5 dead, 100 missing in Dharali landslide

Dehradun (UNI)
At least five people have reportedly died and around 100 villagers are reported missing following a cloudburst that triggered flash floods in the Dharali area of Uttarkashi district in Uttarakhand today, local authorities and state disaster relief sources said. The cloudburst occurred in the catchment area of the Kheer Ganga river, sources said.
Prime Minister Narendra Modi has promised all possible assistance from the Central government. Uttarakhand Chief Minister stated in a post on X: "Relief and rescue operations are underway by the district administration, Indian Army, NDRF, and SDRF teams in the affected areas of Dharali (Uttarkashi). People are being evacuated to safe locations on a priority basis, and the situation is being continuously monitored. The administration is fully alert and providing all possible assistance to the affected citizens."
Shocking visuals have surfaced, showing a strong stream of water flowing down a hill towards Dharali village in Uttarakshi, sweeping away many houses. The Uttarkashi police posted pictures of the destruction and urged people to maintain a safe distance from rivers.
"Upon receiving information about damage in Dharali due to the rising water level of the Khir Gad, disaster response teams including the police, SDRF, and Army have been deployed for relief and



rescue work," the state police said in a social media post on X.
"Everyone in the area is advised to maintain a safe distance from the river and ensure that children and animals stay away from water," police added.

The Chief Minister said Prime Minister Narendra Modi has been informed over the phone about the situation. He was briefed about the relief and rescue operations being carried out by the state government, SDRF, Army, and other res-

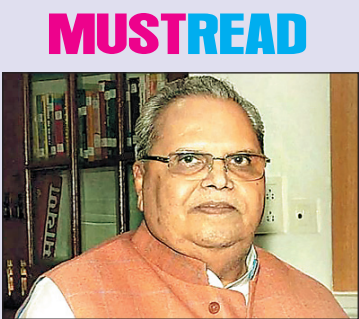
PM Modi speaks with Uttarakhand CM

Pak violates ceasefire on LoC in Poonch, Indian Army retaliates

Jammu: Pakistan troops today violated the ceasefire by firing unprovoked along the Line of Control in Poonch district of Jammu and Kashmir on the sixth anniversary of Article 370 abrogation.
"Pakistan troops this evening fired unprovoked in Krishna Ghati sector of Poonch, which was effectively retaliated by the Indian Army troops," official sources said.
They stated, "own troops gave a befitting reply to the firing", adding, "no injury or casualty has been reported on our side."



Former J&K Governor Satya Pal Malik passes away at 79

New Delhi: Former Jammu and Kashmir Governor Satya Pal Malik passed away today at the age of 79 following prolonged illness. He breathed his last at around 1 pm at Ram Manohar Lohia (RML) Hospital in New Delhi, where he had been undergoing treatment. Malik, a veteran politician, played a key role during one of the most crucial phases in Jammu and Kashmir's history, including the abrogation of Article 370 in 2019. He began his political career in the 1970s as a socialist leader, initially representing the Bharatiya Kranti Dal under the leadership of Charan Singh. In 1974, he was elected as a member of the Uttar Pradesh Legislative Assembly, representing Baghpat.

Shibu Soren laid to rest with State Honours

Nemra (Ramgarh): Former Jharkhand Chief Minister and Rajya Sabha MP Shibu Soren was cremated with full state honours today at his ancestral village, Nemra, in Ramgarh district. A towering figure in Jharkhand's tribal and political history, Soren's passing marked the end of an era — one defined by resistance, reform, and regional identity. Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, party president Mallikarjun Kharge, and RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav were among the key national figures who flew in to pay their last respects to the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM) founder, popularly known as Dishom Guru.

No ban on paracetamol drug: Govt in Parliament

New Delhi: The Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO) has not banned the commonly used paracetamol drug in India, the Government told Rajya Sabha today. Replying to a written query in Rajya Sabha, Union Minister of State for Chemicals and Fertilisers Anupriya Patel said, "the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has informed that the CDSCO is not in receipt of information about rumours" of the regulatory body banning paracetamol.

MP records 20 rapes and 33 abductions daily

CM respond to a question in Assembly

Bhopal: The Madhya Pradesh Assembly was presented with alarming statistics on Tuesday, revealing that the state is currently recording an average of 20 rapes and 33 abductions of women every single day. These grim figures were provided by Chief Minister Mohan Yadav in a written response to a question posed by MLA Pratap Grewal.
According to the data, between January and June 2025, the state registered a total of 3,742 cases of rape, with victims belonging to Scheduled Castes (905), Scheduled Tribes (1,143), Other Backward Classes (1,228), and the general category (466). In the same period, 120 cases of gang rape were also reported.
The statistics reveal a concerning trend of declining conviction rates. In 2024, the conviction rate for rape was a mere 2.79%, and for gang rape, it was 1.63%. This is a stark contrast

to the conviction rates of 12.43% and 16.25% respectively, recorded in 2018.
Over the past seven years (2018-2024), a staggering 54,067 women have been victims of rape. The number of rape cases increased by 20% between 2018 and 2024, from 7,136 to 8,518. Similarly, abductions saw a 53% increase, jumping from 6,394 to 10,070 in the same period.
Grewal also highlighted a significant discrepancy between the annual report for 2024-25 and the recent figures provided by the Chief Minister. While the annual report cited 5,592 rape cases in 2024, the new data shows a much higher figure of 8,518 cases, a "60 percent increase that is not normal," according to Grewal.
The MLA also noted that the conviction rate for abduction cases in 2024 was less than two percent.

