2 children die after inhaling toxic gas, parents critical



Shivpuri: A heart-wrenching incident occurred on Monday night in Malbarve village, under the Bhatnavar outpost of Shivpuri district in Madhya Pradesh. Four members of a single family were exposed to poiso-

nous gas, resulting in the deaths of two young children. The parents are currently in critical condition and are being treated at the district hos-

Sudden Deterioration of Health: Ac-

cording to reports, Girraj Dhakad (30), a resident of Malbarve, had placed pesticide tablets in a room where wheat was stored three days earlier. It is suspected that the pesticide released toxic gas over time.

On Monday night, Girraj, his wife Poonam (28), and their two children-Adhik (3) and Manvi (5)slept in the same room, unaware of the danger. In the middle of the night, all four family members suddenly fell ill. The family attempted to rush little Adhik to the district hospital, but he tragically died on the way. Manvi passed away in the village itself. The parents were initially taken to Pohri Health Center in critical condition and later referred to the district hospital for further treatment. The incident has cast a shadow of grief over the village, as residents mourn the untimely deaths of two innocent children.

Two arrested from UP's Banda in minor kidnapping and rape case

Minor-Kidnapping-Rape-Arrests-Gwalior



Gwalior: Police have successfully apprehended two individuals from Banda, Uttar Pradesh, in connection with the kidnapping and rape of a minor girl. The victim, who was rescued in May, revealed in her Section 164 statement to the court that she was held

captive in a house in Banda and repeatedly sexually assaulted. One of the arrested suspects is reportedly the victim's self-proclaimed "uncle

Accused identified as brick kiln worker, accomplice "Uncle": The case originated on May 1, 2025, when a family from Gwalior's Utila police station area, who work at a brick kiln, returned home to find their 16-year-old daughter missing. Inquiries with relatives and friends yielded no information, prompting a missing person's complaint. Police investigation revealed that Anand Singh Parihar, a fellow brick kiln worker from Devkher Pauhar, Banda, UP, was also unac-During the search in Banda, police

located the minor girl, though Ananc initially evaded capture. In her court statement, the victim disclosed being held hostage and subjected to forced sexual relations. She also identified Guddu Verma, Anand Parihar's self proclaimed "uncle," as someone who intimidated her. Following her testimony, police registered a case of kidnapping and rape. Both Anand Singh and Guddu Verma, from Badausa Banda, UP, have now been arrested and brought to Gwalior. Police are proceeding with their committal to jail.

10-foot-long crocodiles spotted roaming city at 2 AM in Shivpuri

Shivpuri: Residents of Shivpuri were left stunned and alarmed when two massive crocodiles, each measuring nearly 10 feet in length, were seen strolling casually down Barf Factory Road in the early hours of Monday. The incident occurred around 2 AM near the Vishnu Temple, en route to Old Shivpuri — a densely populated and frequently traveled area just 200 me-

Eyewitnesses say the crocodiles appeared com-pletely unfazed as they roamed freely on one of the city's main roads, causing panic among locals. The sighting has reignited safety concerns in the area, especially as such incidents have become increasingly common over the years.

According to local residents, a drain near the road has long been home to several crocodiles — with sightings of over a dozen reported in recent years. These reptiles often venture onto the streets at night, posing a serious threat to public safety.

The nearby Sakhya Sagar Lake, which is part of the



Madhav National Park, is home to more than 2,000 crocodiles. Experts believe that through the city's drainage system, these crocodiles find their way into urban neighborhoods. In recent years, crocodiles have been spotted in various parts of Shivpuri, including Thandi Sadak, Barf Factory Road, Purani Shivpuri, Chhatri Road, Mahal Colony, and Rambagh Colony.

Brutal murder of elderly woman sparks panic

Jabalpur: Panic spread in Jabalpur after the brutal murder of a 70woman Jayaprakash Narayan Ward area under the jurisdiction of Kotwali Police Station. The deceased, identified as Hirabai Chaudhary, was found with her hands and feet tied, raising suspicions of a targeted and premeditated attack.

According to police sources, two young girls who were staying with the elderly woman were also found with their hands and feet bound. It is suspected that the girls may have recognized the as-sailants, which could be a key lead in the investigation.

The incident came to light early in the morning when the victim's family members arrived at the house and discovered the gruesome scene. They immediately in-

spot and initiated an investigation. Preliminary statements from the family suggest that the murder may have been the result of an old enmity. A neighbor has reportedly

been named as a possible suspect The police have registered a case and sent the body for postmortem examination. Investiga tions are ongoing, with multiple angles being explored to ascertain the motive and identify those involved in the heinous crime.

