Nitin Jaiswal, a resident of Shahzerpur village in Phoolpur, Azamgarh, had been living with his maternal grandparents in Ganpatpur since the death of his father Dharmendra Jaiswal before his birth.

Monsoon havoc deepens in Himachal

3 dead, public utilities crippled as Mandi receives 198.6 mm rainfall

Relentless monsoon fury continues to devastate Himachal Pradesh, claiming three more lives in Mandi town early Tuesday and leaving a trail of destruction across multiple districts.

With 14 people rescued from a submerged building, the monsoon death toll has now climbed to 167, with 34 people still missing since the

rains began on June 20.

Mandi recorded a staggering 198.6 mm rainfall in the last 24 hours, the highest in the state, prompting flash floods and land-

A building near Jail Road was flooded with muck and silt-laden water around 3 AM, trapping its oc-cupants. Three people died in the in-cident, while 14 others were rescued after a prompt operation by local au-

This comes weeks after cloud-



bursts in Bugshaid and Tunag devastated the town on June 30 and July 1.

Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu expressed deep grief over the deaths caused by the cloud-bursts and said that district officers

reached the site immediately to supervise rescue and relief efforts. He directed the administration to provide all possible assistance to the affected families and assured them of the government's full support.

Heavy rainfall affects life in Manipur

Imphal: Heavy rainfall lashed the state, affecting normal lives.

Hundreds of families were affected as their houses were inundated by water specially in Imphal West, Imphal East, Thoubal, Sena-pati, Bishnupur, Kakching dis-

According to a state official, about 24 to 26 mm rainfall was recorded in the state.

According to a resident of Wangkhei the problems were largely due to the absence of a proper drainage system, which has resulted in waterlogging. The water has to be drained out using pumps, he added.

Some roads were also under water; hence, traffic was diverted.

Special Court set to rule on 2008 **Malegaon Bombing Thursday**



Mumbai (UNI)

Nearly 17 years after a fatal explosion tore through the communally sensitive town of Malegaon, a special National Investigation Agency (NIA) court will finally deliver its verdict this Thursday, July 31.

The 2008 blast, occurring on September 29 during the holy month of

Navratri festival eve, claimed six lives and left 100 others injured in the Muslim-majority town in Maharashtra's Nashik district.

The protracted legal journey reaches a pivotal moment after the court reserved its orders on April 19. While initially directing the seven accused to appear on May 8 for the judgement, the pronouncement was subsequently rescheduled for July

The complex investigation saw initial handling by the Maharashtra Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS), led by the late Special Inspector General Hemant Karkare, who was later killed during the 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks. The ATS filed its chargesheet in 2009.

Vadodara boat capsize: SC orders Rs 1.2 crore compensation for harni lake Boat tragedy victims

The Supreme Court today directed that over Rs 1.2 crore deposited by M/s Kotia Projects, the contractor operating at Harni Lake in Vadodara, be disbursed to the families of 12 children and 2 teachers who died in a tragic boat capsize incident on January 18, 2024. A Bench comprising Justice BV Nagarathna and Justice KV Viswanathan stayed Gujarat High Court's full liability order which held the contractor fully liable.

The bench recorded the statement of the senior counsel for the petitioner-firm that they had deposited Rs 81,99,664 and Rs 30,74,880 with the Deputy Collector, Vadodara, and had no objection to the amount being distributed to the bereaved families.

Five TN fishermen arrested by SL Navy

Chennai: In yet another instance, five Tamil Nadu fishermen were arrested by the Sri Lankan Navy today for fishing in their territorial waters, even as Chief Minister M K Stalin, expressing deep anguish over the continuance of such incidents, urged External Affairs Minister (EAM) Dr S Jaishankar to take diplomatic steps to secure their release along with their boats. Police said the five fishermen, hailing from Rameswaram in Ramanathapuram districts, were fishing near Neduntheevu on the high seas, when they were arrested by the Lankan Navy personnel for crossing the International Maritime Boundary Line (IM-BL) and fishing in their waters. The fishermen had ventured into the sea last night when they were arrested this morning and their mechanised boat was seized by the Lankan Navy and

The ruling BJP's ally in Tripura government, TIPRA Motha, today staged a protest rally in Asarambari in Khowai district, demanding the release of three of its supporters who were remanded to police custody for attacking a BJP gathering on July 27

Local BJP leaders alleged that the TIPRA Motha leadership was pressuring the homeowner, where the BJP program was held and attacked, to withdraw the FIR filed against a group of TIPRA Motha workers, including the three detained individuals.
According to local sources, anoth-

er group of Motha supporters has also been threatening the victim's family to withdraw from the legal fight. This comes after Motha founder Pradyot Kishore Debbarman, during a Facebook Live session, urged tribal communities to unite for his mission to secure the rights and privileges of indigenous people.

