukla had earlier cited technical issues for the cardiac unit tender cancellation and assured the public that a new tender would soon be issued. Similarly, a Rs 6 crore proposal to upgrade JP Hospital's dental unit had been approved two years ago. The plan included installing 55 modern machines, developing a dedicated OT and wards, and starting advanced dental surgeries. Though construction had begun,

the equipment purchase tender was abruptly cancelled.

Dental dept lacks specialist doctors

Currently, the dental department lacks specialist doctors, offering only basic procedures like root canal, fillings, and extrac tions. Even for these, patients often wait 2–3 weeks. Complex cases—4 to 5 daily are referred elsewhere due to limited facilities. The new unit was to include services like wisdom tooth surgery, jaw fracture treatment, pediatric dental nerve care, permanent cavity fillings, and oral-maxillofacial surgeries. However, with the project stalled, these plans remain on paper. Civil was unaware of the current status and said the unit was being upgraded by NHM.