Man alleges imprisonment and harassment by ASI wife

Gwalior: In a shocking case from Gwalior, a man has accused his Assistant Sub-Inspec tor (ASI) wife of holding him captive as a ʻghar jamai" (live-in son-in-law) and subjecting him to severe harassment. The victim, Sanjeev Kumar, lodged a complaint at the Superintendent of Police (SP) office during a public hearing, detailing his ordeal. His wife, Neelam Bhatnagar, is an ASI with the 14th Battalion of the SAF in Gwalior.

Husband claims house arrest and false case threats: Sanjeev claims that for over a year, his wife has kept him confined to her home. After finally escaping, he alleges she is now threatening to implicate him in false cases. Police officials have assured Sanjeev of swift action following his complaint. According to Sanjeev, who resides in Rachna



Nagar, his marriage to Neelam took place on April 10, 2024, and they have a son. He states

that his wife only stayed at his marital home for eight days before moving back to her parents' residence in Murar, forcing him to live there as well. Sanjeev alleges that his wife would create a scene, verbally abuse him, and use offensive language towards his family whenever he tried to visit his parents. When he protested, she and her two brothers allegedly threatened him. The harassment intensified, with constant verbal abuse over the phone if he contacted his family.

Sanjeev, now at his breaking point, has provided audio recordings and CCTV footage as evidence. He has pleaded with the police for intervention, stating he would rather die if no action is taken. Authorities have instructed the police station to investigate and act on his application.

Two-year-old drowns in canal, village mourns

Shahdol: A pall of grief has descended upon Chandola village in Shahdol district's Deo laond police station area after a heartbreaking incident on Tuesday. A two-year-old girl Priyanshi, daughter of Pappu Kol, tragically drowned in a canal, leaving her family and the entire community in profound shock. Child wandered from home while parents worked in fields According to reports, Priyanshi's parents were engaged in paddy transplantation in a nearby field at the time of the incident. The toddler was at home, under the care of her elderly grandparents. While playing, she inadvertently wandered towards a nearby canal, slipped, and was swept away by the current.

Umaria: A disturbing case of wildlife crime has surfaced from the Dhamokhar Range of Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve (BTR), where a tiger was brutally poached by a group of five

others currently on the run. Among the arrested is Hardul Baiga, who confessed during interrogation that he, along with four accomplices, killed the tiger.

A raid at Baiga's residence in Rohaniya vil-

tooth, and three additional teeth. These grim findings have not only shaken the forest department but also sparked outrage among wildlife conservationists and the general public. Forest officials presented Hardul Baiga in court on Monday, where he was remanded for further questioning. Based on his statements, two more suspects have been taken into custody, and joint interrogation is ongoing. Authorities are also searching for the tools used in the poaching and additional evidence related to the crime.

Dr. Anupam Sahay, Field Director of Band havgarh, confirmed that the suspects have admitted to the killing and revealed crucial details during questioning. Investigations are now focused on pinpointing the exact loca-

tion and circumstances of the poaching. Regional Deputy Director P.K. Verma emphasized that the case is being treated with utmost seriousness under various provisions of the Wildlife Protection Act. He assured that strict legal action will be taken against all involved. This shocking incident highlights the persistent threat to India's endangered wildlife and underscores the urgent need for stronger surveillance and community awareness in and around protected forest areas.

Romantic dance of cobra pair draws massive crowd in Tikamgarh

Tikamgarh: In a breathtaking display of nature's wonder, villagers in Ranipura, Tikamgarh, were witness to a rare and mesmerizing spectacle on the occasion of Nag Panchami. A pair of snakes — believed to be a male and female cobra - were seen entwined in a striking, almost choreographed embrace, capturing the attention of hundreds.

The scene unfolded in broad daylight during the sacred month of Sawan, a time considered especially auspicious in Hindu tradition. As word spread, crowds of villagers rushed to witness the snake pair's graceful "dance," many capturing the moment on their mobile phones. The video has since gone viral on social media, stirring cu-



riosity and awe. According to Hindu beliefs, sighting a pair of snakes during Sawan — especially on Nag Panchami — is considered highly

auspicious, symbolizing harmony in nature, impending prosperity, and good monsoon rains. Locals described the scene as a divine sign, with some calling it a rare natural phenomenon and others interpreting it as a spiritual blessing. Eyewitnesses say the snakes appeared to be "locked in a loving embrace," displaying a hypnotic, spiral-like movement — a behavior often linked to mating rituals in snakes. The spectacle left many stunned, with onlookers silently watching what they called a "celestial performance of nature.

The incident has sparked widespread discussion and fascination both online and in the region, becoming a topic of spiritual reflection as well as scientific curiosity.
