

Tehsildars, Naib Tehsildars resume duties after 13-day protest

● Face the challenge of addressing pending cases

Bhopal: The Tehsildars and Naib Tehsildars, who had been protesting against the judicial and non-judicial division of work, returned to their duties on Tuesday after halting work for 13 days, starting from August 6. Their strike was called off following a meeting with Revenue Minister Karan Singh Verma and senior officials of the department on Monday.

Upon their return to work in Bhopal, the Tehsildars and Naib Tehsildars face the challenge of addressing over 6,000 pending cases. They had been protesting under the banner of the MP Revenue Officer (Junior Administrative Service) Association.

500 public related cases come every day in Bhopal

According to the information, more than 500 cases including



transfer, demarcation, death transfer, native, caste certificate, income certificate, EWS come every day. Apart from this, Tehsildar and Naib Tehsildar hear about 300 cases every day. Due to this, the hearing of more than 600 cases has been postponed in two days. So far, the number of pending cases

has reached 6 thousand.

Divided into field and office work Bhopal has Bairagarh, Kolar, MP Nagar, City Circle, Bairasia and TT Nagar Tehsils. Their Tehsildars and Naib Tehsildars have been divided into judicial and non-judicial work. That is, the officers who are doing judicial work are not in

the field. At the same time, the field officers are not doing judicial work. They were also opposing this system. Along with this, the protest was being done on a total of 8 demands. After agreement on 7 of these demands, the Tehsildar and Naib Tehsildar returned to work from Tuesday.

Consensus on several key points

Earlier on Monday, in a meeting lasting over two hours, officials from the association and government reached consensus on several key points. The term "non-judicial" will be replaced with "Executive Magistrate," a change the government has accepted. Additionally, the number of Tehsildars and Naib Tehsildars at district headquarters and in the field will now be determined with input from collectors. However, no agreement was reached regarding the grade pay for Tehsildars and Naib Tehsildars, which will be discussed separately.

Row erupts in Bhopal over orders to demolish two mosques

Bhopal: A major controversy has flared up in Bhopal after the district administration issued demolition notices for two mosques—Dilkash Masjid and Mohammadi Masjid (Bhadbhadda)—located in the Full Tank Level (FTL) area of the city's largest lake. Citing the structures as illegal encroachments on government land, the administration has warned that if the mosques are not voluntarily removed, a forced eviction will be carried out.

Waqf Board challenges order in High Court

In response to the notices, which were issued in compliance with National Green Tribunal (NGT) orders, the Madhya Pradesh Waqf Board has taken the matter to the High Court. The board claims the mosques are "waqf property" and possess legal documents to prove ownership that date back several years.

The demolition order has triggered strong reactions from both sides of the religious divide. Muslim

organizations have warned of a fierce struggle if the structures are touched, while Hindu organizations have equally asserted that the mosques "must be demolished."

Sub-Divisional Magistrate Archana Sharma stated that a total of 35 encroachments, including temples and tombs, have been identified for removal as part of the drive to clear the FTL area.

State Minister Vishwas Sarang has weighed in on the issue, declaring that "land jihad will not be tolerated at any cost" and that adherence to NGT and legal orders is mandatory. Hindu groups have also threatened a large-scale protest if any attempt is made to save the mosques.

The administration has indicated it will hear the arguments of the Waqf Board and the mosque committee before taking a final decision. However, with the matter now pending in the High Court, the dispute has created significant religious tension in the city, posing a major challenge for the administration.

Congress accuses BJP govt of shielding drug mafia in MP

Bhopal: The Madhya Pradesh Congress Committee (MPCC) on Monday launched a fierce attack on the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), alleging that the state has effectively become "Uddta Madhya Pradesh" due to the unchecked proliferation of narcotics. Addressing the media, MPCC Media Department Chairman Dr Mukesh Nayak accused Chief Minister Mohan Yadav, who also handles the Home portfolio, of failing to act against organised crime while offering protection to mafia networks at the expense of the state's youth.

Referring to recent developments, Dr Nayak highlighted the seizure of 61.2 kilograms of MD drugs worth Rs 92 crore from a factory in Jagdishpur, near Bhopal, on 18 August 2025 by the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) and other central agencies. "The factory had been operational for years, yet Madhya Pradesh Police remained oblivious. Why do only



central agencies uncover such cases? Where was the state's Home Department?" he demanded.

He went on to link the drug trade with senior BJP leaders, recalling the October 2024 bust of drugs valued at Rs 1,814 crore, in which the main accused, Harish Anjana, was known to be a close associate of Deputy Chief Minister

Jagdish Devda. "Is this dirty money being funnelled into BJP's election fund?" he asked, while demanding Devda's immediate resignation.

Dr Nayak also alleged that the names of BJP leaders' relatives had repeatedly surfaced in drug-related cases across Bhopal, Indore, Jabua and the Malwa region. "This is no coincidence; it is collusion," he charged.

Speaking to the Correspondent, Dr Nayak warned of grave social consequences, stating that drugs had infiltrated schools and colleges, shattering families and fuelling crime. "Society is collapsing, and the government sits silently like a partner in the trade," he said.

The Congress concluded by announcing that unless swift action is taken against both mafia elements and complicit leaders, it would launch an intensive agitation "from the streets to the Assembly" to hold the government accountable for the deepening crisis.

Honoring legends and inspiring the future

The exhibition was inaugurated by Chief Guest Santosh Choubey, Director of Vishwarang and Chancellor of Rabindranath Tagore University. Burns NCERT Modules over 'Historical Distortion'

Bhopal: The National Students' Union of India (NSUI) staged a strong protest on Tuesday, outside the District Education Officer's (DEO) office, accusing the NCERT of publishing new educational material with "objectionable and misleading" content. During the demonstration, NSUI activists burned copies of the controversial modules and handed a memorandum to the DEO addressed to the NCERT Director.

Allegations of historical Bias
NSUI leaders claim the new NCERT modules misrepresent the historical facts, surrounding the Partition of India. State Vice President Ravi Parmar stated that the material unjustly places the entire blame for the Partition on the Indian National



Congress, calling it a "biased and misleading" account that ignores the complex circumstances of the event. Another NSUI Vice President, Varun Kulkarni, added that the con-

strict President Akshay Tomar warned that this is a dangerous attempt to "politicize education." The NSUI has issued an ultimatum, stating that if the module is not withdrawn immediately, they will escalate their protest into a statewide and nationwide student movement.

NSUI's demands

The NSUI has put forth several key demands, including:

* Immediate removal of the objectionable content from the NCERT modules.

* Strict action against officials and experts responsible for including the false information.

* The formation of an impartial committee of authentic historians to review educational material.

* Ensuring students are provided with an unbiased and fact-based history curriculum.

The above Regulations are mandatory and applies to all AICTE approved Institutions. Therefore all the Institutions should take necessary steps for its proper implementation such as:

- Appointing Professional Counselor (s) for Freshers
- Erection of Poster/Banners displaying provisions of law, punishments etc.

Any violation of AICTE Regulations as cited above by an AICTE approved Institution or an instance wherein any Institution fails to take adequate steps to prevent ragging or fails to act in accordance with these Regulations or fails to punish perpetrators for incidents of ragging suitably, AICTE shall call for punitive action against erring Institutions as per the provisions of the Approval Process Handbook.