UP set to become first state to get AI-driven road safety experiment

Lucknow: Uttar Pradesh is going to be the first state in the country for an AI-driven road-safety experiment. The Ministry of Road Transport & Highways (MoRTH), Government of India, has issued a formal No-Objection for the Uttar Pradesh Transport Department's Artificial-Intelligence (AI) and Big-Data Analytics-based Road-Safety Pilot Project.

This is the first AI-driven road-safety experiment ever undertaken by a state transport department in the country. The pilot project will be implemented at zero cost (Pro Bono) by the public-sector enterprise ITI Limited in partnership with the global technology firm mLogica. The UP government has already ear-marked Rs 10 crore in its 2025-26 budget to establish a 'data-driven administrative model' for the Transport Department, officials said today.

Former minister Khadse slams govt, police over rave party allegations

Former Maharashtra Minister Eknath Khadse has launched a scathing attack on the state government and police, questioning the legitimacy of calling a private gathering of seven people a 'rave party'.

"There was no music, no lighting,

no dancing. If this is what defines a rave party, then even a group of five to seven people at any home would be considered a rave party," Khadse said, addressing a press conference.

Khadse expressed outrage over police surveillance despite having never used narcotics. "Why are the police keeping tabs on me? Even during my press conference, two plainclothed officers were present. I even saw police standing outside my house. Are they going to sit on my shoulders now?" he asked sarcasti-



cally.

Referring to the recent case involving his son-in-law Pranjal Khewalkar, Khadse claimed that the socalled rave party was a planned conspiracy to malign his image. "Why am I being defamed to such an extent? What exactly is the reason behind this campaign?" he questioned.

Suvendu confident about deletion of several names from voters' list after SIR in Bengal

Throwing an open challenge to West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, Leader of the Opposition Suvendu Adhikari asserted that a large number of names would be deleted from the state's voters' list following the Special Intensive Revi-

Speaking at a press conference to-day, Adhikari said, "No one will be able to stop the removal of 'illegal' and 'fake' names from the voter list."

"The chief minister is saying that no names will be removed. I am saying names will be removed, Names of Rohingyas, Bangladeshi infiltrators, deceased voters, voters listed in multiple places, and fake voters cre-ated by TMC will not remain on the voter list under any circumstances.



All these names will definitely be struck off," he said.

Clarifying his reference to "infil-trators," the BJP MLA from Nandigram said that Hindus, Buddhists, Jains, Sikhs, and Christians who had

bouring countries were not infiltrators, and would be granted Indian citizenship under the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA).

Adhikari's remarks came a day after Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee warned Block Level Officers (BLOs), who are overseeing the SIR process, not to harass people. She also cautioned that anyone tampering with names or attempting to erase identities

would face serious consequences. Claiming that Trinamool did not win any election from 2019 to 2024 on genuine public support but relied on these fake voters to secure victories, Adhikari said, in these 10 years, voter numbers have increased by 30 per cent in 80 assembly constituencies across the state which is abnormal.

City mosques halt Fajr Azan loudspeakers

Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar: Mosque committees across Aurangabad have unanimously decided to suspend the use of loudspeakers for the pre-dawn Fajr Azan at nearly all city mosques. ThE action implements the Supreme Court's directive prohibiting widespread religious calls using loudspeakers between 10 pm and 6 am.

The landmark decision follows intensive consultations between Police Commissioner Praveen Pawar and religious leaders, forging an amicable solution to a potentially contentious issue. It comes in response to the Supreme Court's May 13 vertical to the Supreme Court's May 14 vertical to the Supreme Court May 14 vertical to the Supreme Court's Ma dict, which imposed time restrictions on loudspeaker use for religious purposes to balance fundamental religious rights with citizens' right to undisturbed rest during night hours.

Commissioner Pawar had proactively issued comprehensive instructions to all religious institutions, including mosques, temples, gurud waras and churches, urging voluntary compliance with the court's or-

Demonstrating early initiative, many mosque committees removed external loudspeakers between July 22 and July 24, even before formal implementation began. Religious leaders acknowledged the legal requirement, expressing their commitment to maintaining the sanctity of the call to prayer through alternative