NIA searches multiple locations in Punjab in Amritsar temple grenade attack case

New Delhi: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) today conducted searches at nineteen locations across Punjab in connection with the terror grenade attack on a temple in Amritsar in March this year.
The NIA teams seized several incriminating materials, including mobiles/digital devices, during the searches carried out in the border districts of Amritsar, Gurdaspur and Batala.
On the night of March 14, 2025, terrorists, backed by foreign-based handlers, had hurled a grenade at Thakur Dwara Sanatan Temple, Sher Shah Road, Amritsar.
The incident was one of the many recent grenade attacks carried out by operatives of different terror groups in the state of Punjab, on the directions of their handlers based abroad.

Two women killed, 10 injured in stampede at MP’s Sehore Kubereshwar Dham

Two women died and more than 10 devotees sustained injuries, two of them critically, in a stampede at Kubereshwar Dham, the site of Kathavachak Pradeep Mishra's congregation, police said today.
Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav has taken cognisance of a stampede-like rush at Kubereshwar Dham in Madhya Pradesh's Sehore on Tuesday, which resulted in the deaths of two women and injuries to several others.
Police sources said the stampede followed disruption in the distribution of rudraksha (sacred beads).
Three victims were rushed to the District Hospital, where two were declared brought dead.
Additional Superintendent of Police Sunita Rawat said the women died during a "scuffle". The deceased, both unidentified, were aged around



50 years.

Will increase tariff on India "very substantially" over next 24 hrs: Trump

Hours after he mentioned raising tariff on India, US President Donald Trump on Tuesday said he would increase the tariff charged on imports from India from the current rate of 25% "very substantially" over the next 24 hours due to New Delhi's continued purchases of Russian oil, Reuters reported.
"They're fueling the war machine, and if they're going to do that, then I'm not going to be happy," Trump told CNBC in an interview, according to Reuters.
According to the report, he added that the main sticking point with India was that its tariffs were too high but did not provide a new tariff rate.
Trump had said on Monday that the United States will "substantially

raise" the tariff paid by India for buying "massive amounts of Russian Oil", stating that much of the oil purchased from Moscow is being sold in the open market "for big profits".
Trump's announcement, made on his social media platform Truth Social, came days after he announced a 25 per cent reciprocal tariff on India and an unspecified penalty for importing oil from Russia.
"India is not only buying massive amounts of Russian Oil, they are then, for much of the Oil purchased, selling it on the Open Market for big profits. They don't care how many people in Ukraine are being killed by the Russian War Machine. Because of this, I will be substantially raising the Tariff paid by India to the USA."

Separate tragedies claim four lives in MP

Maugang/Raisen: Two unrelated tragedies have cast a pall of grief over communities in Madhya Pradesh. In Maugang, two schoolboys drowned after entering a pond, while in Raisen, two men were electrocuted in a paddy field.

Pond turns into the grave of innocent children

In a heartbreaking incident in Maugang district, two Class 7 students, Pransu Vishwakarma and Shibbu Jaiswal, drowned after they went for a swim in a pond on their way home from school.
The boys, students of Government Middle School Mudila, underestimated the depth and strong current of the water. Their deaths have plunged the village of Garbha into mourning. Police from the Naigadhi station are investigating the incident, raising serious questions about child safety protocols near schools.

Two youths die due to electric shock in a paddy field

Meanwhile, in the Raisen district, a tragic accident in Kuchwada village claimed the lives of two young men



and left two others seriously injured. The incident occurred in a paddy field where a live wire in the fencing, due to an unknown cut, was carrying an electric current. One man was electrocuted while urinating near the fence and a second man was killed while attempting to rescue him. Two more laborers rushed to help and were also shocked, suffering serious injuries. One of the injured has been transferred to the Raisen district hospital in critical condition. Udaipura police are investigating the cause of the fatal short circuit.

Five Bangladeshi nationals detained for attempting to enter Red Fort premises

New Delhi: The Delhi Police today detained five Bangladeshi nationals for allegedly attempting to enter the Red Fort premises without proper authorization.
All five are believed to be illegal immigrants residing and working as labourers in the national capital.
According to police officials, the age of detained individuals are between 20 and 25 years. The individuals were intercepted by security personnel during a routine check near the Red Fort.
Upon verification, they failed to produce valid Indian identification documents and were found in possession of Bangladeshi documents.
While no suspicious material was recovered from them, the police are currently interrogating the men and verifying their background. Security around Red Fort has been beefed up in the run-up to Independence Day.
