Man kills three daughters, ends life due to mounting debts

Chennai: In a shocking incident, a 36-year-old man hacked to death his three young daughters and later committed suicide at Rasipuram in Namakkal district of Tamil Nadu due to mounting debts. Police sources said Govindaraj had borrowed higher amount as loans for constructing a new House. Unable to pay them back, he was been facing huge debts and was in a depressed condition. Late last night, he hacked his dughters Prakthi (9), Rthika (7) and Devasri (3) to hacked to death and later committed suicide by consuming poison. The incident came to light this morning. Police acting on information, broke open the doors and retrieved the bodies and shifted them to government hospital for post mortem.

After negotiation, the accused agreed to accept the bribe for releasing the gratuity amount of Rs. 8,38,565 and also for processing the release of the remaining gratuity amount.

SBI ATM theft attempt foiled

Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar: Four unidentified thieves fled after a failed attempt to steal an ATM from a State Bank of India branch in Shahnoorwadi, Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar, Maharasĥtra, police said today. A case has been registered under Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita sections pertaining to theft, mischief, and criminal conspiracy. According to officials, the group arrived in an SUV between 3 am and 4 am yesterday. They tried to pull out the cash machine by attaching it to their vehicle with a yellow belt. When this method proved unsuccessful, they damaged CCTV cameras inside the ATM cabin and attempted to pry open the dispenser using screwdrivers before ultimately abandoning the heist.

Mother gets life term for killing minor daughter

Shimla: A Nahan court has sentenced a mother to life imprisonment for murdering her minor daughter. The court of Additional Sessions Judge Gaurav Mahajan on Tuesday pronounced this sentence after declaring the accused, Aruna Chauhan, guilty. The verdict was pronounced under Sections 302 and 182 of the Indian Penal Code. According to Public Prosecutor Rashmi Sharma, on the night of 2 November 2020, the accused brutally beat his daughter with an iron rod in the bathroom of his house in Paonta Sahib, causing serious injuries to the girl. After this, she was locked in the bathroom. The next day, on November 3, the accused took the girl to the hospital, where doctors declared her dead.

12 years on, Srinagar Court convicts two locals

After a legal battle spanning over 12 years, the Court of City Judge Srinagar has convicted two individuals for duping a foreign national of Rs 34 lakh in a property fraud case.

Mukhtar Ahmad Guroo and Nazir Ahmad Guroo, both sons of Gulla Mohammad Guroo, residents of Abi-Karpora, Nehru Park Dalgate Srinagar, were found guilty of cheating and criminal conspiracy under Sections 420 and 109-B of the Ranbir Penal Code (RPC)

The case registered in 2008 was investigated by the Crime Branch Kashmir, now known as the Economic Offences Wing.

The case stemmed from a complaint alleging that the accused had deceitfully grabbed Rs 34 lakh from a foreign national on the pretext of purchasing a residential immovable property in Srinagar. The accused concealed the crucial fact that the complainant, being a foreigner, was legally barred from purchasing immovable property in Ĵammu and Kashmir.

Following a comprehensive investigation by the Crime Branch Kashmir, the court found the Guroo brothers guilty of orchestrating a fraudulent deal that caused substantial financial loss to the complainant.

After a marathon trial of 12 years, the Court sentenced both the convicts to simple imprisonment for two years and imposed a fine of Rs 5,000 per offence.

SC continues hearing pleas against UP's Banke Bihari Temple Trust Ordinance

The Supreme Court today, continued hearing a batch of petitions challenging the constitutional validity of the Uttar Pradesh Shri Bankey Bihari Ji Temple Trust Ordinance, 2025, which seeks to regulate the administration and development of the historic temple in Vrindavan.

A Bench comprising Justice Surya Kant and Justice Joymalya Bagchi heard arguments from both sides and suggested the formation of an interim committee headed by a retired High Court judge to oversee the temple's administration until a final decision is rendered.

The petitioners, represented by Senior Advocate Kapil Sibal, have opposed the Ordinance and also sought an injunction against the al-



leged diversion of temple funds for the proposed Banke Bihari Corridor Project.

Sibal raised concerns over what he called "complete government control" over temple management, as indicated in a chart presented by

'This chart shows complete government control," Sibal submitted, urging the Court to allow petitioners to file counter-suggestions. Justice

Kant assured, "We'll address that." Accepting Sibal's request, the Court adjourned the matter to August 8 and asked both parties to propose names of a retired judge to

head the interim oversight panel. Appearing for the Uttar Pradesh government, Additional Solicitor General (ASG) KM Nataraj argued that the Ordinance had no connection with earlier writ petitions and was aimed purely at improving temple management in light of increasing footfall and fund mismanagement concerns.

Bandi Sanjay to appear before SIT on Aug 8 in phone tapping case

Hyderabad: Union Minister Bandi Sanjay will appear before the Special Investigation Team (SIT) on August 8 in connection with the ongoing

phone tapping case. In a letter to the police, Sanjay confirmed his presence along with

his personal staff on the same day. According to party sources, San jay has reportedly collected crucial information and evidence from central intelligence agencies regarding the alleged tapping of phones, including those of judges and even private conversations in homes. He is likely to submit this evidence to the SIT during the questioning.
