3 held for murder of law student



Bhopal: On Saturday, Ayodhya Nagar police apprehended three persons involved in the brutal murder of 22-year-old law student Sanskar Babele at a petrol pump on Ayodhya By-pass. The incident occurred in the early hours of August 6, following a dispute over refueling.

According to police station incharge Mahesh Lilhare, the assailants, armed with knives, attacked Sanskar and his friend Anmol Dubey after a heated argu-

While Dubey sustained minor injuries and survived, Sanskar, a BA LLB student from Indore, succumbed to multiple stab wounds. The attackers fled the scene on a

Police recovered the murder weapon, an iron knife, along with the moped used in their escape. Preliminary investigations revealed that all three have extensive criminal records involving murder, robbery, and assault. A case has been registered against them under Sections 296, 103(1), and 3(5) of the In the aftermath, multiple police Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS).

Viral video captures sensational murder in Bhopal

viral, capturing the live murder of 22-year-old Amit Verma, a sensational case that took place on June 28, 2025. The video shows notorious gangster Naseem Banne Khan shooting Verma during a birthday celebration in the Liladhar Colony area, under the jurisdiction of the Chhola Mandir police station. Verma was hit in the head and stomach

and died at the scene. According to police, Naseem, who had a long-standing rivalry with a man named Raja Khatik, was the intended target. However, the bullet accidentally struck Verma instead. Naseem, who claims to be a member of the infamous Lawrence Bishnoi gang, has more than 46 sericriminal cases registered



against him.

Following the murder, police arrested Naseem in Betul and took four other accomplices, including his mother and girlfriend, into custody. Naseem is currently being held



at Bhopal Central Jail. An investigation into potential police negligence has also been initiated, with two Assistant Commissioners of Police and two Station House Officers under

Man found dead under suspicious circumstances

Bhopal: A 28-year-old married man was found dead under suspicious circumstances in the Chhola Mandir area of Bhopal on Thursday night, as reported by police on Saturday. The body was discovered on the third floor of a rented house, with a noose

tightly fastened around his neck. Investigating officials at the Chhola Mandir police station suspect that the rope may have snapped, leading to the body falling onto the floor. While initial indications point towards suicide, authorities have launched a comprehensive investigation to rule out any foul

The deceased has been identified as Rakesh Shakya, originally from Vidisha district. He had moved to Bhopal eight months ago with his wife and two children, working as a daily wage laborer to support his family. He resided on the ground floor of the same building where his body was found.

Preliminary reports indicate that Rakesh asked his wife to prepare dinner around 8 PM on Thursday before heading upstairs. When she called for him after the meal was ready there was no response. Concerned, she went upstairs and discovered his lifeless body with a noose made from her saree around his neck.

The police have registered a case of unnatural death and are thoroughly investigating all angles to determine the exact cause of death Following a post-mortem examination, Shakya's body was handed over to his family.

Police Recruitment Board to ensure smooth and faster hiring

Bhopal: Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yaday announced that a 'Madhya Pradesh Police Recruitment Board' will be set up to ensure quick, transparent and efficient police recruitments. Currently, police recruitment is being conducted through the Staff Selection Board, which takes time. The new board will expedite recruitment, ensure transparency, and enhance efficiency.

7,500 vacancies approved this year: In 2025, recruitments will be conducted by the Staff Selection Board, Bhopal, on behalf of the new Police Recruitment Board. From next year, the new board will handle all recruitments directly. The CM stated that 7,500 vacancies have been approved this year, with a total of 22,500 positions to be filled over the next three years by recruiting 7,500 personnel



Reservation for widows & children of martyrs in UG courses: CM also announced that widows and children of martyrs from the Police, Jail, and Civic Security departments will be given a reservation in an additional seat in all undergraduate courses under various priority cate-

Additionally, Deputy Superinten-

dents of Police and above, along with security personnel deployed on VVIP duty, will receive special and risk allowances under the Sixth Pay Commission.
